## Big Canoe Council Meeting, May 10, 2022

May 10, 2022, the Big Canoe church council met for its regular monthly meeting. Members present included Vern Whitaker, Liz Schafer, Pat O'Regan, Shelly Bigler, Rita Thomas, Bill Stoen and Treasurer, Laurie Emery.

The Secretary's report was read and placed on file.

The Treasurer reported a balance of \$12,826.92, and \$3,780.45 in the parsonage fund. The report was placed on file.

The insurance adjusters were here on Wednesday, May 4, 2022, to inspect wind damage to the church roof and bell tower and the leak in the parsonage roof that is causing water damage in the downstairs bathroom. Have not heard back from them yet.

We will be reviewing the call packet on June 5. Tammy Nordheim will be included as the representative of the call committee. If you have anything to add to the call package, please contact a council or call committee member.

We will be replacing the disposable candles on the alter with permanent ones. They will be given in memory of Jim Hurd.

We discussed the Sunday School/Religious Education plan. We will have 3 young people eligible for first year Confirmation – Ella Christopher, Allison Bigler and Jace Thorson.

The Nathan Borreson fundraiser will be held on June 5. Church services will be at 8:30. Picnic tables will be moved and set up on June 4. The dedication of the new burial pall will also be on June 5.

The renewal of the pastoral contract with Pastor Gies was discussed. The contract will be up in June. As Pastor wasn't present and this also needs to include Highland in the discussion, nothing was decided.

The NRSC will be allowed to use the church as their base for the Bear Creek Watershed tour on June 8. The usual fees will be applied.

There will be a Memorial Day luncheon at the church put on by members of the ELCA. Sandwiches will be served.

Vanco automatic deposit for church members was discussed. Motioned by Rita and seconded by Shelly that the idea be dropped because members can easily set up automatic deposits into the church account through their own bank far less than using the Vanco service. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

Liz motioned and Rita seconded that we adjourn with the Lord's Prayer led by Vern. Motion passed with unanimous consent.
