Big Canoe Farm Land Bids

The Big Canoe Farm ground lease for 18.5 acres expires this year. Those interested in bidding for the 3 year lease contract should submit their bid no later than October 1, 2021. Bids can be submitted to any council member, but must include the per acre bid X 18.5 acres for a total bid amount and must be received by October 1, 2021.

Bids are restricted to Big Canoe/Highland Members.

Bids will be reviewed and approved during October Big Canoe Council Meeting.

Rents are received before 1 March and 1 October respectively, or in a single payment prior to 1 March 2022.

Highest Bidder will be awarded the contract.

From Pastor:

Friends in Christ — Grace and peace be with you.

On this day in 1532, **Johann**, known as **Johann the Steadfast** or **Constant** (*Johann, der Beständige*) died. He was important for us, because he was Elector of Saxony, as had been his elder, childless brother Frederick the Wise, and both supported Luther and the Reformation. Aided by Luther, Johann set up a model of church liturgy [in German!] and administration used beyond Saxony in other territories of “the Holy Roman Empire.” [I use quotation marks, because, as a number of writers have commented, it was an empire which was neither holy nor Roman.] As his nickname “The Steadfast” indicates, he resolutely continued the policies of his brother toward protecting the progress of the Protestant Reformation. [Wikipedia]

It is good, the Reformers said in the Augsburg Confession, “to remember the saints” of old. As I remember Johann, I think think of the Luther hymn, “Lord, keep us steadfast” ... and then I remember the **rest** of that hymn line: “Lord, keep us **steadfast in your Word**.” It is not good enough to be steadfast; just as important is the WHAT in which we are steadfast.

In what is Big Canoe and Highland steadfast? That’s usually easy to answer. That is much of what the Call Committee is writing in the Mission Site Profile (MSP) ... which is a fancy way of saying “this is who we are.”

In what is God calling Big Canoe and Highland to BECOME steadfast? Hmmmmm. That is something we are all called to consider, to ask God about (pray), to ask Scripture about (as we read it). That will shape what we ask of God to send to Big Canoe and Highland as a pastor!

It’s so easy to describe MY ideal pastor. (Or is it?) After I have my list, then we have to agree on what OUR ideal pastor would be, so the list lengthens.

Try a different beginning. (1) Start with Scripture (**like Ephesians 4:11ff.**) and with prayer. (2) Then ask what Big Canoe and Highland need to BECOME constant in doing ... which leads to saying what Big Canoe and Highland need from their pastor. (3) Finally, ask what our heavenly Father wants to give Big Canoe and Highland in a pastor.

Do you want what YOU want? Or do you dare to want what GOD wants? Do you dare to pray “Thy will be done” ... and MEAN it? How does your “wants” fit in with what God wants for us? And which should take precedence?

The minutes as collect by Liz Schafer from the July meeting were unanimously accepted as written.

No treasurer report was available.

Pastoral Report: Pastor will be visiting some our members in the nursing/retirement homes and hoping to catch one at home. It has been challenging to coordinate visits but Pastor is very committed to doing it and bring communion to as many as he can with the concern of potential Covid lockouts. He spoke briefly about Sunday School and Confirmation and wanting to work with those programs and getting plan going for him to support it. He also asked us to go back to recording Sunday attendance. Highland Lutheran Church Council Meeting - August 15, 2021

Call to Order

The August 15, 2021 meeting of the Highland Lutheran Church council was called to order by Vice-President Al Erickson at approximately 9:35 a.m. Others in attendance were Danny Dutka, Steve Langland, Virginia Karlsbrotten, Mark Sollien and Treasurer Anna Jetson.

Secretary Report

It was decided to omit the reading of the minutes of the last meeting.

Treasurer Report

Anna Jetson provided a printed Treasurer Report. Balances as of August 8 were: Current \$7193.26, Benevolence \$93.00 (71% of budgeted has been paid out), 125th Anniversary \$355.10, Improvement \$48663.67, Scholarship \$5857.08. Moved by Steve Langland, seconded by Danny Dutka to file report for audit. Motion carried by voice vote. Ms. Jetson stated there were letters from L.S.I. and Helping Services requesting funding. Consensus of the Council was if there is an overage of Benevolence Funds at the end of the year, we would could then consider who to fund.

OLD BUSINESS

COVID-19 status / changes

The Council discussed if there should be any changes to what we are already doing in consideration of the Covid-19 pandemic. There was discussion on how we are doing communion, it was thought that people could come forward to receive the elements rather than Pastor distribute to each person. Discussion resulted in a motion by Steve Langland to have the congregation come forward to receive the elements (pre-packaged) and return to their seats to receive the blessing and partake of the elements as instructed by Pastor Gies. Motion was seconded by Virginia Karlsbrotten. Motion carried by voice vote. Secretary Note: This change would need to be approved by Pastor Gies.

Shared Ministry

There is ongoing discussion among area churches on Shared Ministry opportunities. The most recent meeting was held at Highland on August 1, at that meeting it was felt that a starting point for Shared Ministry may be that the Women of the ELCA of the various churches could collaborate, perhaps on projects that the individual churches may not be able to do themselves. Therefore it was decided to invite the Women of the ELCA of the churches to a meeting at Highland on September 19 at 1 p.m. to see if this can be accomplished. A follow up meeting of all interested churches is currently scheduled to be held at Hauge Lutheran on October 3. Highland members that have been attending the meetings are Louise Jetson, Steve Langland, Anna Jetson and Danny Dutka.

GEMINI donation

Highland had previously received a donation from GEMINI in the amount of \$250.00. At the time of receipt the Council decided to use the proceeds towards refurbishing of the A.E.D. The county has since refurbished the unit without cost to Highland. Therefore, we could re-designate the funds to some other worthy project or item.

NEW BUSINESS

Joint Worship

Council discussed potential date for a Joint Worship Service and potluck meal to follow. Since there are already a number of things happening in September it seemed the only day available would be September 26. The Council decided that Highland would host the Joint Worship service on September 26 at 11 a.m. with a potluck meal and fellowship to follow. Highland will provide a hot dish, beverages and disposable tableware. Individuals to bring salads, rolls, desserts to share. Worship and meal will be held inside or as other details emerge.

Wish List

Since we need to re-direct the GEMINI donation, Pastor Gies has suggested that we develop a wish list of tangible items needed / wanted. Some donors of memorials or special donations may inquire what we would use the funds for. This way we could get suggestions of what that might be. The informal wish list so far includes: Replacing faded paraments, Funeral Pall, Funeral Banner, Baptismal Banner, A parlor table with a custom made table cloth(s) that could be used at Christmas, All Saints Sunday and funerals or other events.
