Highland Church Council Meeting Minutes - November 9, 2025 Following Joint Worship at Highland

Call to Order: President Anna Jetson called the meeting to order at 11:26 AM.

Attendance: President Anna Jetson, Vice President Al Erickson, Secretary Kristy Selness, Treasurer Dan Dutka, Council members Myron Krauskopf and Gary Selness, and Pastor Matthew Becker.

Opening Devotions: Anna Jetson provided a prayer.

Secretary's Report: Council waived reading of the September 14, 2025 Congregational meeting minutes. September 14, 2025 Council meeting minutes read. Dan Dutka made one correction to the minutes, QR code was by Pastor Becker. Motion to approve minutes by Myron Krauskopf, seconded by Al Erickson, carried.

Treasurer's Report: Dan Dutka provided a financial update through October 2025. Discussion by Council. Filed for audit. **Pastoral Report**: Pastor Becker provided an October report. Spiritual retreat is December 6, 2025, from 1000 to 1200 AM, at Big Canoe.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Northside concrete project. Project almost complete. Dan Dutka and Myron Krauskopf reported a railing is needed for safety on Southeast corner of handicapped parking. Six posts, anchors and boards, estimated to cost approximately \$500. Motion by Myron Krauskopf to move forward with project, seconded by Gary Selness. Carried. An additional \$1,500 was used for extra gravel adjacent to the sidewalk. There was an additional \$1,000 donation to the Improvement Fund.
- 2. Update on the fundraiser for \$1000 for Aase Haugen Capital Campaign for this year. Balance is unknown at this time.
- 3. Feed the Farmers project. Anna Jetson reported. Good feedback from the community. Fed about 50 local farmers. We should continue with project next year. Possibly alternate churches each year. Shirley Bigeler should be thanked for all her hard work, and all the others that participated.
- 4. Coffee Chats. Discussed by Council. The principle of coffee chats are a good thing to have people come and talk about how our contributions are used. Motion by Myron Krauskopf to have quarterly coffee chats, seconded by Al Erickson. Carried.
- 5. No other old business.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Offering Envelopes. Discussion by Council to continue with offering envelopes as we are currently doing. We currently order 40 boxes at a cost of about \$200, with some boxes not being picked up. Dan Dutka will do research to see if there is a more economical way of purchasing envelopes.
- 2. Sunday Attendance pads at Highland. Pastor Becker wanted Council to consider this. Attendance pads are helpful for him on who is attending and for visitors who are attending and leaving their addresses, who may be potential new members. Tabled for next meeting.
- 3. ELCA Model Constitution. Anna Jetson reported that our Constitution was updated when Pastor Bockoven (2015 2021) was here and it was updated to the model constitution at that time. It was approved by the congregation after

much debate. The synod has requested that the constitution be reviewed. A committee of Pastor Becker, Anna Jetson and will ask Dennis Karlsbroten to be on the committee, or other designee. To be reviewed by the January/February meetings.

- 4. Internet/WIFI at Highland. Tabled to next council meeting.
- 5. List of projects that we have received grants/gifts for and haven't finished yet (review past minutes/deposits in improvement account.) Request for Kristy Selness (Secretary) to look back at 2025 minutes for projects and/or grants approved and for Dan Dutka (Treasurer) to look back at the financial to see what projects/grants have been completed or not. Provide Council with a list of above items.
- 6. Other new business: Food Shelf at church. Discussion by Council to support our local community food shelves instead of starting our own. Motion by Dan Dutka to give the three local food shelves (Mabel, Decorah Community and NE lowa Food Bank) a donation of \$500 each from the Improvement fund, second by Myron Krauskopf. Carried. The three benevolences would be paid for the year.
- 7. Myron Krauskopf and Dan Dutka have been in contact with a contractor (Alvin Yoder) about the steeple repair project. It would include repairing the steeple and re-roofing the upper steeple. No exact estimate has been determined, will have it for council to approve, such that it can be presented at the Annual Congregational meeting.
- 8. Myron Krauskopf brought up to Council about compensating a person who has done above and beyond work to the churches and parsonage. Discussion by Council and Myron should bring item up at the budget meeting as a line item.

No other new business.

Closing Prayer by Pastor Becker.
