Big Canoe Church Council Meeting Minutes - March 23, 2025

Council members present: Brian Bigler - President, Deb Monson - Secretary, Laurie Emery - Treasurer, Council members: Kathryn Thompson, Vernoe Whitaker, Seth Ferguson, and Pastor Becker. Pastor Becker gave the prayers.

Bill Stoen was present solely for the purpose of updating the council on insurance matters.

Custodian Bob Maroushek expressed concern with regard to a rubber flap by the church steeple. Laurie will look up the name and telephone number of the contractor and provide that info to Brian so that he can place a call to them.

During the Wednesday evening Lenten supper and services (3-20-25 actual date) there was a back up issue in the Ladies restroom. Casper Plumbing was contacted to remove tree roots from the septic clay tile line. Ness Pumping Services will be contacted to pump the septic tank.

The Luther League will be donating the proceeds from the Easter Pie Auction to be used to renovate the men's restroom.

Another church property insurance policy was discussed which would offer \$311,000 in insurance coverage. Before obtaining this policy, many updates to the church would need to be completed: fire extinguisher system over the stove in the kitchen, special locks for all doors, an alarm system what would notify the sheriff's department and/or the Fire Department should the need arise.

All members of the church council need insurance coverage under a liability policy as council members can be sued.

President Brian Bigler adjourned the meeting. Pastor Becker gave the closing prayer.

Big Canoe Church Council Meeting Minutes - April 13, 2025

Council members present: Brian Bigler - President, Steve Emery - Vice President, Deb Monson - Secretary, Laurie Emery - Treasurer, Council members: Kathryn Thompson, Vernoe Whitaker, Bill Bullerman, and Pastor Becker. Total Big Canoe members present: 19.

President Brian Bigler called the meeting to order.

Two church members are needed to serve on the Property Committee. By unanimous vote and passage, Steve Emery and Bob Thomas were voted to serve as the Property Committee.

The Synod meeting will be held at Cedar Falls on June 7th. Pastor Becker will be attending. Rita Hurd-Thomas will serve as a delegate. One more person is needed to serve as a delegate from Big Canoe.

Property insurance: At the present time, the Parsonage and all of the outbuildings along with the caretaker's residence are insured. The annual policy cost is \$6,019.00.

An insurance quote from American Family Insurance was received. A walk through and a video was conducted at the church. Insurance coverage of \$1.8 million for the church would be at a cost of \$23,732.25 per year. This coverage would include a 3% deductible of \$65,000. Before American Family Insurance would offer this policy the following upgrades would need to be completed: a fire extinguishing/suppression system would need to be installed over the kitchen stove, cypher lock entry system, an alarm system that would notify the Sheriff's Department and/or Fire Department. This list is not all inclusive.

A policy is also being looked into for liability insurance for the council members who can be sued for their actions as council members.

Pastor Becker said that he is a Spiritual Believer. Big Canoe has a history of 120 years (present location) originally founded in 1853. Consideration may be needed to put our Trust in the Lord. We are not alone in this situation as Hauge Lutheran Church has had its insurance policy cancelled as well. There may be a class action lawsuit against Church Mutual. Another possibility could be for a National Campaign for assistance to rebuild.

Danny Dutka (Highland member) advised that Highland has a Workmen's Compensation Policy that provides coverage for Pastor; Kathryn Thompson as the organist, and for himself for all the work he has done for the church.

Brian stated that if some disaster were to happen, we would not be able to rebuild Big Canoe as it is today. We would need to rebuild for the future.

Pastor Becker said he would pray for the Lord to protect us and the church.

The parsonage septic system was updated/replaced within the last five years. Shirley Bigler asked the question, that if we were to vote to update the church's septic system but whoever does the upgrade couldn't start the work right now, would the decision to upgrade be grandfathered in under the old laws/rules versus any new laws/rules that may go into effect wherein the new septic system could end up costing the church three times as much based upon the current laws/rules. A reply was stated, "yes, we would be grandfathered in."

President Brian stated that the CD's that the church has available could be used to update the church's septic system and include the septic system at the caretaker's residence.

Brian requested a motion regarding the same.

Treasurer Laurie Emery advised that there are monies available from the Grindeland and the Osmundson Funds, and monies from the Improvement Fund.

Rita Hurd Thomas made the motion to replace the septic system at the church, to include updating the caretaker's residence, obtain a bid, and use CD's that had been set aside for use for the church.

Dave Bigler seconded the motion. The congregation members present all voted aye, motion passed.

President Brian Bigler adjourned the meeting.

2025 Iowa High School Senior Scholarships for nursing long-term care

Students who are in their senior year of high school during the 2024-2025 academic year and interested in pursuing a nursing career in long-term care can apply for one of nine \$2,000 scholarships through the lowa Healthcare Association and provided by The Molina Healthcare Charitable Foundation (MolinaCares). The scholarships cover tuition fees to pursue a certified nursing assistant (CNA), licensed practical nurse (LPN), registered nurse (RN), associate of science in nursing (ASN) or bachelor of science in nursing (BSN) program for the 2025-2026 academic year. This scholarship is intended for those interested in a future career in long-term care. *Applications for this scholarship program are open now through May 31, 2025.* Applicants for the MolinaCares High School Scholarship must meet all criteria listed below and submit a complete application by May 31, 2025, to qualify:

- Must be an lowa high school senior during the 2024-2025 academic year.
- Must be enrolled or accepted in an accredited nursing program, or plan to pursue prerequisites in 25-26.
- Scholarships must be used during the 2025-2026 academic year. The application is available at:
