Big Canoe Lutheran Church Council Meeting, November 20, 2022

The Big Canoe church council met for its monthly meeting November 20, 2022, after regular church services. Those present were Shelly Bigler, Pat O'Regan, Bill Stoen, Rita Thomas and Pastor Gies.

Minutes for the October meeting were approved and placed on file.

The Treasurer reported a balance on hand of \$9,104.64 and \$7,283.86 in the Parsonage fund. The report was approved and placed on file.

Bill reported that the Depot grant has been approved for \$5,000. Council voted to send them a thank you note and place a thank you in the newspaper. Kelly Construction has been paid \$71,482.91 and Pat is negotiating with the insurance company about the remainder of the bill. We will see. The gutter work on the church should begin this week.

Four families have applied to join our congregation. Rita motioned, and Pat seconded that the council approve the joining. Motion was passed. The four families will be joining the church on December 18 at our Christmas Program service. They are: Seth and Cassidy Furguson and family, Sam and Jessica Johnson, Russ and Mary Lou Gerard and Joseph Young and Evelyn Bohr family. We will welcome them into our church family with a potluck following the service. The Social Concerns Committee will serve.

Pastor will make 2 three-ring notebooks (one for each church) that contain the basic orders for regular and Communion services should he not be here. He will also begin a class for those lay people who would like to visit and give Communion to shut-ins. Pre packaged Communion kits will be purchased to be pre-blessed for distribution to the shut-ins.

Pat will be meeting with Bob to see what jobs he will be able to do to resume some of his duties at church and to determine his future plans.

The church does not have a zoom account to accommodate meetings with someone joining from another location in case of weather, sickness or distance. Liz will check with zoom about setting up an account on a month-by-month basis.

Pat informed the council that the church field is in dire need of being limed. He, as the renter, will have the ph checked and have the lime applied in the spring.

Shell Bigler reported that the rotating Confirmation classes seem to be going very well.

We are looking for new members for the council as several will be going off this year. Anyone wishing to be on the council, please let us know.

After discussion about the light situation in the front of the church Rita motioned, and Pat seconded that Bill should call Decorah Electric to come out to the church and examine our breaker box situation for the lights in the church and then submit a bid for installing the appropriate switches.

Our next council meeting will be a joint council meeting held December 11, following joint services at Highland. We adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

Call to Order

A meeting of the Highland Lutheran Church council was called to order on November 6,2022 by President Joyce Bjerke at approximately 11:56 a.m. at the home of Virginia & Dennis Karlsbroten. Council members in attendance were: Virginia Karlsbroten, Mark Sollien, Secretary Danny Dutka, Darlene Sollien, Karen Erickson and Steve Langland. Others in attendance included Treasurer Anna Jetson, church members Al Erickson and Dennis Karlsbroten. Pastor Waldemar Gies arrived during the meeting.

Secretary Report

Secretary Dutka read the minutes of the August 14, 2022 meeting. There being no additions or corrections Steve Langland moved to approve minutes as read. Darlen Sollien seconded. Motion carried by voice vote.

Treasurer Report

Anna Jetson provided printed and verbal information on the finances of the church. Balances as of 11-1-2022 were: Current \$15,369.19, Benevolence \$88.00, Anniversary Fund \$375.10, Improvement Fund \$72,500.21, Scholarship Fund \$5871.05. Treasurer Jetson noted that income and distribution of the Benevolence Fund was on track with budget projections. Treasurer Jetson also reminded the Council that the offering designated for "Thanksgiving" would be going to The Decorah Free Clinic. The printed report will be filed for audit. Copies of this printed report will be available to the congregation at the church.

Steve Langland asked if the Scholarship Fund could be used for seminary students. We have given a donation from the Scholarship Fund in the past to the H. George Anderson Fund for Leaders which is sponsored through the Northeast Iowa Synod. We need to look into our records for more information on our Scholarship Fund to see what the original intent was when it was created.

Pastoral Report

Pastor Gies arrived and stated he is beginning some training sessions after services to get us ready for when he leaves or when he can't be around. November 27th will be training for lay person(s) to visit shut-ins.

Pastoral Call

Virginia Karlsbroten, member of the Call Committee stated that the ELCA has reviewed and requested some corrections to the Ministry Site Profile.

Property

Danny Dutka stated that he had called someone from the roofing company that was working on Big Canoe to see if they would provide an opinion and estimate to cure the bell tower area leaks. They did not respond to a voicemail left. A church member is in conversation with local construction people to see if they would be willing to work on this issue. Meanwhile repairs to the ceiling are being made.

Virginia Karlsbroten stated that the driveway and parking area are usually cleared of snow by Ed Stoen. The equipment used to do that isn't suitable for doing the sidewalks and steps. Joyce and Lyle shouldn't be doing all of it. She and Dennis have done it when they can. It is felt that other able persons in the church should also help in keeping the sidewalks and steps cleared of snow even if there aren't any services scheduled. The scheduled usher for a Sunday should also assist with this.

Voicemail

Secretary Dutka stated he had Mabel Telephone Co. activate voicemail on the church phone. This had been previously approved by the Council. This will allow us to provide a recorded announcement on service times and location as well as potential cancellation of services due to inclement weather.

Christmas Schedule

Highland will host the Christmas Eve Candlelight service beginning at 4:30 p.m. Big Canoe to have Christmas Day service at 10 a.m.

Steve Langland presented an idea of having a light supper following the Christmas Eve service so that those who may be alone that evening can have a meal and fellowship with others. Menu could consist of chicken noodle soup, chili with fixings, beverages, Christmas delicacies, etc. Since we haven't done this before we would need a R.S.V.P. from potential attendees stating the number of people that may attend so we could plan accordingly. The R.S.V.P. should be made by December 19th to the church phone voice mail. There being consensus among the Council in the affirmative it was moved by Danny Dutka to have the supper and to have a free will offering. Motion was seconded by Mark Sollien. Motion carried by voice vote.

Discussion on whether it was wise to have real candles in the midst of the congregation at the Christmas Eve service resulted in a motion by Darlene Sollien to purchase 100 battery operated LED candles that flicker. Motion was seconded by Steve Langland. Motion carried by voice vote. Candles being considered were at a price point of \$1.59 each which included the batteries.
