Big Canoe Council Meeting, June 14, 2022

The Big Canoe church council met June 14, 2022. Members present included Pat O'Regan, treasurer Laurie Emery, Vern Whitaker, Liz Schafer, Shelly Bigler, Rachel Hoffman, Bill Stoen and Rita Thomas.

Pat called the meeting to order and led us in devotions taken from Eph. 1.

Pat reported that Janitor Bob Maroushek was out of the hospital and home as of Monday. Rita motioned, and Vern seconded, that Bob will be on mandatory vacation until July 11. Passed by unanimous consent. As such for the next month we will need volunteers to help keep up with the mowing and church duties. Please contact Pat if you can participate.

The secretary's report was corrected and placed on file.

The treasurer report showed a balance of \$15,294.75, and the parsonage fund has \$3,307.73. Report was placed on file.

We discussed the Pastoral Report. Pastor was very busy visiting shut-ins, performing funerals, dedications, regular Sunday services and meeting with the three incoming confirmands. He reported that Canoe Ridge is interested in sharing Confirmation and possibly Sunday School classes with us. Rita motioned and Vern seconded that Shelly and Liz go to the meeting held at Canoe Ridge on June 26 to discuss the possibility. Motion passed with unanimous consent.

Pastor would like to have someone work with him compiling a list of shut-ins and possibly taking a short class to be able to visit shut-ins and administer Communion to them. Vern volunteered to compile a list of shut-ins.

Pastor would also like to continue with the joint service and potluck Sundays. This will be discussed with the Highland council at our upcoming joint meeting. Big Canoe is willing to continue this arrangement.

The council will again begin a schedule for serving Communion by council members. Bill will begin compiling a new list for ushering. If you have a specific time of year, you can or can't usher, please let him know in the near future.

A second insurance inspector looked over the storm damage to the church roof. We will receive \$6,843.53 for damages. We will be checking with a contractor out of Waterloo for specific things that have to be fixed first and go from there. Lisa will be asked to compile a list of funds available to use for church improvements.

The new permanent candles have been placed on the alter and look good. The Alter Committee will be asked to keep them filled.

The Nathan Borreson fundraiser was very successful. \$5,800 was presented to the family. The Social Concerns committee wanted to thank Sandy Gavle, Tammy Nordheim, Bill Stoen and all the workers, picnic table transporters, Mike Reicks and especially the Good Lord for keeping the rain away.

The Memorial Day lunch was a success thanks to Emma Thompson and the Circles.

The Property Committee reports that the Parsonage is empty and has been cleaned. We will retain the deposit because the renters were not completely out by the due date.

The new Pastoral Contract will be discussed at the Joint Council meeting to be held after the June 26 joint church service.

The Big Canoe council will look into first aid training and the use of the AED. We will also have the AED checked out by the local EMS team.

A quick claim deed is being filed for the piece of land where Hans Jarland is buried. This land will be deeded to the church from Gerda Luhman and Gary and Hilma Sanders.

Liz motioned, and Rita seconded, that we adjourn the meeting with the Lord's Prayer led by Vern.
