Big Canoe Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes - August 6, 2023

The Big Canoe church council met for its regular monthly meeting following services at Highland Lutheran Church. Members in attendance were: Vern Whitaker, Pat O'Regan, Steve Emery, Brian Bigler, Rita Thomas, Treasurer Laurie Emery and Pastor Gies.

Since Pastor was unavailable at the beginning of the meeting opening devotions were omitted.

Secretary's minutes were approved as read.

Treasurer showed a balance of \$1,366.53 on hand. Report placed on file.

OLD BUSINESS

Pat reported that he is checking with Farmer's Union Co-Op about contracting LP for the winter. The contract writer is on vacation, but will write the contract upon return to work.

Laurie mentioned that since "Focus on the Family" is no longer inserted in the bulletin most end up in the recycling bin. After discussion of options, Steve motioned, and Vern seconded, that we dispense with the insert. Motion passed.

Discussion was held on the janitor's job. Bob does the mowing of the church and janitor's yards, opens the church, and monitors the humidifiers. (He had to replace one of them last week.) Pat motioned, seconded by Steve, that instead of a regular salaried contract Bob be allowed to remain in the house without rent and continue his duties. The church will compensate him in November with a bonus. The motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS

On August 30, 2023, the Call Committee will be doing a video about the church. This video will be submitted to the Synod for consideration.

There was discussion about doing a joint Highland-Big Canoe float for Steam Engine days. No resolution was reached.

Our outside service on September 17, 2023, will be led by the youth of the Congregation.

Anna Jetson is proposing that BC-HI try an intergenerational Sunday School. After discussion the council decided that this would be a great idea and that we should get behind it. This will be discussed between the churches and we will figure out a way to proceed.

Tor Oksnevad and Bill Stoen did an inspection of the church tuckpointing. They used the theory of "needs vs. wants". Bill will begin applying for grants and we needed the reference for getting bids for the job.

The date and times of council meetings was discussed. Pastor Gies would like us to coordinate with Highland and see if we could hold both council meetings on the same day with the possibility of a few more joint meetings. This will be discussed between both councils.

Confirmation classes were discussed. There is some question about how the classes will be handled now that Pastor Adam is gone. We need to get into contact with Shelly Bigler to check about arrangements with the other churches.

Communion for shut-in training and training for service presentation will begin in September. Let council members know if you would like to participate.

Pat motioned, Rita seconded, that we adjourn. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Highland Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes - August 6, 2023

Call to Order - President, Steve Langland called the meeting to order at 9:05 a.m.

In attendance were President Steve Langland, Karen Erickson, Virginia Karlsbroten, Darlene Larson, Mark Sollien, Al Erickson and Anna Jetson. Guest Tammy Nordheim.

Anna Jetson led us in a short devotion and opening prayer.

Steve indicated he had four topics he wanted to discuss today:

- 1. The Krohus family left money to repaint the outside cellar doors. Steve talked to the Ladstens about an estimate. Dan is researching the cost of interior steel doors for the basement. They may need to be custom made.
- Dorothy Karlsbroten would like to have the padding and covering on the communion rail redone. Steven indicated that perhaps the chairs should also be redone so that they match the rail. Money could be taken from the improvement fund if needed. Steve will obtain an estimate from Timmerman's out of Decorah and let Dorothy know the cost of the rail and chairs.
- 3. Steve asked if we should consider repainting the lectern, perhaps repair, redo the varnish and repaint. Steve will get costs and report back.
- 4. Virginia reached out to Pastor Dave to have him review our church profile. He made a few suggestions. He questioned the benefits listed and whether or not they should include Sabbatical. We will need to review the guidelines. Steve informed us that we are part of a pilot project for the Synod. The Pastor Bracket will be taking drone pictures of Big Canoe and Highland churches. He will be here on August 30th for congregation questions and comments about our church.

Other Matters:

- 1. Virginia reported that a few of us attended the stone cleaning demo last Sunday at Big Canoe. Very interesting. You are not to use any chemicals on the stones as that will damage them. D2 is what the professional used. She put the question to us if we should buy the product and have a workday to clean our stones. We could get grant monies or Thrivent monies too. We could also hire the professionals to clean them for us. We will put something in the newsletter as we do not want to upset anyone if they for some reason do not want their family stone cleaned.
- 2. Steven indicated that we should bet Sparkle wash here again next spring to clean the exterior of the church.
- 3. We discussed landscaping updates.
- 4. Anna informed us that she has written a proposal for an intergeneration Sunday School and wants council approval to proceed. Tammy Nordine indicated that Big Canoe is holding a Young Family Revival on September 17th. The Youth will be doing everything for the service. All are welcome.
- 5. Anna suggested that we think about switching Feb and July in the schedule for services, so we'd have air in the summer with services being in Highland June, July and August and paved roads in the winter.
- 6. Communion servers for August: 8-6 Virginia and Steve; 8-13 Mark and Darlene.
- 7. Anna handed out the most recent financial reports. Motion by Mark and seconded by Darlene to approve. Motion carried.
- 8. Brenda Gullickson, Steve and Karen will review the old children's books we have and see what we can donate and should keep. Karen will lead.
- 9. Baptism/Death Updates: One death Steven Selness May 27th. No baptisms and no transfers.

There being no further business motion by Virginia and second by Darlene to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 9:46 AM. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
