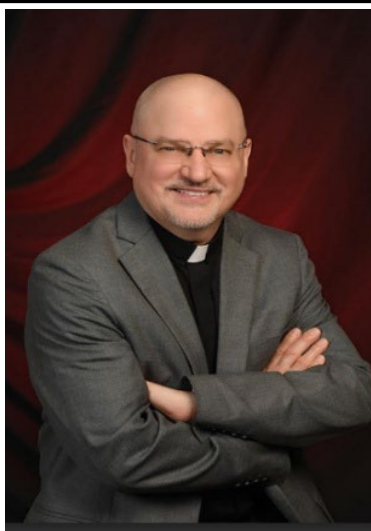

Dear friends and members of Big Canoe and Highland Lutheran Churches,

Late last night I returned from Germany to the parsonage after a 24-hour journey that involved quite a bit of walking, two trains, two airport shuttles, two buses, two planes (both of which encountered significant turbulence), and my truck. It was a good trip. My work in the Protestant Church archive in Darmstadt led to several significant discoveries about Dr. Edmund Schlink, the Lutheran pastor and professor whose writings I'm editing/translating and whose biography I'm researching and writing. I'm grateful that both congregations gave me this time away to pursue my scholarly work. I'm grateful to Pastor Gies, who served the congregations in my absence. (Btw, he's doing well after his recent surgery. I spoke with him on the phone this morning. He sends his greetings. He's looking forward to returning to preach at Highland in the fall. More details about that Sunday to follow.)

Just an fyi: I don't plan to return to Europe until mid-Sep. of next year, God willing and the creek don't rise... During the past two weeks I was able to work through 12 files out of a total of more than 100, which contain Schlink's important correspondence, reports, lecture notes, and personal documents, including several photos. So, I have a few more research trips to conduct in Germany until I finish these writing projects.)

I'm grateful to God for the safe journey! And I'm grateful to be back in "the pastoral saddle" here in beautiful NE Iowa....

While I was away, I observed the 37th anniversary of my ordination into the holy ministry. On that date (July 16), I gave additional praise and thanks to God for the calling I have to serve Big Canoe and Highland congregations as your pastor. I am reminded of this sacred vocation every day, as I look at the official call documents that are framed on the wall in my study at the parsonage. These are important reminders to me of what I have been called to do in your midst: to preach the gospel, administer the sacraments, teach the Word, visit the sick and homebound, pray for all according to their needs, provide pastoral care and counseling, provide spiritual leadership in equipping you all to do your work of ministry.

One important aspect of my pastoral calling is to serve the Word of Christ, who calls each of us to repentance, to faith, to hope, and to love. To paraphrase the great Christian pastor and poet John Donne (1572-1631), Christ came not to force and compel people who would not be brought into the Way. Christ saves no one against his or her will. "Christ beats his drum, but he does not press men; Christ is served with voluntaries..." The pastoral calling is to "go and preach the gospel," and thus invite people to be received into the church. The pastoral calling is not to force people into the church; "it is not, draw the sword, kindle the fire, wind up the rack..." Christ came not to compel people into the church; he came to call. This calling implies a voice, as well as a Word, i.e., the Word preached (and not merely the written Word that is read privately at home).

Here's Donne again: "Adam was not made in Paradise but brought thither, called thither: the sons of Adam are not born in the church, but called thither by baptism. No person is born a Christian but called into that state by regeneration. And therefore, as the consummation of our happiness is in that we shall be called at last into the kingdom of glory, in the 'Come ye blessed, and enter your Master's joy'; so it is a blessed inchoation [beginning; origin] of that happiness that we are called into the kingdom of grace and made partakers of his Word and sacraments and other ordinances by the way. And so you have his action and his errand, 'he came' and 'came to call.'" (Excerpts from Donne's sermon, "The Showing Forth of Christ")

I'm grateful for my calling, which involves voicing the call that Christ is speaking to you and to all!

Dear friends and members of Big Canoe and Highland Lutheran Churches,

This weekend there will be two funeral services at Big Canoe. The service for Linda Miller (May 3, 1950 – May 30, 2026) will be on Saturday morning, while the service for Richard Amundson (May 8, 1952 – April 22, 2026) will be on Sunday afternoon.

Linda's funeral will be a kind of "home-coming." She was the daughter of Sophus and Palma Stoen, and was baptized, confirmed, and married at Big Canoe. The congregation was the center of her life throughout her childhood and young adulthood. After she married her husband John, they moved to Urbandale, Iowa, where Linda ran a daycare for thirty years. After she retired, she and John moved to Corydon, Iowa. On Saturday, she will be buried in the Big Canoe Cemetery. In a sense, she has come back home, to be buried in ground that has been and is sacred to her family.

Richard, too, has ties to this area, being related to the large Amundson clan. He was born in Staples, Minnesota, to Rev. James and Clare Amundson. Dick spent his childhood in Brooklyn, NY, and his teenage years in Wind Lake, WI. He earned a B.A. in psychology at Luther College. For a year, he and his wife were a part of a Christian singing group. He later founded "Tentmakers," an organization that develops and equips youth leaders for churches to impact future generations for Christ. After many years of ministry in Minnesota and elsewhere, Dick, too, is "coming home," returning to the land of his family's roots.

Throughout the week, as I have reflected on these two upcoming "home-comings," I have found myself humming the familiar hymn, "Softly and Tenderly Jesus Is Calling." The refrain speaks of "coming home": "You who are weary, come home." Earnestly, tenderly, Jesus is calling, calling, "O sinner, come home!"

Softly and tenderly Jesus is calling, calling for you and for me.
See, on the portals he's waiting and watching, watching for you and for me....

Why should we tarry when Jesus is pleading, pleading for you and for me?
Why should we linger and heed not his mercies, mercies for you and for me...?

Oh, for the wonderful love he has promised, promised for you and for me!
Though we have sinned, he has mercy and pardon, pardon for you and for me....

"Come home, come home! You who are weary, come home."
Earnestly, tenderly, Jesus is calling, calling, "O sinner, come home!"

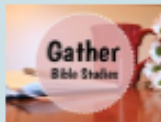

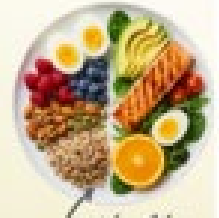
