Big Canoe Council Meeting Minutes, Sunday, June 29, 2025

The Big Canoe council meeting was called to order by President Brian Bigler. Other council members present: Steve Emery - Vice President, Bill Bullerman, Seth Ferguson, Kathryn Thompson, Vernoe Whitaker, Laurie Emery, Deb Monson - Secretary, and Pastor Becker.

It was decided to forgo the reading of the minutes from the last council meeting.

Brian contacted Sawyer Wise who will be submitting a bid to upgrade the septic system.

Discussion was had regarding fees for use of the church by non members. Pastor will be marrying a couple at Big Canoe next May who are not members. The cost of non members to use the church for a wedding is \$200.00. This fee does not cover the custodian or pastor fees.

Pastor would like to see the use of Record of Fellowship/Attendance Cards implemented at church. The cards would be completed by members only. The ushers would pick up the completed cards after services. The cost of the form is \$77 with the cost of the initial set of the forms covered by Pastor Becker. President Brian requested a motion to approve the use of the attendance cards, along with payment for cost of all future forms to be paid by the church. The motion was made by Seth and seconded by Bill. The motion passed.

Pastor Becker would like to see the church to begin using welcome cards for visitors coming to Big Canoe. The card would say welcome to our parish and would provide general information about Big Canoe. This would give the church publicity for new members. Pastor will pay for the first round of cards to be made up.

President Brian requested a motion for the approval and printing of the welcome to our parish card. A motion was made by Bill Bullerman and seconded by Kathryn Thompson. The motion passed.

The summer fill contract with Hovey has been taken care of by Treasurer Laurie Emery.

It was suggested that Lisa Bullerman send thank you cards to persons (visitors) who make donations by check to the church, using special thank you cards.

Thanks to Kris Bigler and Tammy Nordheim for helping with decluttering the church.

The audio equipment in the basement will be given to Bill Stoen. Brian will contact Bill about this.

Brian will also talk to Bill about applying to The Depot for a grant for the septic project.

The Ladies Aid will be having a meatball dinner on October 5th serving from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Time needs to be verified.

President Anna Jetson called the meeting to order.

Pastor Becker offered prayers and said he sees Big Canoe and Highland as one Parish and looks upon us as being one flock of sheep.

Kristi Selness gave the secretary's report from the last joint council meeting. One clarification was made was that Big Canoe and Highland each have their own Workmen's Compensation Insurance for Pastor and employees.

President Anna requested a motion to accept the secretary's report as read and corrected. Al Erickson made the motion which was seconded by Brian Bigler. The motion passed.

Pastor report from Pastor Becker:

- Twenty two members from Big Canoe and Highland attended the church retreat on June 21, 2025 at Big Canoe. There was a good group discussion.
- Pastor has goals for 2026. He strongly encourages education within the churches, adult bible study education, Children's Sunday School which will start up again this fall at Big Canoe on the first and third Sunday of the month, the worship schedule will remain as is with further discussion at the next council meetings.
- The following people are receiving adult Instruction to become members at Big Canoe: Lisa Boyd, Randi Jo and Sawyer Wise.
- Pastor will be going to Germany for further education/work. He will leave on July 12th and return on July 25th. Detra is currently working with horses for people with PTSD and autism. She will finish her education at the end of July.
- Big Canoe will have a float in the Nordic Fest parade.
- QR code cards On Easter Sunday, \$700 was received through the QR code system. The QR code cards should be upgraded by laminating the cards for offering purposes. This is for Big Canoe only,
- Pastor is trying to get the church services on YouTube.
- Pastor will be performing a wedding at Big Canoe on the Saturday of the Memorial Day weekend. The people to be married are non-members but chose Big Canoe because of the beauty of the church.
- Pastor will be traveling to Nigeria in April 2026 to ordain the students he has been teaching.
- Pastor will be suspending office hours but is still available by calling and setting up and appointment.
- Luther League members enjoyed a picnic.
- Pastor will be speaking at a conference in November of this year and will be the keynote speaker in California in January 2026.

Old Business: none

New Business:

 Sunday, July 27 there will be a Shared Ministry service in Highlandville with a potluck dinner following services. Ellen Friedrich will be the guest speaker. Her fee is \$425.00. President Brian Bigler made the motion which was seconded by Kathryn Thompson that in case of rain, Big Canoe will be the back up location. The motion passed.

- According to the Synod, church guest pastors are to be paid \$200 plus mileage.
- There will be attendants assisting with parking and shuttling. Persons attending are to bring their own chairs and table service.
- o Tammy Nordheim will be setting up programs for the youth attending.
- A new printer/copier is needed at Big Canoe. A new color copier would be shared by Big Canoe and Highland for newsletters and bulletins.
- Brian asked for volunteers to research a new printer/copier and whether it be purchased or leased. Representatives from Highland and Big Canoe along with Pastor Becker and Denise Gulrud will be Lisa Bullerman and Judy Krauskopf.
- Pastor also needs a new printer at the parsonage as the one he has is costing \$90 for the ink cartridge.
- For info and discussion purposes only: Church services will remain as currently scheduled. A
 request/option was made for a 9:00 a.m. service with Adult Bible Study and Sunday School
 after service. Church attendance today, June 29th, was 53. Communion distribution: intinction
 versus the common cup Pastor Becker would like to see the use of the common cup.
 Communion distribution will remain as is currently done.
- Attendance booklets will be placed in the church pews. People can sign in that they are in attendance and also if they took communion. We will experiment with this at Big Canoe on Sunday, July 6th.
- Should joint councils meet more than twice a year?
- Pastor Becker introduced the idea of having a cantor to lead both congregations in singing.
 Lisa Boyd, who is a music major, has a beautiful voice and would make for a great cantor.
 Consolidation needs to be given to paying Lisa for this service.
- Highland needs to update joint property concerns. The south porch windows at the parsonage need to be replaced with an awning type of window. Kohlmeyer has provided an estimate of \$6,139. Danny Dutka will apply for a grant from The Depot Outlet. Pastor and Detra are willing to contribute to this project as well. A new floor for the south porch also needs to be completed at some point.
 - President Anna Jetson asked for a motion for the replacement of the windows on the south porch of the parsonage. Myron Krauskopf made the motion which was seconded by Steve Emery. The motion passed.

Danny Dutka made the motion to adjourn which was seconded by Myron Krauskopf. The meeting was adjourned. The meeting was closed by all in attendance reciting The Lord's Prayer.

Highland Church Council Meeting Minutes, July 13, 2025 following Joint Worship at Highland

Call to Order: President Anna Jetson called the meeting to order at 11:21 AM.

Attendance: President Anna Jetson, Vice President Al Erickson, Secretary Kristy Selness, Treasurer Dan Dutka, Council members Myron Krauskopf, Gary Selness, Ed Stoen and guest Judi Krauskopf, printer/copier committee member.

Opening Devotions: Anna Jetson provided a prayer.

Secretary's Report: Kristy Selness read the May 11, 2025 meeting minutes. Motion to approve by Dan Dutka, seconded by Myron Krauskopf, carried.

Treasurer's Report: Dan Dutka provided a financial update. He bought two CD's at Viking State Bank, \$10,000 each. One for a 182 day term and one for a 12 month term. The Scholarship fund was closed out and put in the Improvement fund. \$20,000 was taken out of the Improvement fund to pay for improvements at the church. Filed for audit.

Property Report: Dan Dutka provided a report. We have new gutters, downspouts and screens on the North side of the church. Cost of \$2,527.85. Work done by State Line Seamless Gutters, completed in June 2025.

Propane was contracted for next season for 1,000 gallons at \$1.55 per gallon. Summer fill has been completed for 330 gallons at \$1.49 per gallon.

Pastoral Report: No report.

Update on Parish printer/copier: Judi Krauskopf provided an update. Committee agreed to purchase HP color laser pro, model MFP430 for \$579.00. Highland's share of 35% to be paid from the Improvement fund.

Organist for Shared Ministry on July 27: Kathryn Thompson to be organist and Highland Church to pay since worship would have been at Highland that day.

Automated Giving: Discussion on QR code. Dan Dutka provided information on this. Motion by Myron Krauskopf to authorize the Treasurer to open an additional checking account for receipt of electronic giving, seconded by Al Erickson. Motion carried.

Motion by Anna Jetson to authorize Treasurer to set up electronic giving in the form of a QR code with anticipated cost of 2.9% plus 30¢ per transaction, seconded by Gary Selness. Motion carried.

Northside Project Update: Myron Krauskopf provided an update. Proposal to run new tile line on North side of church, from Northeast corner to Northwest corner, and tie into existing tile line by the sidewalk to avoid tearing up the sidewalk. Put in two intakes to catch excess water. Received a bid from Doug Schmelzer in the amount of \$3,100. Motion by Dan Dutka to approve Schmelzer bid of drainage and rock on new tile line, second by Myron Krauskopf. Motion carried.

Sidewalk Repair: Myron Krauskopf provided an update, with Dan Dutka. He informed the Council that the sidewalk at the back door (North side) is in need of repair. It has uneven and shifted sections, and some broken concrete. It is 145 feet in length. Proposal to replace sidewalk from the North end to the back door. Add an additional slab of concrete next to the current one by the church back door and run it up to the church, so you would have additional parking. Also, add a slab of concrete on the North end of the back sidewalk so that you would add an additional two or three parking spaces, possibly for handicapped. This first project was bid out at \$10,656 by Steve Falk Construction, \$11,256 by Kelly Concrete and \$13,876 by Hubka Construction.

Myron Krauskopf provided two additional projects for the Council.

Due to the cost of these projects, Dan Dutka made a motion to schedule a congregational meeting on August 10, 2025 to discuss and approve the major concrete projects, seconded by Al Erickson, motion carried.

Tool Shed: Discussion on moving of tool shed. No action taken.

Fundraiser for Aase Haugen Capital Campaign this year: Discussion by Council on raising funds. Coffee can donations discussed, Anna Jetson and Dan Dutka to look into options.

Coffee Chats Feedback: No feedback at this time.

September Council Meeting: Council agreed on no September Council Meeting unless possible Special meeting after congregational meeting.

Adjournment. Motion to adjourn meeting by Myron Krauskopf, seconded by Al Erickson, motion carried. Adjourned at 12:47 PM.
