President Brian Bigler said that the cost of printing the newsletter is getting to be astronomical. The council discussed sending the newsletter by email with 20-30 copies being printed and placed at the back of the church.

A motion was made by Seth Ferguson to send the newsletter by email, seconded by Kathryn Thompson and the motion was approved by the council.

Pastor Becker discussed providing sack lunch to farmers during harvest time. The date for this would be the second Sunday in October. People would be needed to pack the lunches and drivers to deliver them to farmers. The lunch would consist of a sandwich, chips, and a drink. Deb Monson advised the council that Big Canoe WELCA will be having their Bake and Quilt Sale on Saturday, October 11th.

- Bad weather, rain, and wind can break tree branches and can erode or undermine monuments.
- · Older monuments can get brittle, break, and even fall.
- Frost can cause newer monuments to slide or "walk" off their foundation.
- As much as we cherish our loved ones that have passed away, be mindful of the memorabilia
 you place at their grave site. Small objects can roll, animals can move them, and even the
 wind can take them away. When the groundskeeper mows or trims, memorabilia can pose a
 hazard to him or those visiting at that time.
- If you have broken memorabilia at the gravesite, please remove it.
- If you see or know of a hazard in the Big Canoe Cemetery, please notify the cemetery committee so that someone can address the issue.
