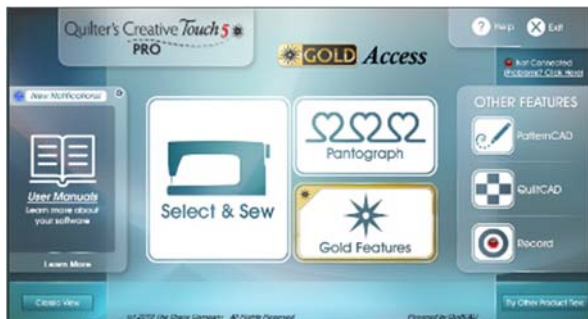

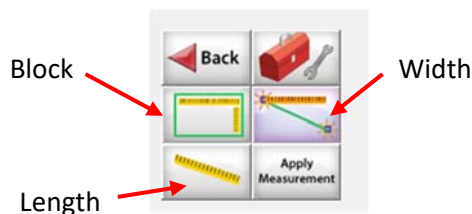
Measurements in QCT5

There's a great feature within QCT5 that I use on every single quilt, often in multiple ways. To begin, open QCT5 select the **Pantograph** – follow the prompts on your screen to set the **safe area**.



Now you are in the **PantoStacker** screen.

From the **toolbar** at the top of the screen you will see a yellow icon of a ruler, Tap to select - a new screen will open to allow us to measure our quilt tops



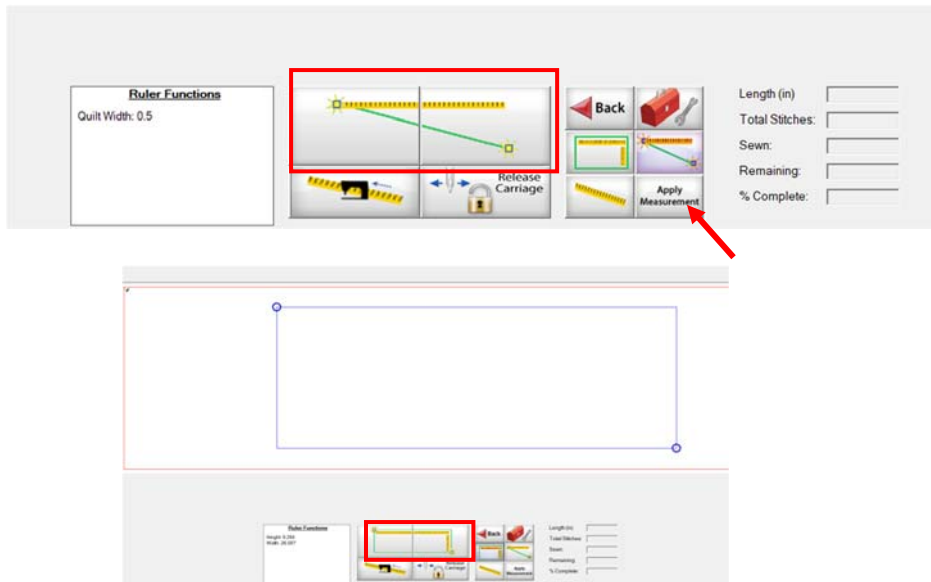
We have 3 ways in which we can measure something. Select the **Block** icon and a rectangle appears, this allows us to measure both the height and width of a block and apply measurement.


You are able to toggle between all features

It's easy to use, simply move your machine to your first measurement point, say upper left corner of the quilt top, and tap the screen to register, then move to the right-hand top corner of the quilt and tap the screen to register. Then to record this measurement we need to select **Apply measurement**.

If you use the ruler and then select [apply measurement](#) while in [PantoStacker](#), the Block ruler applies the measurements to the entire pantograph, the row height will equal the total height divided by the number of rows, if we use only the width ruler it will only effect the pantograph width.

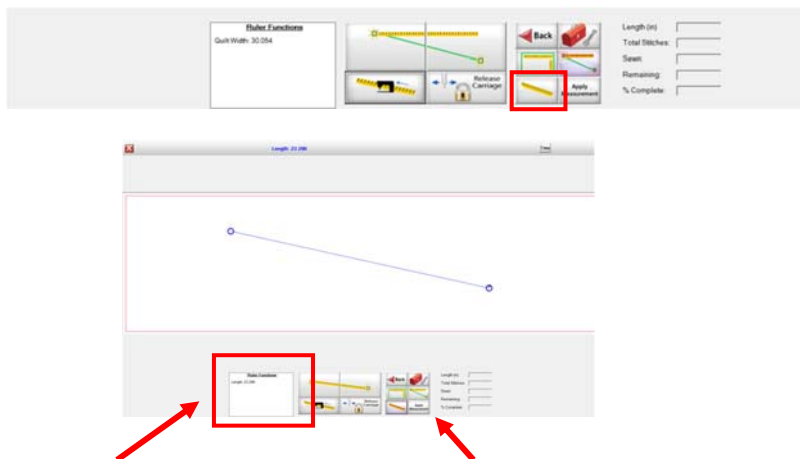
This is a great tool for using in sashings and borders of quilts.



If I would like to find the centre measurement tap the [sewing machine](#) icon  - your machine will move to the [centre](#) for you to mark.



If I tap the [length](#) icon it will tell me the [distance](#) between the points that I selected



You will see your measurements displayed in the bottom left screen

If I tap the [Width](#) icon it will tell me the [horizontal](#) measurement between these two points.
