

    - All monies have been transferred, and we are in compliance with the request from JCSA

    - Zoom, Constant Contact, and Square accounts have all been set up to pay monthly expenses using the JCSA credit card






## Fall workday Debrief from Paul E.:

Just a note to capture some of my observations regarding the RVSC Work Day recently completed on Sat, 13Dec2025. Somehow, there are no photos of the activity that I know of. I believe this is the 4th Work Day that I have semi-organized. I believe there were 2 prior Work Days that I helped with, organized by Frank Moore and Chris Schantz, since I have lived in the area.

1. We did GREAT!! There were approximately 18 volunteers, doing things to improve our RVSC facility. We had a chilly, overcast day, high temp of about 40F. There was no rain during the work period. Several guys arrived about 8:00. Work officially started at 9:00. THANKS Bill for the Safety Briefing, reminder to keep the road open. The last workers left about 3:00.
2. Chuck and Craig worked in the clubhouse.
  - Several areas were cleaned thoroughly.
  - A “big screen” was installed. There were some lingering technical issues with it.
  - They fixed a fantastic spread for lunch.
3. The shovels on the range got some maintenance - the handles were sanded, oiled with linseed oil, then finished with some kind of stuff that Jim found. They should last a long time now.
4. The road was graded ... THANKS, Bill!
5. Work continued on the 5-Stand area, The structure to support sheet metal roofing on the observation platform was installed. The next steps there are being designed ...
  - The exact roofing material has not yet been picked. Bill, Dave, Eric, and maybe some other folks have been in discussion on this.
  - The exact handrail design is not yet finalized. Dave and Bill (maybe others) are in discussion on this.
6. Several unused older black PVC pipe shooting stands were removed from the range. They were scrapped.
7. The situation with the lumber and tent parts on the clubhouse floor was resolved.
8. Some old lattice and platform left-overs near Sta 7 were scrapped.
9. The sign saying something like “No Unauthorized Vehicles Beyond this Point” near the range road entrance (near the “buggy shed”) is in the capable hands of David T. for some kind of re-make so it actually is, indeed, free-standing.
10. Then, there is the trees/wood/fire stuff ...
  - At least 6 dead standing pines were cut down. Some were cut into approx 6 ft lengths, stacked for future processing. Others were sufficiently far back in the trees that removal for further use was impractical.
  - LOTS of dead branches were stacked on the existing burn piles, and were, indeed, burned. The two big piles left over from the May2025 work day were burned. Another burn pile was located behind the “buggy shed.” There was another on Sta 6, burning scrap from wood harvest in the area.
  - At least 2 RVSC members got loads of fire wood.
  - Derek picked up at least 2 pickup loads of wood for JCSA. I do not know where it was deposited.
  - The signs that JCSA put up, saying, in essence, to remove no wood from JCSA premises, were still visible on work day. Supposedly, there had been some kind of agreement (JCSA BOD meeting?) allowing wood removal on our work day. The “double message” from JCSA should have been resolved for improved JCSA credibility.
  - There are some stacks of logs at Sta 1 and 14 (others?) available for further processing into firewood or other use.
  - Most of the stacked piles of branches near the range entrance gate were taken to burn piles. Some branches remain on the ground. They can be left for Mother Nature to deal with, or another effort can be made to clean them more thoroughly. Caution: Watch for the poison oak/poison ivy in the area.
  - It has taken approximately 6 Work Days since about 2020 to get the “forest management” on the range to its current condition. From my point of view, we are largely up-to-date with dead and/or hazardous tree removal. There are still some dead standing madrones that could be harvested for firewood. However, there are currently none known to be hazardous to range equipment or operations if they were somehow to fall spontaneously.
  - Since so many trees were removed, I am sure some “landmarks” used to establish hold points and break points and look points are now GONE. I am sooo sorry .... please adapt.

## 11. THANKS Bill -

- Bill's tractor graded the road.
- Bill's "fire suppression wagon" was on site, available "just in case."
- Bill's tractor/loader/grapple hauled maybe 50 clutches of branches to burn piles.
- Bill's tractor pushed at least 2 trees in the direction desired to avoid damage to other range equipment.
- Bill's chain saw cut several trees.
- Bill's utility dump-trailer was used behind the Polaris four-wheeler to haul sticks and other stuff.
- Bill has volunteered his shop space and equipment for potential use in fashioning handrails for the 5 Stand observation platform.
- Bill remembered to do the Safety Briefing, and reminded folks to be on the look-out for the tractor, and to keep the road passable.
- Bill and Beth contributed goodies for the lunch.

12. From my point of view, there was adequate publicity prior to the work day (THANKS, Craig!) on the website and via the club newsletter. The request, per the publicity, was that folks would call or email me that they would be there. I heard from about 80% of the work participants, via personal contact, or email, or text. That is about the same response rate that I remember from past events. The main surprise was that the Young Guns had indicated they would be participating, but something must have come up. They were not represented. Those folks had made significant contributions working with cut tree branches in the past.

## **Some items to consider for future range improvement work are ....**

1. The old gun rack near Sta 7 is still there. It needs some maintenance and a coat of paint. Then, redeployment ... maybe to the 5 Stand area?
2. There is interest in painting the interiors of the "buggy shed" and the "utility shed" (near the concrete block storage building near Sta 12). The idea is to spray paint them white for improved interior visibility. That was not done this fall - temps dropped before a sufficient effort could be mustered.
3. Work is in process to complete some items at the 5 Stand facility:
  - Roof for observation platform
  - Handrail for steps to observation platform
  - Walt had some signs made ... I do not know installation status.
4. The road grading will need to be repeated periodically.
5. There are still many cut tree branches on the ground in the trees near the range entrance gate.
6. At one time, it was an item to install some new trap controllers, wires, and batteries on the work day. I think that is being handled on an "as needed" basis.
7. I believe Dave T. - with help - is planning to build more shooting stands for the sporting clays range. That will probably be an on-going effort for the foreseeable future several months. Site preparation and station design and construction will all need attention.
