


We truly appreciate our partnership with the Mount Cross Lutheran Church! Thank you for providing such beautiful location to host this lifesaving event!



Valentine's Day is named after Saint Valentine, a Catholic priest who lived in Rome in the 3rd Century. At the time of Valentine's life, many Romans were converting to Christianity, but the Emperor Claudius II was a pagan and created strict laws about what Christians were allowed to do. Claudius believed that Roman soldiers should be completely devoted to Rome and therefore passed a law preventing them from marrying. Valentine began to marry these soldiers in secret Christian ceremonies and this was the beginning of his reputation for believing in the importance of love. Eventually, Valentine was found out and jailed for his crimes against Claudius. While imprisoned, Valentine cared for his fellow prisoners and also his jailor's blind daughter. Legend has it that Valentine cured the girl's blindness and that his final act before being executed was to write her a love message signed 'from your Valentine'. Valentine was executed on the  $14^{th}$  of February in the year 270.

It wasn't until more than 200 years later that February 14<sup>th</sup> was proclaimed St. Valentine's Day. By this time Rome had become Christian and the Catholic Church was determined to stamp out any remaining paganism, thus the Pope abolished the pagan fertility ritual that was held in February each year and proclaimed February 14<sup>th</sup> as Saint

Valentine's Day, thus establishing this holiday.



The Global Missions Team is initiating a new program for the 2025 year. Each month a particular food item will be featured. It is requested that the items be purchased and placed in the grocery basket. A display of the monthly featured item can be viewed on a table located at the entrance to the sanctuary. The focus for the month of February is jars of peanut butter or jelly.

## Cozy Mystery Unleashed!


Cozy Mysteries have taken readers by storm...
