Pastor's Musings & Ponderings

"Call to me and I will answer you, and will tell you great and hidden things that you have not known." Jeremiah 33:3 (ESV)

This verse from Jeremiah serves as a direct invitation from God to God's people. God is urging the people to reach out to him. In this urging, God wants to have a relationship with each one of us and promises that anyone who truly and humbly seeks him will be guaranteed an answer. God is showing unconditional love for the people not only in Jeremiah's time, but to all of us today.

To say that Jeremiah was written during a very difficult and trying time for the people of Israel is putting it mildly. They faced chaos, despair and uncertainty through invasions and destruction. In spite of all this, God, through Jeremiah, reminded the people that they were not facing this alone. In the verse above, God's promise of God being in control still stood. All they had to do was to call out to him.

We are often reminded through scripture and hymns that we have a God who is always with us. A God who is faithful. A God who loves us unconditionally. This reminds me of a hymn I learned some time ago. It is, "I Will Call Upon The Lord." This hymn is in my top ten of favorite hymns/praise tunes. Whenever we feel overwhelmed in the midst of challenges, instead of pointing fingers or making misguided attempts to control the situation, we are to "call upon the Lord, who is worthy to be praised. So shall I be saved from my enemies. The Lord liveth and blessed be the rock." God is always ready to unveil His plans for us. When we go to God, we are taking the first steps in seeking God's divine insight. When we sincerely seek God, the Holy Spirit opens our hearts and minds to hear what God has to say, which is way beyond what anyone of us can do on our own.







HOW DOES THE CHURCH COUNCIL DEVELOP A BUDGET?

As a former Council President, several times over, as well as developing a budget for various other places, it is important to have an idea of what incoming resources are available. So with that I will start my own journey towards pledging my giving to a church and to the community.

I was a single mother in the 1960s, and then again in the 1970s. Money was tight, and giving was limited since I worked one to four jobs to support my family. My pledge to the church was \$5.00 per week, payable twice a month to match paydays. That \$5.00 represented a fortune to me. We lived on Ramen, grilled cheese sandwiches, creamed tuna on toast (day old bread), dried milk reconstituted, oatmeal, cracked eggs, and an occasional bag of oranges from one of my coworkers. There was no welfare, no food stamps, or any other assistance so it was deal with it. All I could do was pray.

I knew church was important, but giving was not a big thing for me. But I trust God and that was good because when I started my job with Los Angeles County, food stamps were available but we were not eligible to use them. However, in the 1970's, I coached cheerleading for POP Warner football, announced little league games, and helped in any other thing I could participate in during the evenings. After a couple of years things got better with a few well-placed promotions. Finally, the shelves bloomed with yellow cans from Lucky stores, fruit from the farmers market (which was cheap then), and we moved along.

When I joined St. John's Lutheran Church in Orange, California, I was able to pledge a whopping \$50.00 per month. Trust God, things get better. At St John's, I was a Christ Care leader, a Stephen's Minister, led a Bible study with another woman, and would make a casserole for a funeral if I had two days notice so I could drop it off at night before the funeral. Trust God. I got several big promotions and I could give \$200.00. Yeah! Study the Bible, learn more, live with the need to give God 10% as first fruits. It worked and when I retired, I could buy a home, give to the church and the community, and love the people.

So back to Mount Cross. Each year we have a pledge drive. WHY? In order to prepare a budget. It is critical to have some idea of possible income sources. For the few years the budget was on guesstimate, based upon a few pledges and reliance on weekly giving in the collection plate. Many of you are very generous, many give what they can and others may give as they feel. This makes s it very difficult for the church Council to plan for the various needs of the church.

At present, we are in a position of needing to build up funds to pay for the sidewalk and rebuild the reserve account for emergencies. So this years pledge drive is really important. It is not fear, but good planning for the future. We have some help with the school rent and any other bookings we may have of the log building. We, the members of a strong church known as the amazing Mount Cross, need to commit what we can to ensure a good future for church.

Please help if you can, and thanks for tolerating my spiel.
