"The Word became a human being and lived here with us. We saw his true glory, the glory of the only Son of the Father. From him the complete gifts of undeserved grace and truth have come down to us." John 1:14 (CEV)

"The Word became a human being and lived here with us." Many of us are probably more familiar with the scripture translation that is, "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us."

"The Word became flesh" discloses to us the amazing mystery of the incarnation. John emphasizes the incarnation as the human nature of Jesus, meaning that Jesus was God in human form. 



### Weekly Prayer sessions


The focus of the sessions are to bring concerns and prayers of thanksgiving to God.
