# **Pastor's Ponderings**

It's October! I love this month in the church, for many reasons. There are a lot of occasions to remember and celebrate. And remember and celebrate we will, this year, at Mount Cross. I am hoping that you will join the festivities and invite a friend.

On Saturday, October 2<sup>nd</sup>, at 10:00 a.m., we will offer a *Blessing of the Animals Service under the pines*. Bring your pets (on a leash, in a carrier, a cage or a bowl, please) to receive a blessing, as we give thanks to God for the great gift that they are to us and commemorate Saint Francis of Assisi. He is my favorite saint. He loved and treasured all of God's creation and called God's creatures his brothers and sisters. His commemoration date is October 4<sup>th</sup>. Do you have a statue of him in your garden? Many folks do.

On Sunday, October 31<sup>st</sup>, we will celebrate *Reformation Day*. How about if, this year, we celebrate the heritage of Mount Cross, as well as, the heritage of the many congregations that have played an important part in our faith journey through the years, before we came to Mount Cross!!! Martin Luther's five *solas* (*concepts*) *of the Reformation are: faith alone, grace alone, Christ alone, scripture alone and to God alone be the glory*. Do you have photographs, worship bulletins, newsletters, Bibles, mementos of these "*solas*/*ministries in action*", from Mount Cross or from your previous congregations that we could display? Some of the solas will be easier to find: a Bible for *scripture alone* or a cross for *Christ alone*. What item/memento from your faith life experience might represent *faith alone* or *grace alone*? They're out there! Let's put on our thinking caps and go through our closets and drawers and find them. I will be excited to see what you find. Items will be displayed on tables in the sanctuary for all to see. Please start bringing them in now and make sure that your name is with your item. Please include a short explanation of why you chose this particular item and which **sola** it represents for you.

And while we remember and celebrate the formative years of our past, on Reformation Day, it is also important for us to look at what God is doing **today** to prepare us for an exciting mission filled **future** at Mount Cross. What does it mean to be Lutheran and a disciple at Mount Cross in 2021? Kathryn A. Kleinhans shares the following: "For many in the ELCA who've grown up Lutheran, religious identity is intertwined with a sense of family and cultural traditions: beer, brats for some, lefse and lutefisk for others, familiar liturgy and hymns for all. But the shape of Lutheranism is changing."

"So, what does it mean to be Lutheran...? During the 16<sup>th</sup> Century, Martin Luther challenged the teachings, practices and structures of the Roman Catholic Church. He insisted that the central message of Christianity is the good news that sinners become reconciled to God by grace through faith because of the saving work of Jesus Christ.

"It's important to remember that Luther didn't intend to start a new church. He wanted to reform the existing church so the gospel message was communicated clearly and so the life of the church reflected that gospel center."

# The Gift of the Spirit: A Divine Wild Goose Chase Breath of God, Reviver and Reformer

The October Women's Bible study will be held in the Ponderosa Room on Thursday, October 12<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 a.m.

We will continue to discuss God's gift of the Holy Spirit as breath (wind/air) used to revive and reform the lives of individuals in the Bible and still pertains to us *today*.

## "YOU are the light of the world." Matthew 5:14a

Strange, isn't it? Our scripture, our hymns tell us that Jesus Christ is the light of the world, and he is; his light shines on the Father, as he also spotlights "love" as the everyday commodity we are to share. But in Matthew he says to us, "YOU are the light." (YOU, as in you, me.) And he gives us many illustrations about how to be the light of the world, spotlighting love.

We know that Jesus could be very direct when unhappy with the Pharisees: "Woe to you; you tithe mint and herbs of all kinds and neglect justice and the love of God." (Luke 11:42). But we can recall many times when his love-light focused in a more gentle way.

Remember Zacchaeus, the despised tax collector? ("Come down from the tree; I'll be at your house"). Or the meals he shared with "tax collectors and sinners?" Grieving with Mary and Martha at Lazarus' tomb? Holding a little child, urging the disciples to be as children, ready to show love? Talking with the "loose" woman at the well, a Samaritan no less, totally shocking the disciples? Jesus practiced the art of showing love and he was very inclusive.

So, back to his words to us: "YOU are the light of the world." And what are we to do with our light?? I can see in my mind little kids in Sunday school, holding up their "light" and singing: "Hide it under a bushel?? NO!! I'm gonna let it shine."

I saw in front of a church a little outdoor food pantry, a small cabinet with glass doors, filled with non-perishable food items, and a sign: "Help yourself if you need to, bring and leave some if you can." And, how about the identifying phrase of the ELCA (Evangelical Lutheran Church in America)? "God's Work . . . Our Hands." Also, I like these words from a Hallmark birthday card my daughter sent to me:

"Live your faith, do what's right; Count your blessings, Be the Light."

Lord, help us to shine our lights of love each day. Amen.

The Gather Magazine for September/October had a beautiful prayer at the end of our lesson. Try it at home.


Spend a few moments in silence. Inhale and imagine filling your whole body and heart with breath. Say: *"Holy Spirit, you are my Comforter."*

As you read the Bible there are several references to these two in the Bible. Do you take time to listen to your ADVOCATE OR your ADVERSARY? The HOLY SPIRIT is giving you guidelines and directions as GOD WISHES you to act. Give yourself time to listen, and then follow this guidance.

### Update from Pastor Kristin Engstrom ELCA Service & Justice, Global Missionary August 26, 2021

After serving as the Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) Country Coordinator in Senegal for five years, I am excited to have accepted a new call and a new challenge to serve as the Facilitator for Leadership Development and Capacity Building with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Zambia (ELCZa). Part of my heart will continue to live in Senegal. Our sisters and brothers in the church as well as our Muslim cousins welcomed me and made me part of their lives and their community. But I trust that when the YAGM program begins again, hopefully in August 2022, the new Country Coordinator will be welcomed with the same gracious hospitality I received every day in Senegal.



Due to ongoing COVID precautions both in the United States and around the world, I do not know yet when I will leave for Zambia. Much of the continent of Africa, including Zambia, has not received enough vaccine doses for their population, which makes it easy for COVID to circulate quickly. I also need a work permit before I can enter the country. I have started the process of applying for a Zambian work permit but assume that the application process will take at least a month.

For the time being, I am living in southern Minnesota. I occasionally preach at local congregations as the need arises. I am also hoping to begin learning one of 73 languages spoken in Zambia, but am waiting to learn from ELCZa leaders which language is spoken most in the church.

Thank you for choosing to continue supporting me as an ELCA global missionary. I hope hope hope that I will get to visit you in the future. But for now, I look forward to sharing this transition in ministry with you as I engage in a new ministry in a new part of the continent of Africa.

Yaala baax na! (*God is good*! in the Wolof language of Senegal) God be with you, and all of God's children.

Planning your service in advance is helpful to family members during a time when so many decisions need to be made.


The workshop occurs on Sunday, October 10<sup>th</sup> after the worship service and those who would like to attend will meet in the Ponderosa Room.
