
November is about more than some turkey, stuffing, gravy, (more gravy) and pumpkin pie.



With fall showing its color in preparation for winter, we have some things to plan for as the Church year ramps up to the holidays.

We start with Reformation Sunday, All Saints Day, then on to Veterans Day and the joy of Thanksgiving. All Saints Day is a church celebration day with red paraments, and a celebration of our departed friends and family members. In our church we remember them by tying a ribbon on a wreath with prayers said by all.

Most importantly we have the best day of the year on November 7<sup>th</sup>, when we have prayerfully plan and then dedicate our pledges of money and service to the church. Here we can use our time and talents in the service of Christ.

We are currently studying the HOLY SPIRIT. Do we feel connected with the Holy Spirit? If not, let's try the simple prayer provided in our Gather magazine.

- Inhale. Fill your whole body and heart with breath. Feel air in your lungs. Now say "HOLY SPIRIT, GIVE 1. US LIFE."
- 2. Exhale slowly and fully. Say "REFRESH US WITH YOUR LOVE." Repeat these two actions as many as 10 times. Then end by praying for others who are on your prayer list or in your heart.

Moving forward, I read both chapters of Genesis after Pastor Linda suggested that there are two genesis stories. Loving astronomy and nature, I thought of God taking an expanse of nothing and making it orderly by creating the cosmos, the planets of our galaxy as well as other galaxies, developing the planets as he wished, then taking our planet and creating the oceans and land as a part of the first genesis. Then for the second genesis, creating man, and all the creatures upon the earth as well as all the animals and plants. Then he took a day of rest. Scholars have debated the issue of days over the years, but when you think of what God accomplished, it is astounding no matter how you think of time.

Do we allow God to enter our busy worlds, or do we put that very wonderful time with God on our back burners?
