# President's Ponderings

The month of October flew by with many things accomplished. Green Valley Water (sanitation department) has identified and worked with Wrangler Plumbing and a Sparklight subcontractor to repair the damaged sewer pipe. Repair of damaged dumpster enclosure is still pending settlement from Progressive; some letters have been sent to expedite the completion of the settlement.

Other items in the process of being addressed include 1) A leak in the rooftop is being monitored by the Property Committee; they have cleaned off the roof, which will hopefully solve the problem. 2) The fascia of the church is in need of restaining/repainting and Sun Painting has been considered to complete this task. It is important to keep the building in good repair. 3) The men of the Property Committee, plus Patricia Proescholdt, have weeded much of the campus near the two church buildings. 4) We are hiring a landscape company to come in, once the rainy season is over, to clean up the entire campus and then return on an as-needed basis. 5) The Property Committee has identified a tree behind the log building that needs to be removed. We are seeking bids on that project. We owe a big thank you to our property team!

We have welcomed new members on Reformation Sunday. Since one person was out of town, we will recognize him on November  $6^{th}$ , as well as it being All Saints Sunday and Commitment (Stewardship) Sunday. Please be sure to bring your pledge cards and filled in *time & talent* brochure on the  $6^{th}$  or drop them by the office beforehand.

The Call Committee will be meeting the first week of November. We have selected the following members: Tom Backe, Jan Bartoli, Barb Greer, Eloise Jones, Daria Mason. The alternates will be Nancy Kellett and Ron Nelson. Ron has taken this on, reluctantly, so if anyone would like to be an alternate, please contact Ron or me. An Alternate simply listens, participates in discussion, but does not vote.



Pastor Lance Kittleson of St. Ansgar, Iowa was born in 1951 in the Hawkeye state, but was reared as an Army brat, the son of an Army Green Beret, living in military bases in the South and Germany. He graduated from high school in Fayetteville, NC in 1969, was neither a brilliant scholar nor a gifted athlete, but learned to run fast for self-preservation from his older, bigger brother whom he was needlessly provoked. That contributed to Lance making the high school track team as a hurdler that went on to win the State Track Championship in North Carolina.

Earning a History degree from North Carolina State University in 1973, Lance was commissioned an Infantry officer in the US Army through ROTC and served on active duty in Germany from 1974-1976 followed by continuing to serve in the Iowa and Massachusetts National Guard and later in the Army Reserve where he would complete his military career as a Chaplain.


Entering an evangelical theological Seminary outside of Boston in 1977, Lance returned to his Lutheran roots and graduated from Luther-Northwestern Seminaries, St. Paul, MN, in 1981. He was ordained a Pastor in the American Lutheran Church at his home congregation in St. Ansgar, Iowa that year.

He and his wife, Gail (Cutler), an Iowa farm girl, is a women's historical fiction author and also has a Masters in Teaching English as a Second Language. They married in 1978 and with their two small children served their first Call as missionaries in the west African country of Senegal from 1982-1983. Following their return from overseas missions, they were called to rural ministry at Alta Vista and Lawler, IA (1983-1989), St. Peter, Greene, IA (1989-2000) and to the "sunny side" of Oregon at Zion Lutheran Church, La Grande (2001-2003).

While in Oregon, Lance's Army Reserve unit was mobilized for Operation Iraqi Freedom in 2003 where he served in the Kuwaiti desert and at a base north of Bagdad, Iraq as one of his unit's Chaplains. When demobilized in 2004, he returned to northern Iowa and was called to serve another rural two-point parish of St. Peter, Toeterville & Deer Creek, Carpenter, IA (2004-2021) where he ministered for 17 years. During this time, his unit was again mobilized for Iraq (2010-2011) and upon returning from overseas, he retired as a Chaplain (Colonel) with just shy of 35 years of combined Active, Reserve and National Guard military service. In 2021 at the age of 70 year old, Lance retired from full-time ministry after 40 years of ordination. He has been mowing lawns, pulling weeds and raking leaves while supply preaching at local Iowa Lutheran and Methodist Churches. He relishes having no meetings to attend in-between Sunday worship.

He and Gail spend time between Iowa (watching high school age grandchildren play sports) and Pine, Arizona where they have 'wintered' since 2010. They have two adult children, Katie of St. Ansgar, Iowa and Andy of Phoenix, AZ and three "wonderfully smart and capable" grandchildren who take after their grandmother and their parents.

Note: Pastor Lance Kittleson has graciously agreed to assist Mount Cross during this time of pastoral transition. He will be serving the Lord and this church between December of 2022 and April of 2023.



#### PREPARETH THY HEARTS FOR HIS COMING!

The 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Advent is November 27<sup>th</sup> and materials are available to help prepare your hearts for this joyful season leading into the celebration of Christ's birth. Please feel free to pick up, from the entrance table in the narthex, any or all of the following Advent items: calendars, study guides, and/or Good Gifts catalogs.







For the last two months our women's Bible study has been centered on nature. The first was focused on plants. October it was focused on the world in which Jesus lived. He used the analogy of him being the vine, and we are the branches. If in good soil, the vine grows, if in less hospitable soil, it may grow and then wither, or the seed is lost. Our faith depends on care and attention.

We had a discussion on living in on farms or ranches and how we who depend on the environment to keep our livelihood going by nurturing the soil with fertilizer/manure. Everyone on a farm works to protect as thriving farm.

That is also true for our own lives and our relationship with Christ. I recently received an email that talked about forgiveness, which included many quotes on covering forgiveness. So going to the basics, God sent his son, Jesus, to earth to help us return to him through the power of redemption. To be redeemed, we must first ask for forgiveness and then God can work through the Holy Spirit to redeem us. There were several quotes that caught my soul:

Mother Teresa – "If we really want to love, we must learn how to forgive"

Bernard Meltzer – "When you forgive, you in no way change the past, but you sure do change the future."

Nelson Madela - "When deep injury is done us, we never heal until we forgive"

Jack Canfield – "It can be hard to forgive and let go but it's important to remember that holding a grudge can hurt you even more. The word "forgive" really means to give something up for yourself, not them."

It is a beginning of a relationship with God, as the door opens to your soul.
