## Mount Cross Financial Report (January - October 2022)




2022 Approved Budget	\$306,010.00





Also, much appreciation to Alice Natale and John Proescholdt, the outgoing members of the Council, for their willingness to serve on Mount Cross Council! Alice had been very instrumental in making sure that many needs were taken care of during her time as president (please read her letter at the beginning of this newsletter) and John saw us through with follow-ups in regard to the church's refinance, arranging for help in the upkeep of the church grounds, and contacting a company to paint the church eaves.

Also, thanks to Barbi Buchanan and Sharry Lien, for their service in the church Council. Each have resigned due to dealing with health issues of spouse and self, respectively.

Budget of \$326,229.32 for the 2023 year was approved.

The updates made to Mount Cross' constitution and by-laws, to bring them into compliance with the ELCA's model constitution for congregations, were accepted. The accepted, updated constitution and by-laws have been sent to the Grand Canyon Synod for approval.
