Pastor's Ponderings

It seems like we are hardly done with Christmas when we have to start thinking about Ash Wednesday (Feb. 22) and the Lenten season.

Lent, as we all know, is not nearly as much 'fun' as Advent. In church history both were seen as penitential seasons where we 'prepare' our hearts and lives through some soul searching to welcome the Good News once again through the pivotal events of Jesus' life and mission. Advent leads to the joyous birth of Jesus, but Lent leads to his suffering and death and then TO THE surprise and joy of Easter morning.

Lent is a **'tough love'** season of the year where taking a good look at ourselves, we ask, **"How am I doing with you, Lord? Am I seeking to truly follow Jesus?"** How can I **"know Him more clearly, love Him more dearly, follow Him more nearly,"** as expressed in Richard of Chichester's almost 775 year old prayer (England: 1197-1253) and in the 1970s "Godspell" musical and song "Day by Day."

This season is **NOT** about 'beating ourselves up,' eating more fish or temporarily denying ourselves our favorite chocolate treats. It is, as Bishop Richard prayed, to "know <u>MORE</u> clearly, follow <u>MORE</u> nearly, love <u>MORE</u> dearly" the Savior, Jesus the Christ.

The emphasis is on the "MORE" because our faith, which began in baptism, is a continuous journey of learning about the infinite God who has chosen to love and call us into his family of grace. We never completely 'arrive' in our relationship with God this side of heaven. Still, we are like children who are loved unconditionally, but yet needing to grow and mature continuously or else there is something dangerously wrong. The church, for over 1,700 years, has observed the season of Lent in order to help to constantly call our hearts and minds back to the eternal theme of..." seeking to know, to follow and to love our loving, redeeming triune God MORE and MORE and MORE."

I would encourage all to do their best to live out the Prayer of Richard of Chichester, this <u>"MORE</u> and <u>MORE,"</u> through the **Ash Wednesday Joint Worship at the Methodist Church**, followed by Mount Cross's mid-week services using Holden Evening Prayer to center our thoughts while meditating on our Savior and Lord.

May each of our own personal Lenten journeys truly include 40 days of "<u>to know</u> <u>Him more clearly, love Him more dearly, follow Him more nearly</u>"- <u>DAY</u> BY <u>DAY</u>, especially in this Lent of 2023.



Seekers of Truth Bible study


