Pastor's Musings & Ponderings

"Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died – more than that, who was raised to life – is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us." Romans 8:34

March has arrived! We are in the midst of Lent and our Wednesday Lenten meals and Holden Evening Prayer services have been well attended as well as our Sunday worship. If you haven't been able to attend any of the meals and services, I hope you will be able to join us sometime over the next few weeks.

Maundy Thursday will be celebrated with communion and the traditional stripping of the altar at the end of worship. On Good Friday, we will have a noon service here at Mount Cross that is called the "Service of the Nails." I am sure you will find this service to be very moving. Also on Good Friday, the Methodist Church will be hosting an ecumenical service at 6:00 p.m.

Although we are several weeks away from Easter, many people are already making plans for Easter gatherings. There are also a number of Easter traditions that people hold near and dear to their hearts. Every Easter, I always remember a family tradition that my parents and I observed on the Saturday before Easter. This tradition was the Blessing of the Easter Basket.

The Blessing of the Easter Basket was very important to my family and to all of the Polish families in my Chicago neighborhood. My parents had this very heavy wicker type basket with a handle that went from one side of the basket to the other. The food that would be placed in the basket were: fresh and smoked kielbasa (Polish Sausage), butter in the shape of a lamb, a circular loaf of fresh bakery rye bread with a purple sticker with a cross on it, a small amount of white and red horseradish, some baked ham, colored Easter eggs, some salt and this was all covered with a white linen cloth. The aroma of the food made it tempting to just reach in the basket and sample just a bit of the food. It took every ounce of my will power to not reach in and help myself to the food.

Then around 4:00 or 5:00 p.m., we would take our basket to the local Catholic church for the blessing. Everyone with a basket for blessing would be ushered into a room, usually in the church basement, and we would wait for the priest. As the priest entered the room dressed in full vestments, carrying a Holy Water pot and sprinkler (aspergillum), the room would become silent. The priest would say a prayer and then walk around the room blessing the baskets with Holy Water. The blessed food would then be eaten for breakfast on Easter morning.

No matter what our traditions may be, I pray that we all keep the resurrection of our Lord front and center in our celebrations. God bless you all and have a blessed Lent and a glorious Easter!




Due to the school schedule and Spring Break, Mount Cross will not be serving a sloppy joe supper during the month of March. The next date of service to PCK will be in April.
