Pastor's Musings & Ponderings

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven..."

Ecclesiastes 3:1 (ESV)

Happy Spring to everyone! We marked this change of season the week of March 19th. So, what does this change of season bring for you?

Does the beginning of spring signal that it is time to start the "Spring Cleaning" around your residence? If so, what does "Spring Cleaning" mean for you? Does it mean that you make your yearly decision about what to do with the stuff you haven't used for the past 5 years? Is this the year that you finally open those dusty boxes or bins that have been packed away in the attic, basement, or garage and see what is actually in them? Of course, if you do that, then you have even more decisions to make. Do you keep it or realize that you have done without the contents for the last 5 years so what good is it to keep around for another few years. It simply means for us to take a look at where our hearts are and does it include loving God with all of who we are? Do we fully embrace whose we are?

Easter Sunday has been celebrated, but that doesn't mean the season of Easter is over. Easter season will be celebrated over the next fifty days through Pentecost Sunday, which falls on May 19th this year. Looking ahead, in addition to Pentecost, Affirmation of Baptism/Confirmation will take place on Sunday, June 9th.


Our sloppy Joe supper for the Payson Community Kids' after school program will be held on Thursday, April 18th, with set-up at 4:15 p.m.

CHANGES AS WE MOVE FORWARD

There is now a new committee to take care of the needs of the log building (aka Conference Center or Building B).

Before COVID there was a paid director, who took care of all the details for outsiders using the building, of which there were multiple paid bookings and the building was also used for our own ministries, *Mount Cross Cares* being one of them. The building was inactive during the time of COVID, thus bookings and church ministry in-person meetings were discontinued. After Mount Cross began using the sanctuary again for worship services and the community started getting organizations back to having regular meetings, we began to get requests for use of the building.

The congregation was not in a position to rehire a director, as times had changed after COVID. We no longer were offering rental of the bunkhouse to groups from the Valley, as the bunkhouse was now being used by the Warming Center. The log building began to be rented out for day usage. Council member, Sharon Vaplon, stepped in to make the log building presentable for the groups that started asking to use it. During the past one and a half years, the closets have all been cleaned out and re-organized and we managed to keep the place clean and presentable for those desiring to use it.







Now it is time to relieve the church office administrator, Lenore White, who had taken on the tasks involved with booking, facilitating, and doing the paperwork necessary for groups to use the premises during the adjustment time after COVID. We have a committee of four members who offered their services to manage the facility for the time being since more and more people are requesting its use.

The volunteer administrators who will see to the showing of the facility, booking, paperwork, etc. will be using an exclusive cell phone number (928-951-0842) and email (mountcrossrental@gmail.com). This information will be provided to clients for the purpose of contacting these administrators. If a Mount Cross committee needs to use the building, please use that number or email to schedule. Thank you to Barb Howe and Christy Zapp for their willingness to take over this duty.

Tending to the building needs and keeping the floors vacuumed will be Wayne Peterson and Barry DeChaine. They could always use volunteers to help keep the floors vacuumed and performing other maintenance work on the building. Please contact them if you have any interest in supporting us at Mount Cross in this way.

Our custodian, Keri Morris, cleans the bathrooms and the kitchen floor weekly, along with wiping down the tables. the rest of her time each week is spent in our current church building.

We have over 100 veterans using the building every Tuesday morning. Several other groups, including Gila County Elections, Life Line Screening, Vitalant Blood Drive, and recently, Right Path Screening use the building on a relatively frequent basis. A new group that will be using the building two times each month is a Christian group, *The Filling Station*. Mount Cross provides complimentary usage to Boy Scouts each week and High Country Gardeners each month. Naturally, our own ministries, such as the Mount Cross Quilters and the Property Committee utilize the building. In addition, there are special events, such as baby showers and other get-togethers in which the building is used.

The Congregation Council, thanks our willing participants on the committee to oversee the usage of the log building moving forward. Please support them by offering to help if they ask and always keep them in your prayers.




The monthly WELCA (Women of the ELCA) Bible study will be held in the Ponderosa Room on Thursday, April 11th, at 10:00 a.m.

The group is currently studying the 13 letters of Paul in the New Testament.


