As of the end of the first quarter of 2022, the expenditures have surpassed the income. Many of the basic costs have increased substantially due to the rocketing prices for products and shipping. Everyone has been effected by the rising prices, and churches are not excluded.

WELCA Bible study


This is a monthly Bible study using the studies found in the WELCA publication "Gather". All women are welcome to attend.




The monthly WELCA (Women of the ELCA) Bible study will be held in the Ponderosa Room on Thursday, May 12th, at 10:00 a.m.
