Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Grace to you and peace, as we find ourselves living in the early days of the Pentecost season: -the long <u>green</u> season on the Church calendar

May I call your attention to three factors with regard to our April 2021 Financial Report.

First, we received \$13,632.06 in Payroll Protection Plan funds; the above amounts listed include the PPP funds. Second, even without the PPP funds, our income exceeded our expenses. Third, the end of April represents 1/3 of the way into 2021 and so by now we should have received 1/3 of our pledged giving. However, a figure that is not displayed on the financial report shows our receipt of pledged giving at the end of April was actually 35%. These are all healthy indicators of our Mount Cross financial picture.

What exciting news we received from the CDC regarding mask wearing and physical distancing guidelines for fully vaccinated people!! We will continue to update you <u>ahead of time</u>, as changes are made to our worship services. Above all, we want to honor the level of comfort and choices that folks will be making regarding mask wearing and not shame one another regarding our personal decisions. The following dates reflect the proposed changes for in-person worship:

<u>As of Sunday May 30th</u>, all fully vaccinated folks had the option of not wearing a mask. The CDC suggests that those not fully vaccinated should still wear a mask. Everyone is on the honor system. We began singing hymns, and we invited worshippers to share "*The Peace*" (using a <u>verbal</u> greeting only) with our "immediate" neighbors.

Sunday, June 6th, the choir will begin singing again and on Sunday, June 13th, we will start using ELW Setting 10 with responses to be sung.

Online worship services will continue to be offered each Sunday at 8:15 a.m.

I was introduced to **CHRIST** - on a personal level - at **Young Life** camp while a junior at Arcadia High School in Phoenix. Amazing three days!! A weekend attending **Lost Canyon** has the potential of changing these young lives forever. All the money raised stays in Payson - where it is needed.


A daily devotional time, led by Pastors Linda and Cliff Hanus, is available online via the church website on Facebook.

Just L.I.F.E (Liberation Is For Everyone)

Just Wisdom

The ladies will meet for the June Bible study in the Ponderosa Room on Thursday, June $10^{\rm th}$ at 10:00 a.m., Bring your own lunch and enjoy a time of fellowship after the study.

This 3 session summer series is inspired by the words of Jesus, *"If the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed"* (John 8:36) and *"I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."* (John 10:10) Through these statements, Jesus gives us full life and freedom to pursue justice. God desires justice for ALL of his children and ALL of creation. However, due to our human nature, we do not automatically become more just...we must work to achieve justice.

This first session, *Just Wisdom*, will delve into how our hearts and minds can be opened by God to a spiritual understanding. *Just Wisdom* comes from our reverence to God's awesomeness. The key verse for this session is Proverbs 9:10, *"The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom."* June's study will focus on Wisdom, also known as *"Sophia"* (Greek word for divine Wisdom personified), and primarily on the eighth and ninth chapters of Proverbs.



We had an in-person meeting on May 13, 2021, which was well attended and a happy event. The study was about intergenerational relationships: are we engaged in them and how do we interact with older and younger folk? Since our group is mostly older we only have one younger person, Cyndi Plantz, thus we must look outward to achieve those contacts. I would challenge all of you to seek relationships with younger people, invite them to join in fun events, and also invite them to come to church.

In the past few months we have become more insular than ever. Now it is time to get out there, make the world a better place through simple friendships, a smile, a laugh, and share a bit of joy to others. Our church is mostly older folk who are one big family. That is something to celebrate and we do a good job of that at times. Now let's round out our family circle to include various ages as a part of our faith family.

Each year a new challenge is critical for our ongoing ability to keep our brains working, our bodies working and our hearts showing Jesus love. His simple request to "Love One Another" is so easy to do. After looking at our town, our state, our country, and how at present it is so basically intolerant of just about anything, we have become a thin skinned, over-reacting group of folk who need to once again do what Christ said, "Love One Another." Maybe Mount Cross can start a trend.
