How To Access Mount Cross Services Online



Are you frustrated trying to access Mount Cross services online? Do you want to share your worship time with your friends or relatives? Can't make it to service on Sunday? Here are two options to successfully reach the destination.

- Just go to the church website: www.mountcross.org, scroll down on the homepage until you find the "Facebook Livestream" button and click on it. A window will pop up asking you to sign in. You don't have to create a Facebook account if you don't have one. Just click the X in the corner of that box. From there, you can click on the video tab at the top of the church Facebook page and then select the service you would like to view.
- 2. You can also find the services by going out on YouTube and typing Payson Mount Cross in the YouTube search bar. Mount Cross services will show and you can select the service of your choice.



Complete Cardiovascular Ultrasound

- Heart Ultrasound Screening: Scans the heart valves, measures systolic function, the motility of the left ventricle, the ejection fraction and the dimensions of the atrium and ventricles.
- Atrial Fibrillation Screening: Atrial fibrillation is a heart rhythm problem found in almost one in every 150 people, causing palpitations, shortness of breath, fatigue and risk of stroke.
- Carotid Artery Screening: Stroke is the most common cause of long term care admissions in the US. This screening will show your level of plaque build up in the carotid
- Thyroid Ultrasound Screening: Scans for cysts, nodules and other abnormalities that may indicate signs of thyroid disease.
- Peripheral Arterial Disease (PAD): Peripheral arterial disease (PAD) is a condition where blood circulation is restricted. It affects over 8 million Americans. Scans for signs of circulatory problems in the lower extremities.

- Abdominal Aorta Screening: Aneurysms form as a result of weakening in the arterial wall. Scans for aneurysms and other abnormalities.

- Gallbladder Screening: Scans for stones, sludge, wall thickening and other abnormalities.
- Pancreas Screening: An important organ providing essential hormones and digestive enzymes. This screening detects small lesions, abnormalities and other signs of disease.
- Spleen Screening: This organ is essential in regard to red blood cells and the immune system. This screening detects an enlarged spleen and additional signs of disease.






The monthly WELCA (Women of the ELCA) Bible study will be held in the Ponderosa Room on Thursday, July 11th, at 10:00 a.m.

The second session is entitled *"After Certainty: Community."* When certainty in faith becomes the responsibility of the individual, this can isolate us from God and from community. The reformer Martin Luther's own failures of certainty led him to return to passages in the gospels and epistles that proclaimed salvation, not as a reward for our certainty, but as a gift granted in and through community. In this second session, we consider how some of the pivotal texts of the Lutheran Reformation changed the church and the world.



GRAND CANYON SYNOD ASSEMBLY 2024

The Grand Canyon Synod Assembly 2024 was held Thursday through Saturday, **June 13-15**, 2024, at Love of Christ Lutheran Church in Mesa. The theme this year was *"Embody the Word."*

"For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ." - 1 Corinthians 12:12

Pastor Carl & Jo Sirotzki and Barb Howe attended the 2024 Synod Assembly and thank the congregation for their blessings and generosity in making it possible for them to attend.

All sessions of the assembly are available to watch on the Love of Christ Lutheran's Facebook page. All links can be found on the Grand Canyon Synod Assembly 2024 web page.

Thursday night the Mount Cross delegates registered and then walked around and looked at the various displays and exhibition tables, picking up lots of pamphlets and brochures regarding exciting programs available to us.

Friday morning the session was called to order, followed immediately by an introduction by the Bishop, and first ballot vote.

In the report of the First Ballot for Bishop of the Grand Canyon Synod, Bishop Deborah Hutterer was reelected, receiving the necessary 75% of votes on the first ballot. A total of 281 votes were cast, with 267 recognized as legal votes. Bishop Hutterer received 201 votes from the synod community.

Throughout the sessions, votes occurred for the selection of Synod Council members, committee members, and voting members to attend the 2025 Church-wide Assembly in Phoenix, Arizona. We had several business/plenary sessions throughout the day, special guest speakers, Bible study, worship, and a variety of workshops to attend. We chose to attend workshops on:

- Telling Your (Faith) Story by Pr. Tina Mills
- The Station Coffee Co. in Florence, AZ, which started in 2021 by members of Crossroads Lutheran Church in Florence.

We were also very well fed with not only lunch and dinner, but lots and lots of sweet treats throughout the day along with plenty of water and coffee.

Saturday morning began with synod business, special guest speakers, celebrations, and Synod Council reports followed by worship, closing of the assembly, lunch, and a special Diakonia graduation was held after lunch.

A Certificate of Attendance was presented to Mount Cross at the Assembly, which Barb Howe showed to the congregation at the service on Sunday, June 23rd.
