Pastor's Ponderings

"Be it ever so humble, there's no place like home," as the old adage in John Howard Payne's poem goes. Or as Dorothy Gale in the "Wizard of Oz" declares, as she clicks the heels of her red ruby slippers three times, "There's no place like home."


