

Dan Albertson was ordained a Presbyterian Pastor in December of 1997 and served as the Senior pastor for a church with 2,000 congregants. He was integral in efforts to both successfully grow the church by 500 members and increase charitable giving by more than 75% in three years.



Importantly, Dan's focus these past years has been his outreach Ministry to the homeless population in Chandler

and greater phoenix, through the I-HELP Program at the Chandler Christian Community Center. Within one month of their participation in the program, more than 70% of the homeless clients served through this Ministry have attained meaningful employment and 25% of the clients have secured decent, affordable housing.

Dan is the Past-President of the San Tan Crown Rotary Club, Past Co-Chair and Past Bank President of the Rotary International Micro-Credit Banking in Mexico which educates and mentors persons of low, or no income, in Latin America with the fundamentals necessary to succeed with their business start-ups.

Dan Successfully completed a two-year term as a designated pastor at Southminster Presbyterian Church Phoenix, AZ in September 2019. During that period Membership increased by over 30%, attendance increased and giving increased by 23%

Dan is a commissioner at the Synod of the Southwest, a member of the Finance and Property committees at the Synod of the Southwest, Member of Operations committee at the Grand Canyon Presbytery and the Moderator of Congregations Resource Team at the Grand Canyon Presbytery.

In December 2020 Dan completed the 6-month Navajo and Tohono O'odham Nations Relief Food Boxes Project. He managed the program and coordinated over 100 volunteers to make 1,200 food boxes in five days each month.

Dan is a proud father of three adult children: Emmanuel, Victor and Grace. Dan is currently between Calls. It's our pleasure to welcome Pastor Dan Albertson to our pulpit for the first three Sundays of August.





Three out of the first six months of the year the income toward the mortgage exceeded the amount needed for the monthly payment; the other three months fell short of the monthly payment by minimal amounts, thus the months with extra amounts more than covered the months that were shy.

Mid-year numbers show both expenditures and income as below the budget. On average the expenses exceed the income by approximately \$1,150.00 per month. In looking at the general picture, Mount Cross is doing well. Thanks continues to be given to those who faithfully bless Mount Cross with their financial support.




The monthly WELCA (Women of the ELCA) Bible study will be held in the Ponderosa Room on Thursday, August 11th, at 10:00 a.m.

Bible studies from *Gather* magazine are used. During the summer months, the Bible study focuses on being "*Crafted in Christ*" and will use the concept of quilting as a medium to discuss rest, renewal, and the Christian community. So, quilters...there is still time for you to join the study!

There were 82 donors that registered to donate; ten donors were deferred. Three donors that did not qualify due to 'quantity not sufficient' (this is usually due to the blood clotting prior to the blood donation being completed). We collected 63 units of whole blood. Six donors that provided power red cells and we collected 11 red cells from those donors. There were a total of 69 successful procedures!!!! The lives of 200 patients in need could be impacted by these efforts!!!

Peace to This House (Luke 10)

What a wonderful way to greet someone. Try bringing *"peace to <u>your</u> house"* (a semi-quote). We are besieged with ads on television, both hate-filled and some you have to wonder why they are on daytime television. Then we see people acting foolish or angry or violent and we wonder why? We see a severe lack of civility, and we see no respect for tradition or each other. I wonder how far we have come from living as representatives of Christ in loving one another as we love ourselves.

As I reviewed the WELCA lesson for July and August, it used a quilt analogy as a vehicle for our lesson. The lesson also included pruning a plant to rid it of dead branches. For quilting, traditional quilts were made from scraps of cloth, carefully cut, stitched, and at the end of the process, a pattern was developed that would be beautiful. Slave women made crazy quilts, a tradition that has continued in Oakland, CA, as well as in the South. Never waste anything was the impetus behind crazy quilts. Today's women or men make quilts that are complex, with themes, or cloth sculpturing, pieces of art. New fabric is used most often, with vibrant colors and intricate designs. The point is to create something out of what is disparate parts.

Plants are pruned to shapes or to encourage growth, or fruit. So how does this relate to us? We are in the middle of considerable change. We also are in need of trimming or pruning some of our ways to make our Christ walk stronger. We have a path to keep tradition alive, but maybe with a new pattern to revitalize our walk. We have future and current designs to build on the traditional and overall keep Christ as foremost in our lives.

As the Women of the ELCA there are things we can do to keep our focus on the life that God has given us. Less time spent in feeling sorry for ourselves, less time spent is complaining, and more time spent in sharing God's love with others, as examples, as faith builders, and as God's hands here on earth will give you joy and purpose. If you do not complain, you have peace in your heart. If you live a life as an example of Jesus' teachings, you share kindness. If you live as God's helper on this earth, you will find a sense of peace and joy at all times. *May peace be brought to your house.*
