Ponderings

The concept of loving one another, without judgement, without caution, without fear of what others may think of us should be a basic part of our Christian principles. Acts of love are both small and very large. Just doing the right thing, as a way of life, is an example. Also, leading others to do the right thing can be a big example.

Jesus led the world with humility and grace. He knows that we are not perfect and that we could fail to succeed, but each time we would need to touch base with God, get our focus on God, and live with love for others as well as ourselves. During the WELCA Bible study in July, we talked about the role women have traditionally had of putting others before ourselves, often forgetting that we need to be whole in order to be a good role model. The "Carrie Nations" and the "Me Toos" of our culture, as well as many others, have roared for women's rights. Stop and think about the dignity of those women who chose to show love toward others...the "Clara Bartons" and the "Corrie Ten Booms" who led with love, strength, and purpose, without raising the shackles of all, but simply got the job done. At the wedding at Cana, Jesus' mother, Mary, voiced herself and in a motherly manner gave her son a mother's direction, with an understanding that God's will would be done. The interesting part of this is that Jesus reacted like any son by stating, "Woman, this is not our concern." It is a very human interchange that gives our Savior a very real human touch.

A different example, showing leading with God in command, is of George Washington leading with strength and vision. As he led us through the Revolutionary War, there were times when prayer and listening to God was the only way he could remain focused on the battle for freedom and to develop our country on a path that allows *all* a right to have a voice in our destiny. The converse side is that Washington had humility. When the war was over, he went home...only to be called back to be President. He again showed humility by serving only two terms, and then once again going home to his farm and family. He was a man who understood how power can corrupt, but stayed in touch with God, who gives wisdom and strength.

Let these people in history, who have illustrated how to lead with humility, provide the encouragement for us to be bold in showing Christ's love through our actions.

Mount Cross Financial Report (January – June 2023)



2023 Approved Budget	\$326,229.00
Income	\$126,174.00 (38.67% of 2023 budget)
Expenditures	\$104,471.00 (32.00% of 2023 budget)

Please note: above amounts are rounded to the nearest dollar.

June has brought about a few expenses that were expected, but was hoped could be delayed. Due to the rains earlier this year and leakage, the old church roof was re-shingled. Another issue which intermittently popped up was a fire alarm squealing that could be heard in the sanctuary. The security company was scheduled in July to determine the source of the squealing. It was evidently a ground wire that was broken. The repair cost was fairly steep.

Currently, the Granite Dells road on the south side of the church property is being worked on by the Town of Payson. This is an unexpected blessing, as the town will continue the sidewalk and Mount Cross will not have to pay for it, which was an expenditure that Mount Cross was supposed to cover within a couple of years after the new church was opened. As always, a thank you to those who faithfully support Mount Cross with their contributions is in order.




The monthly WELCA (Women of the ELCA) Bible study will be held in the Ponderosa Room on Thursday, August 10th, at 10:00 a.m.
