

My own reading of the apocrypha texts, starting with Esther, the Greek translation, the story goes on with a portion of Chapter 11, and also chapter 12. That is the end of addition A. It then it starts with the left out portions of Chapter 1 through 10 and a postscript of Chapter 11. It includes Esther's prayer. As a result, I had to re-read Esther from the Old Testament to refresh my memory of the details and her courage. What a brave woman!

At our Bible study in July we had a great discussion of Jesus' teaching of love and compassion and how community involves love, curiosity, and compassion. Since the article was focused on building community, not dividing it, there was a comment that really struck me...that with a building of community, we must look at curiosity, build knowledge and compassion, and again, be open to curiosity. The study was written by a woman pastor who is based in Palestine. I had the pleasure of spending most of a day with her, as being two in the lobby of the convention hall who had allergies to perfume and smoke. She is one of the most loving, caring people that has crossed my life.

Working so much in community activities, not political, but with caring types of activities, I see many moments of that compassion extended towards others. Each day love shows with actions, smiles, help and care.

Here at Mount Cross a fine example was the recent giving of socks and underwear to Kaitie's Closet. I looked at the basket and it was like a gift from God. Thank you all for those blessings. With the very generous gifts from our congregation, it freed up money to buy more shoes for the children, and also some new clothes to go along with the gently used ones we glean from the thrift stores. So on the behalf of Kaitie's Closet, we thank you from the bottom of our hearts.




The monthly WELCA (Women of the ELCA) Bible study will be held in the Ponderosa Room on Thursday, August 8th, at 10:00 a.m.

The third session is entitled "After Certainty: Compassion." When certainty becomes judgmentalism, it contributes to divisions between people and within communities. The teachings of Jesus and the pastoral writings of the apostle Paul sometimes urge people to choose compassion over correctness — a model that can offer Christians guidance.
