# Pastor's Musings & Ponderings

"Rejoice in the Lord always, again I will say, rejoice."

(ESV, Philippians 4:4)

Although it has only been a couple of weeks since we celebrated Easter, we will remain in the Easter season until Pentecost which is on June 8<sup>th</sup>. So what does it mean that we are in the Easter season?

The church has long considered that our Lord's resurrection is far too significant of an event to be limited to just one day. Easter Day is both the cumulation of the Three Days (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Vigil) and the beginning of Easter, which is celebrated over the fifty days from Easter Sunday through Pentecost, the fiftieth day. It is on Pentecost that we are reminded of Jesus' resurrection promise of the coming of the Holy Spirit being fulfilled. Throughout the Easter season, the paraments and vestments will stay white. The Paschal Candle will be lit before every service and will remain near the altar until Pentecost when it will be returned to near the Baptismal Font. It is important for us to remember that on every Sunday, especially Easter Sunday, we proclaim the message of salvation as we join together to Jesus Christ and one another in Holy Eucharist.

During these fifty days, there will be a New Member Orientation at a date to be determined in May. If you are interested in becoming a member of Mount Cross or would simply like to find out more about Mount Cross, please let Lenore or me know.

This past Easter Sunday also marked the displaying of the mosaic cross made with the broken plates that so many of you brought in. I am so appreciative of the skill that went into making the wooden cross and all who assembled the broken pieces into a very beautiful cross. This was truly a labor of love for everyone involved. If you haven't had the opportunity to view the cross up close, I encourage you to do so at your earliest convenience.

Please remember that if you would like a visit or know someone who would like a visit, please let me know.




