Pastor's Musings & Ponderings

"And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." Romans 8:28 (NIV)

This verse from Romans is probably one of the most quoted verses among Christians. Likewise, it is also one of the most misunderstood verses in the Bible among Christians. There are a number of Christians who interpret this verse to mean that God will make everything right...according to my wishes and wants. However, Paul is addressing something that many of us don't like to talk about...suffering.

Paul reminds us that in our hardships, our times of difficulty and even those times that just don't go our way, God continues to work in each of us. We may not see it, feel it or taste it, but God is always working in us. God doesn't ignore our sufferings. That doesn't mean we can go around and do whatever we want and expect that it's okay with God (can you say cheap grace?). Paul is reminding the Jews, Gentiles and us today, that no matter the difficulty or discouragement we face, God continues to lovingly work in us.

I think this verse from Romans flows right into the theme of this year's Grand Canyon Synod Assembly, "Build Up The Body." This theme is grounded in Ephesians 4:12-13, calling us to equip one another for ministry and grow into the full stature of Christ. Synod assemblies are always a great time to catch up with friends and colleagues from other conferences and learn the latest of synod happenings. This year, the assembly was more condensed than others I had attended, but it did not lack importance or worshipping time together. Jo and Carrie will have already presented a report at the service on June 29th on this year's Synod Assembly.

"Build Up The Body" also applies to the five new members that were welcomed into our congregation in June. We are so blessed and excited to have these sisters and brothers with us! Hopefully, we will be able to equip you for ministry, help and support you as we all grow into the full stature of Christ.



Seekers of Truth is a small Bible study and fellowship group for women and men, which is held on the third Thursday of each month in the conference room at 10:00 a.m. July 17th is the date for this month's meeting.

The group is currently studying the parables of Jesus. At the July meeting, the group will be covering the parables of the Kingdom: The Seed and the Soil (Matthew 13: 1-23), the Work of the Enemy (Matthew 13: 24-43), People of the Kingdom (Matthew 13: 44-46), and God's Kingdom (Matthew 13: 47-52).

On Sunday, June 22nd, the congregation approved the renting of our facilities to Maison Schoolhouse for a K-12 one room schoolhouse. The rental agreement has been signed and notarized. The lease starts on July 1, 2025 for a 12 full months. Currently, the school has 24 students and are planning to start instruction on July 28, 2025.

The school schedule will be the same as the Payson public school calendar. Classes will be in session from 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

The adult educator hours are 7:00 a.m.–5:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Adult presence in the sanctuary concludes at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday to allow for choir and bell practice that evening. The students will use the playground, basketball court, and open area west of the sanctuary during recess, although only one area at a time.

While classes are in session, we will have limited access to the inside rented facilities, including the sanctuary, library, kitchen, and bathrooms. I am hopeful that having school in our facilities will foster young families to join our congregation and will give the community greater visibility to our church.

The Payson Community Kids after school program to support Payson children with an opportunity to do their homework, play together and have a meal before they went home began in the early 2000's. A former member, Rene Apps, started the monthly Sloppy Joe's supper sponsored by Mount Cross. When Rene moved to the Valley in 2017, Sharon Vaplon stepped in as coordinator on behalf of Mount Cross.

Over the years members gave money to a dedicated fund to provide the food for the suppers. Thanks to many of the generous volunteers who served the supper, we did not use the donations and they accumulated to \$1190 in the designated fund.

Within the past year, PCK closed their doors due to various administrative issues. They have worked hard in the past months to get their program back up and running with a summer program and they will begin full-time when the new school year starts at the end of July. The Mount Cross members who have been doing the suppers in the past couple of years we're getting tired out and this seemed like a good time for us to bow out.

The council approved a motion to send a check to PCK for \$1190 and designated to go for meals. The new coordinators have several local businesses that will give them meals for cost, and this money will be used during the upcoming school year in that way.
