The academy is committed to providing a well-rounded education to the children of Bandarjhud, a small village near Dehradun.

A Legacy of Learning and Service

As a part of The Doon School Old Boys' Society's Impact Project, Arthur Foot Academy hosted the bi-annual My Good School Retreat in Bandarjhud—a quiet, picturesque village near Dehradun, Uttarakhand. This initiative is a heartfelt tribute by alumni of The Doon School to their first Headmaster, Arthur E. Foot, whose legacy continues to inspire education with purpose and compassion. The retreat serves as a living embodiment of the #JoyOfGiving, bringing together educators, students, and changemakers to create a ripple effect of positive change in rural education.

Youth Engaging Society through the 4S Model

At the heart of the retreat was the philosophy of Education = 4S: Service, Skill, Sport, and Study. This immersive experience helped young people engage in real-time learning—leading community initiatives, participating in sports, developing practical life skills, and reflecting on their academic knowledge in action. The integration of these four pillars demonstrated how holistic education can transform rural schools like AFA into hubs of vibrant, student-led learning.



Peer Learning and Educator Collaboration

One of the most beautiful aspects of the retreat was the peer-to-peer learning. Students from different schools taught and inspired each other, while teachers exchanged ideas, methods, and encouragement. For AFA teachers, this was a rare chance to receive hands-on support, training, and mentorship from educators across the GSA network—making it a crucial point of professional development.



Bridging Two Indias

The retreat was a powerful reminder of the contrast and connection between two Indias—one racing toward the moon, and another where children just 25 kilometers from the Delhi-Dehradun Expressway had never visited the city of Dehradun. For the first time, AFA students visited the iconic Doon School, a landmark moment that represented hope, pride, and progress. This visit was more than a trip—it was a step toward bridging the opportunity gap and a reminder of how far we can go with collective effort.

While it remains challenging to bring rural schools like AFA entirely into the mainstream, My Good School Retreat shows that it's entirely possible to bring the best of the mainstream to them. The exposure, confidence, and community spirit fostered during this retreat have already created lasting impact. Reading and Reflecting Together

- Book in Focus: The current focus of our teacher reading circle is "Is Your Child Ready to Face the World?" by Dr. Anupam Sibal (Hindi edition).
- Each week, teachers gather to read, reflect, and discuss key values from the book, which inspires personal growth and practical teaching ideas.
- This reading practice has encouraged teachers to reflect more deeply on the emotional, ethical, and social needs of their students.



A Culture of Lifelong Learning

At Arthur Foot Academy, we believe that the growth of a school depends on the growth of its teachers. Over the past six months, continuous professional development (CPD) has become a central pillar of our transformation. - From small greetings to full sentences, teachers are steadily becoming more comfortable and fluent, encouraging students to do the same.

From Values to Practice

- The professional development process isn't just about reading or training—it's about living the values.
- Teachers are now embedding core values such as respect, empathy, integrity, and perseverance into their classroom activities and student interactions.

Future Focus: Training & Mentorship

- Sunday School: We have now implemented a weekly Sunday reading session of "Is Your Child Ready to Face the World?" (Hindi edition), where teachers engage in collective reflection and discussions to internalize values and share classroom applications.

Honouring Arthur Foot's Vision

In deep recognition of their founding Headmaster's vision, a group of passionate and service-driven alumni, led by Mr. Asad Khan, came together to bring that spirit to life through the creation of the Arthur Foot Academy. Located in Bandarjhud, a humble village near Dehradun, the academy represents a new chapter in equitable education, driven by values, opportunity, and access.

Dental Camp Spreading Smiles

Introduction

In the heart of the forests near Rajaji National Park, the Van Gujjar communities have lived close to nature for generations. However, in these remote regions, oral health has long been neglected — with many adults losing most of their teeth by their 30s.

Impact on the Community

- Over 100 students received free oral check-ups.
- Children were introduced to the basics of dental care through fun, engaging sessions.
- Teachers and parents from nearby villages also attended awareness workshops.
- Future Action: A follow-up treatment camp is planned to ensure continued care and build long-term healthy habits.

The Initiative

Partnering with MUSE, Maee (a local NGO), and the Nature Science Initiative, Arthur Foot Academy welcomed a dedicated team of health professionals for a preliminary oral health assessment and education drive.

This was a crucial first step, raising awareness about dental hygiene practices that can prevent major health issues.

This camp goes beyond healthcare. It reflects AFA's commitment to serving the broader community by integrating health, education, and social responsibility — embodying the true spirit of #JoyOfGiving.









MY GOOD SCHOOL RETREAT 2025 The YES Way

Walking Together, Learning Together

In April 2025, Arthur Foot Academy proudly hosted the second edition of the My Good School Retreat, a unique and immersive educational experience that brought together students and educators from across the Good Schools Alliance. The retreat kicked off with a symbolic and meaningful journey — participants walked from the Khan Farm to the school, following the path of the rising sun. This reflective walk helped visitors connect deeply with the local environment and observe the surrounding community firsthand

Day of Service and Skills Sharing

On the second day, the focus shifted to Service and Skill. Visiting students led interactive sessions and creative workshops with AFA students—ranging from music and dance to art, storytelling, and games. The sessions were designed to encourage self–expression, curiosity, and joy. AFA students got to learn new skills, and in return, shared their local knowledge and culture, creating a powerful exchange of learning.

These sessions helped AFA teachers gain practical strategies and new perspectives, enhancing their classroom effectiveness. The interaction between educators also fostered strong relationships, opening doors to continued mentorship and collaboration.

Shared Learning Beyond the School

Some of the AFA teachers also joined activities back at Khan Farm, participating in outdoor learning sessions, discussions on education trends, and reflective circles. This gave them space to recharge, reflect, and reconnect with their own learning journey—making the retreat not just beneficial for students, but transformational for educators as well.


