Arthur Howard, 31, Is Drowning Victim as Canoe Overturned

RESCUE ATTEMPTED

MRS. GREY OWL IN VALIANT EFFORTS: U.S. VISITORS . .. WITNESS FATALITY

Special to the Star-Phoenix WASKESIU LAKE, Sept. 1. Park Warden Arthur Howard, 31, popular son of Mr. and Mrs. A. C. Howard of Prince Albert, drowned in Crean Lake late this afternoon when a canoe in which he was riding with Mrs. Grey Owl, wife of the noted Indian lecturer and naturalist, capsized about 50 yards from Is Planned shore. The body was recovered tonight.

GOES BACK TO HELP


When the canoe capsized Howard clung to one end while Mrs. Grey Owl swam to shore where she took off a heavy leather jacket and then returned to the warden's assistance but in the meantime the canoe had overturned again as Howard attempted to climb on tor of the boat and, losing his grip, was unable to regain the canoe.
Mrs. Grey Owl, herself a noted

naturalist and prospector, although hampered with heavy boots and clothing, heroically did all she could to rescue Howard but was unable to dive deep enough and was soon

overcome with fatigue.

Howard had accompanied Professor Cockerell, eminent lecturer on natural history of the University of Colorado, Boulder, Colo., and Mrs. Cockerell to Crean Lake as guide and companion. They had been joined by Mrs. Grey Owl and the accident occurred while the American visitors were taking moving pictures about 100 yards from the waterline.

Howard and Mrs. Grey Owl were in the canoe and attempted to change positions in the boat. They leaned too heavily to one side and the canoe upset.
