(For the conduct of competitions at QCAS affiliated Queensland Agricultural Shows)

Subject to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Associations Inc. and the Fraser Coast Agriculture Show Society Inc., the following General Regulations shall apply.

GENERAL REGULATIONS AND ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES

- 1 Judging will be performed by a Judge or panel of Judges appointed by the Fraser Coast Agriculture Show Society Inc.
- The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc. and the Fraser Coast Agriculture Show Society Inc. in addition to the Special Regulations which appear in this schedule. Copies of the Rules and By-Laws may be obtained upon application to the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies or the Fraser Coast Agriculture Show Society Inc.
- 3 No refunds will be made after close of entry.
- THE FRASER COAST AGRICULTURE SHOW SOCIETY INC IS OPERATING UNDER THE QUEENSLAND AGRICULTURAL SHOWS & SHOWGROUNDS COVD SAFE PLAN. You must adhere to COVID safe key principles that apply to Fraser Coast Showgrounds and the Fraser Coast Show 2021.

NOTICE TO INTENDING EXHIBITORS

- 6 Entries for the upcoming Fraser Coast Agriculture Show can be made as described for each section in this schedule. Entries submitted other than on the correct form will be returned to the Exhibitor and, unless all requirements are complied with, and the forms returned to the Fraser Coast Agriculture Show office by completion of business on the closing date, as shown in this Schedule, they will not be considered.
- 7 Notwithstanding the provisions of General Regulation 6, late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Section Chief Steward.
- 8 Entries are accepted subject to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association, in addition to any Special Regulations, which appear in the Associations Schedule. All completed Entry Forms remain the property of the Fraser Coast Agriculture Show Society Inc. and are to be returned to the Fraser Coast Agriculture Show Society Inc. office after the Show for further office procedures as required.
- 9 Exhibitors whose entries have not been accepted shall be advised accordingly and entry fees refunded.
- The exhibitor irrevocably consents to the Association publishing or reproducing in any manner whatsoever any particulars or information in relation to their exhibits; the publication or reproduction may be in a printed form or visual image through electronic means and/or on the internet.

PRIVACY STATEMENT

The information provided by Exhibitors is used by the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Associations Inc. and the Fraser Coast Agriculture Show Society Inc. to organise, process and conduct competitions at the Fraser Coast Agriculture Show. By entering such competitions, you consent to your personal information being used for this purpose including this information being made available to sponsors, breed Associations, the media, the public, promotional purposes, archival purposes, published in publications and could be made available to other third parties for the purpose of promoting the Queensland Agricultural Show Movement, or as otherwise required by law. Exhibitors have a right of access to and alteration of personal information concerning themselves in terms of the Privacy Act. WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY

- All Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc. affiliated Associations Showground's are designated workplaces within the meaning of the Workplace Health and Safety Act 2011 and exhibitors / competitors are required to ensure that they and all persons under their direction or control, including their contractors or subcontractors, comply with all requirements of the Act. The Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Associations Inc. holds each exhibitor responsible to discharge its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work during occupation by the exhibitor/competitor of any area of the affiliated Agricultural Associations Showground's.
- 17 Each exhibitor/competitor will assess the risk to themselves, staff, volunteers, family, other exhibitors, Agricultural Society staff, show visitors, children and any person foreseeably affected by the presentation of their exhibit.
- Risks identified by exhibitors/competitors will be eliminated or controlled by the exhibitor/competitor and particular attention will be paid to ensuring public safety and safety of other exhibitors/competitors.
- 19 Exhibits will only be held and handled by competent persons whose experience is known to the Exhibitor/Competitor.
- A "No Smoking Policy" will be strictly adhered to by exhibitors/competitors. Smoking areas are marked in "ORANGE MARKINGS/FLAGS" which are located near the Cane & Cattleman's Bar & Witches Hat Bar. No food or drink is allowed in the smoking area. The exhibitors/competitors are advised that the use of Primus stoves, any heating or lighting appliances of a like character, or any naked light, is strictly prohibited in pavilions.
- 21 Any exhibitors/competitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showground's will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with residual current protection and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected by a licensed electrical contractor and currently tagged. The use of double adaptors is prohibited and all power boards must also be tested and tagged.
- 22 All exhibitors/competitors will comply with the requirements of the Act and its Regulations and Standards in every other respect. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors/competitors and the general public. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of noncompliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors/competitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Associations Inc. affiliated Shows.

PRIZES AND GST

- 31 The Australian Taxation Office has deemed that GST is payable on prizes if an Exhibitor is registered for GST and enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterorise.
- 32 The information an Exhibitor provides on the Application for Entry determines whether GST is applicable.
- 33 Any prize stated in this Schedule does not include GST.
- 34 GST will not apply:
 - (a) If an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as a hobby or private recreational pursuit; or
 - (b) If an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, but the Exhibitor is NOT REGISTERED for GST.
 - (c) If an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor is not entitled to an ABN as the business or enterprise is not operating in Australia.
- 35 GST will apply if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, and the Exhibitor is REGISTERED for GST.

- **5.** A copy of your entry form must be printed out and a copy submitted to the Woodcraft Pavilion between 12.00pm and 5.00pm Friday 7 May 2021, otherwise contact the Chief Steward for other arrangements.
- **4.** Office Hours are 9.00am to 3.00pm, Monday to Thursday. All entries to be received by **Thursday 6 May 2021 by 3.00pm**.
- 5. The entire work must have been completed by the entrant in the last twelve months.
- 6. Exhibitor number will be allocated on delivery of the exhibit.
- 7. Only one entry per Class per Person is permitted. Items eligible for entry in one Class may not be entered in another Class.
- 8. Novice Classes are restricted to persons under the age of 16 years, and any person over 16 years who has never won a first prize in any open woodcraft competition or has competed for no more than three years in the Novice Section.
- 9. Exhibits must remain on display from 9.00am Thursday 20 May 2021 until 9.00pm Friday 21 May 2021. Entries can be collected between 8.00am and 9.00am Saturday 22 May 2021 or by other arrangement with the Chief Steward.
- 10. Classes 1-6 are to be hand turned work only and with no embellishments. Any clear finish, any type of wood (embellishment includes: texturing pyrography colouring, carving and ornamental turning etc)
- **11.** Entries which have been oiled must have a means provided to attach a sticker or looped tag.

- 12. Items produced on CNC, copying apparatus or other robotic equipment will not be eligible for entry in any class.
- 13. Entries may have timber species on the piece but no other identification.
- 14. Footprint of an item means it must occupy a square or rectangular area no greater than the nominated size.
- 15. All items will be judged in their entirety. The Judge's decision is final.

OPEN CLASSES

27001 – A turned natural edge bowl, with or without bark, to 350mm in diameter from a single piece of wood. The edge is either the rim or the outer edge of the bowl. Any clear finish.

27002 – A turned plate, platter or bowl to 350mm in diameter, machined all over from a single piece of wood. Any clear finish

27003 – A turned weed pot or bud vase to 200mm high, maximum hole size 16mm, from a single piece of wood. Any clear finish.

27004 – A turned flower vase, minimum hole size 20mm from a single piece of wood. Any clear finish.

27005 – A turned lidded container to 300mm in diameter. Any wood. Threaded lids permitted. Article is to be finished inside and outside. Any clear finish.

27006 – A turned pair of matching objects from the same wood type, with identical size and shape. Wood must be the predominant visible material with a clear finish.

27007 – An embellished bowl, platter or vase to fit into 350mm x 350mm footprint x 400mm high. Wood must be the predominant visible material. Any finish. (Embellishment includes: texturing, pyrography, colouring, carving, cutting and reassembly and ornamental turning, etc.)

27008 – A laminated \underline{or} segmented item to 350mm x 350mm footprint x 400mm high. Any wood or combination of woods with laminating \underline{or} segmenting done by the entrant. Any clear finish.

27009 – A scroll sawn item (excluding clocks) to have a maximum footprint 1m x 500mm x 500mm high. Any wood or wood product. Any clear finish.

27010 – An intarsia item. To have a maximum footprint 1m x 500mm x 500mm with any wood or wood product backing. Any finish.

- **27011** Handcrafted Clock less than 500mm high. Maximum footprint 500mm x 250mm. Any finish, excluding coloured paint.
- **27012** A handcrafted clock to a maximum height of 2.2m. Maximum footprint 500mm x 500mm. Case to be of wood or wood product. Any finish, excluding coloured paint.
- **27013** A miniature that will fit into a space of 50mm x 50mm x 50mm. Wood must be the predominant visible material. Any finish, excluding coloured paint.
- **27014** A handcrafted item (including toys and models). Maximum footprint 1m x 500mm and maximum height of 500mm. Wood must be the predominant material. Any finish including paint.
- **27015** A box handcrafted from wood. Maximum footprint 1m x 500mm and maximum height of 500mm. To be mainly of wood, but may incorporate other materials. Any clear finish.
- **27016** A single <u>wooden</u> item <u>including</u> furniture, indoor or outdoor. Maximum footprint 1m x 500mm and maximum height of 1.5m. To be mainly of wood or wood product but may incorporate other materials. Wood must be the predominant visible material. Any finish, <u>excluding coloured paint</u>.
- **27017** A handcrafted item (including standard lamps, musical instruments, etc), **displaying two distinct forms of woodcraft** of your choice. Wood must be the predominant material. Maximum footprint 500mm x 1m. Maximum height of 1.5m. Any finish, <u>excluding coloured paint</u>.
- **27018** A carved wooden item. Maximum footprint 500mm x 500mm with a maximum height of 1.5m. Any finish.
- **27019** A single item featuring artistic design crafted using woodworking tools. Maximum footprint 500mm x 500mm. Maximum height 500mm. Material is to be mainly a nonmetallic medium to suit the design.
- **27020** Pyrography item executed on a flat piece of wood featuring landscapes, portraits or scenes. Maximum footprint 500mm x 500mm. Maximum thickness of 60mm. Any clear finish.
- **27021** A pyrography article, other than item 20. Maximum footprint 1m x 500mm. Maximum height of 500mm on wood. Any clear finish.

NOVICE CLASSES

27022 – A turned item from any wood. Any clear finish. Maximum diameter 400mm and maximum height 1.5m.

27023 – Any other woodwork item, Maximum footprint 1m x 500mm. Maximum height of 1m. Item to be mainly of wood, but may incorporate other materials. Wood must be the predominant visible material. Any finish, <u>excluding coloured paint</u>.

27024 – Fraser Coast Agriculture Show Theme: Horses to Horsepower. Maximum footprint 500mm x 500mm. Maximum height of 1m.
