Ensembles

Marching Band and Color Guard

The marching band is the most active and visible part of the Edison High School band program. This includes wind instruments^{*}, percussion^{**} and guard. Students must be enrolled in a band, percussion or guard class during the entire school year to maintain their membership.

Weekly after school commitments: Two weekday rehearsals, football games, Saturday rehearsals and competitions, check our calendar on EdisonInstrumentalMusic.org for the most up-to-date info

Season: August to Thanksgiving

*Piccolo, Flute, Clarinet, Bass Clarinet, Alto Sax, Tenor Sax, Bari Sax, Trumpet, Mellophone, Trombone, Baritone, & Tuba, etc.

**Battery Percussion: Snare, Tenors, Bass; Front Ensemble: Mallet instruments, auxiliary percussion, cymbals, keyboards, bass, etc.

<u>Concert Band</u>

The Concert Band enables students to develop higher levels of musicianship on their instrument through traditional concert repertoire. This class will focus on playing proficiency and band literature. This ensemble begins after the marching season is concluded and includes all winds and percussion players.

Weekly after school commitments: One rehearsal (starting in December), three to four performances starting in December

Season: December to June

Winter Guard

Winter Guard is the second competitive season of the year for Color Guard students. The group prepares a show to be performed in a gymnasium that is judged in competition with other schools.

Weekly after school commitments: Two rehearsals, Saturday competitions in March and April

Season: December to April

Indoor Drumline

Indoor Drumline is a separate performing group for all members of the marching band and concert wind ensemble. All percussionists are required to participate, and winds are welcome to audition. This is a competitive group that happens in January through April. Students prepare for and perform a show that is evaluated by a panel of expert judges. In doing so, they learn teamwork, leadership, musicianship, and physical skills.

Weekly after school commitments: Two rehearsals, Saturday competitions in March and April

Season: December to April

<u>Jazz Band</u>

Jazz Ensemble is an additional, optional, opportunity for members of the winds and percussion sections. This ensemble is active during the second semester and plays specific popular styles including, jazz, funk, rock, blues, and Latin jazz styles.

Weekly after school commitments: One rehearsal, up to 10 performances in April, May, and June

Season: December to June

Please check with the director about the proper courses to enroll in each semester or if there are schedule conflicts.

Advanced Music (Honors)

This honors-level course is designed to allow interested and dedicated students the opportunity to extend their musical education in an enriched curriculum. Students must demonstrate a higher level of musical understanding and be able to perform at the highest possible level both as an individual and as a member of an ensemble. Students are expected to demonstrate a high level of critical listening, musical understanding, technical ability, and rehearsal etiquette. Admission is determined during the second semester of the year prior to enrollment in the course. Details will be given in January.

General Procedures

Code of Conduct

All students will abide by the code of conduct, both of Edison High School and the Instrumental Music Program. The Instrumental Music Program Code of Conduct will be provided to each student at the beginning of the season.

<u>Attendance</u>

Your attendance at all events and rehearsals is of the utmost importance. Your absence affects all others in your team. Please plan ahead. If you have a conflict with a rehearsal, performance, competition, or other activity, please do everything you can to resolve the conflict. If you can not resolve the conflict please email the director and appropriate coach as soon as you are aware of the conflict. More details about attendance, absences, and your grade can be found in our syllabus.

Performances

All performances are mandatory. Show up on time with the appropriate materials.

<u>Recognition</u>

Students can be recognized individually for their efforts in several ways, such as a varsity letter, a graduation cord, or one of numerous awards.

Lockers

Each student will be assigned a locker in the hallway outside the band room for the school year. It is the student's responsibility to keep the locker clean and to tell the director if the lock is broken or needs maintenance.

Required Supplies

All students must have the following items for every marching band, drumline, and color guard rehearsal:

- Pencil
- Athletic shoes
- Sunscreen & sun protection
- Warm layers
- Water in a large, insulated, refillable bottle
- Spiral bound index cards (dot book) on a lanyard or shoestring

In addition, students will require the items specific to their section:

<u>Winds</u>

- Music (provided by director) in a binder (described below)
- Instrument (your own or assigned, as decided with the director)
- Instrument accessories (valve oil, mouthpiece, reeds, cork grease, swab, etc.)
- 3/4 inch three-ring binder and sheet protectors (must be 3/4 inch or less)
- Marching band lyre specific to your instrument (check <u>wwbw.com</u>)
- Music flip-folder and extra pages (check <u>wwbw.com</u>)
- Tuner/metronome phone app (<u>Tonal Energy Tuner</u> app highly recommended)
- High black socks
- Black compression shorts for under your uniform
- All black athletic shoes (New Balance 608v5 or similar)

Drumline (Battery and Pit)

- Sticks and/or mallets (will be decided by your drumline staff)
- 12" Practice Pad (check <u>steveweissmusic.com</u>)
- 3/4 inch three-ring binder and page protectors (must be 3/4 inch or less)
- Tuner/metronome phone app (<u>Tonal Energy Tuner</u> app highly recommended)
- High black socks
- Black compression shorts for under your uniform
- All black athletic shoes (New Balance 608v5 or similar)

Color Guard

- Yoga Mat
- Flag Bag (provided)
- Duffel Bag (provided)
- Body tights (<u>Adult Body Tights from discountdance.com</u> highly recommended)
- Performance Gloves (<u>Ever-Dri Performance Gloves by DSI</u> highly recommend)
- Jazz Shoes (<u>Adult "Neo Flex" Slip-On Jazz Shoes from discountdance.com</u> highly recommended)
- Black leggings with logo (purchase your own leggings)
- Warm-Up Jacket (purchased through the boosters)
- EHS Guard Shirt (purchased through the boosters)

Other items will be needed as directed by the Color Guard staff

Band Uniform Requirements and Care

Preparing for a performance

- a. Underclothing: Black compression shorts and the EHS performance t-shirt are to be worn under the uniforms (no tank tops!). This will help keep perspiration off the uniforms. In addition, high black socks are to be worn.
- b. Jewelry: No visible jewelry may be worn at any time.
- c. Hair: Longer hair must be put up securely with pins so that it does not show below the collar line.
- d. Shoes: Mandatory all-black athletic shoes must be worn for each performance. They are to be clean and dust-free. Recommended shoes will be purchased by each family.

Putting on and taking off the uniform

- a. Pants should be adjusted so the hem falls just to the top of the shoe, resulting in little or no "break" in the pant leg.
- b. The hat (shako) is to be distributed and collected at every performance.
- c. Plumes are never handled by the student! Parent volunteers will place and remove the plumes.
- d. After removing the uniform, hang the pants neatly. Use the crease line of the pant to fold the pant over the hanger. Do not just drape the pants over the hanger! Each student receives a hanger with the uniform.
- e. Hang the jacket with the curve of the hanger facing forward. Make sure the jacket is zipped securely so it will not slide off the hanger.
- f. Hang up the uniform immediately after each performance. Do not throw it in a car trunk, etc. The garment bag provided with the uniform is to be used whenever the uniform is not being worn. If there is perspiration or moisture of any kind, leave the zipper open until the uniform is dry, then zip it up.
- g. The only other items that may go in the garment bag are gauntlets and gloves. Shoes are to be labeled and kept separate from the uniform.
- h. Do not eat or drink while in uniform (except water)

<u>Cleaning the uniform</u>

- a. Cleaning of the uniform will be done **ONLY** by the Uniform Coordinator. Students are to maintain the uniform by brushing off any dust or dirt. Should any cleaning beyond that be necessary, contact the Uniform Coordinator.
- b. The hat is not to be dry cleaned or immersed in water. Let the Uniform Coordinator know if cleaning is necessary.

Alterations/Repairs

a. Do not make any alterations or repairs to the uniform, including sewing on a button. If an adjustment or repair is necessary, contact the Uniform Coordinator and arrangements will be made.

Inventory of uniform pieces provided to each student:

a. Jacket

b. Hanger

c. Green Pants

- d. Gloves
- e. Garment Bagf. Shako (except front ensemble)
- g. Gauntlets

Concert Attire Guidelines

The dress guidelines outlined here are strongly enforced to ensure that everyone in the ensemble is dressed professionally and uniformly for performances. If in doubt as to what to wear, stay as conservative as possible. Students who arrive for a concert improperly dressed will be sent home to change or, if this is not possible, will have their grade automatically lowered and may be pulled from the concert. Consistent failure to maintain a professional appearance in performance will have a negative effect upon one's grade.

Option A - Suit or Tux

- Black tuxedo or suit (pants and jacket)
- Pressed white dress shirt
- Black bow tie
- Black dress socks (no ankle socks)
- Black dress shoes (no cowboy or combat boots, no Vans, Converse, or sneakers)

Option B - Dress

- Plain black, floor to mid-calf length gown with long or 3/4 sleeves
- Black hose
- Black dress shoes

<u>Option C - Slacks or Skirt and Top</u>

- Long or mid-calf black skirt or black dress slacks, with a black top having long or 3/4 sleeves
- Black hose and close-toed black dress shoes (two-inch heel or less)

<u>Jazz Ensembles</u>

All black, colorful ties or accessories.

In All Cases

- No excessive jewelry, no sequins or sparkles, hair accessories must be black, silver, or gold
- Pants, skirts, and dresses should be loose and flowing, nothing skin-tight
- No jeans
- Heels can be no higher than two-inches
- <u>Shoes must be ALL black</u>

Below is a general guideline to winter and spring rehearsal schedules, <u>but it is subject to change</u>: Concert Band (mandatory for winds and percussion): One day a week, 1.5 hours Winter Guard (mandatory for color guard): Two days a week, typically 5-9pm Indoor Drumline: Two days a week, typically 3 hours Jazz Band (optional): One day a week, 2 hours

EHS Band Booster Association

The Booster Association is tasked with coordinating the parent volunteers and raising the funds necessary for the program to function. 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Your Role as a Booster

- Attend Booster Meetings
 - Booster Meetings are held on the second Wednesday of each month (Sept June) at 7:00 PM in the Band Room. It is extremely important that every student member has an adult present at each meeting. We will discuss upcoming events, fundraising, and answer any questions about the program.

• Pay Your Assessments

- Includes the following:
 - Camp Fee: Funds the summer program and two-week Band Camp -\$500.00
 - Instrument Usage Fee: Only payable if your child uses a school instrument -\$100 each semester
 - Costume costs: Color Guard and Drumline est. \$200 a season

Checks can be made to EHS Band Boosters Association. All payments can be mailed to PO Box 6966, Huntington Beach CA, 92615 or placed in the booster box located in the band room.

- Make a Pledge/Donation
 - Recommendations are stated on the Pledge Form. You have several options for the amount you pledge:
 - Full Cost of Student: The full cost of the program for your child without taking into account any fundraising
 - Recommended Donation: The cost of the program for your child considering estimated fundraising
 - Donation/pledge amount made into monthly payments
 - Any other amount: We will gladly accept any amount that you are comfortable pledging, if you wish to adjust the amount in the future just contact our Treasurer at <u>treasurer@edisoninstrumentalmusic.org</u>

Checks can be made to EHS Band Boosters Association. All payments can be mailed to PO Box 6966, Huntington Beach CA, 92615 or placed in the booster box located in the band room.

Please understand that if pledges fall short of the amount budgeted, the program budget will be cut, and the experience of the students will be impacted.

• Volunteer

- The Charger Band runs best when every family volunteers. There will be many requests throughout the year. Typical requests are:
 - Donation of Items: Water, snacks, prop materials, other items throughout the year
 - Fundraisers: See fundraising section and website for dates
 - Field Shows / Competitions: We need roadies to move equipment, drivers for our truck and to pull our trailer, chaperones and other support

• Raise Funds

- Take part in our various fundraisers
- Sign up and use the various Sales Rebate programs listed in the Fundraising Section (help the program earn money on things you purchase everyday)
- Ask if your employer has a matching grant program for non-profits or search for your corporation at <u>Charity Navigator</u> (https://www.charitynavigator.org/donor-basics/giving-101/employee-match-programs/)

- Find and help the program apply for funding from grants from companies and foundations
- Ask local companies to sponsor the band or purchase ads in our Field Competition program. It is always nice to get money from outside of our families and it benefits all the students.

• Your presence at shows, concerts, and competitions goes a long way to showing that you find this endeavor worthwhile. Our children will be working hard, and we should support them.

Standing Rules of the EHS Band Booster Association

Sec. 1: The Committees of the Association include, but are not limited to, the following. Although a Committee may be listed herein, it may be inactive. Certain committees may consist of only a committee chair with no other members except ex-officio members defined in Article VI:

- A. Fundraising: , Community Cards, Christmas Band, Corporate Contributions/Sponsorship, e-Scrip, , Restaurant Dine-out, See's Holiday Candy, Competition Hosting
- B. Volunteer: Socials, Chaperones, Roadies, Transportation, Concerts, Uniforms, Volunteer Hours, Water Brigade, Volunteer List

Sec. 2: The following includes, but is not limited to, assessments that can be collected from each student. Not all assessments listed will apply to all students. Students shall not be denied the opportunity to participate in school-sponsored or Association-sponsored activities because of non-payment or underpayment of any assessment:

- A. Band and Color Guard Camp ("Field Show Camp") assessment
- B. Field Trips or excursions
- C. Replacement costs for uniforms or instruments that are lost or damaged Transportation to and from school for performances, competitions or field trips

Sec. 3: The following includes, but is not limited to items and standardized apparel that students are expected to procure. The association may not mandate that any of these items be purchased through the Association. The Association, at its discretion can choose to include the costs of any or all of these items in the Association budget or to supply items to students for whom procurement of the item or apparel would create a financial hardship:

- A. Polo Shirt (student only)
- B. Marching Shoes
- C. Band Jacket
- D. Warm-ups
- E. Gloves

- F. Lyre
- G. Flip Book
- H. Rifle
- I. Flag Bag

Sec. 4: Boosters are expected to support the Association by participating in Association-sponsored meetings, fundraisers and activities, and to support student performances, competitions and trips

by attending performances and assisting with performance support activities. Each Voting Member is expected to do the following:

- A. Attend monthly booster meetings
- B. Provide up-to-date email, home and cellular phone contact information
- C. Staff a shift at any festival or competition that is sponsored by the Association
- D. Do at least one of the following:
 - a. Volunteer several times (minimum number of times to be determined by the Executive Board) during both the fall and spring seasons to staff support roles at performances, competitions and Association-sponsored events
 - b. Chair at least one committee
 - c. Serve on the Executive Board

Prior to the start of field show camp, the Executive Board shall define the available chairperson roles as well as the minimum number of times that a booster is expected to volunteer for a support role for 1st semester. Prior to the start of 2nd semester, the Executive Board shall define the minimum number of times that a booster is expected to volunteer for a support role for 2nd semester. Students shall not be denied the opportunity to participate in Association- sponsored activities because of a lack of participation by any Voting Member.

Finances

Sources of Funding

- School District: The HBUHSD provides the band program facilities and funds the director's salary. They also provide a small stipend for two other coaches, but not funding for their full costs. Some funds are also provided for instrument repair and miscellaneous expenses.
- Donations/Pledges: The director and Booster Board determine a budget for the year. We also determine the recommended yearly donation/pledge amount that covers each student. These donations can be paid out over six months.
- <u>Employee Matching Donations</u>: Please check with your employer to see if they will match your pledge/donation amount.
- Fundraising: The Edison High School Band and Color Guard Boosters are committed, with your help, to fundraising about 40% of the budget to help offset the cost of the program and to cover those families who are unable to make a financial commitment to the program. We hold several fundraisers throughout the year and their success is dependent on the involvement of all our families.
- Sponsorships: Businesses can sponsor the band at various levels and receive acknowledgements in return. See the sponsorship form for more info.

Where the Money Goes

- Coaches: Just like a sports team, the band has several staff members that help us put on the best show possible: coaches, drill writer, choreographer, music arranger, etc.
- Show Costs: Music, Props, Entry Fees, Facility Rentals, Clinicians, Flags, etc.
- Purchase and Repair of Instruments and Equipment: The boosters purchase and repair the instruments and equipment owned by the district. In the past several years we have purchased a marimba, metronomes, microphones, a bari sax, and a new mixer. Each year there is a new wishlist of needs.
- Transportation: Rental of trucks, school vans, and reimbursement to the district for buses used to transport students to field shows, festivals, etc.
- Booster Administration: Insurance, CPA fees, website maintenance, scholarships, bank fees, etc.
- Other Costs: Awards, Senior Scholarships, Uniform cleaning, Yearbook pages, Honor Band, Recruiting, etc




