Our "Building on the Foundation" capital campaign is on hold for now. So far, we've raised over \$994,000 in gifts/pledges towards our \$1,500,000 goal! We'll be continuing the campaign efforts later this year when it is more feasible and safe to do so.



Congregational Financial Update

We are in a different kind of time. With not meeting in person for worship on Sundays, our financial situation has taken a hit. I want to share with you more information on the congregation's financial position.

- At the end of March, our checking account balance was at \$137,083.69. What does this mean? It
 means that while we have some cash reserves, we are still concerned for our overall financial picture.
- Prior to March, our monthly needs were about \$27,000/month. A little more than half of our income occurs in regular ACH deposits (deducted monthly or weekly, about \$14,000/month). This means the remainder of our income was usually raised by our regular Sunday morning offerings. It is our hope that we increase this. By the time of the newsletter update, we've taken in an additional \$1,370/month in regular ACH deposits.
- In March, our council decided to eliminate the position of office manager. This will result in additional savings. It'll likely result in some additional work for me, our finance manager Lauren, as well as volunteers. The council decided to continue on the office manager's health insurance for 6 months.
- We received the Paycheck Protection Program Loan in the amount of \$34,892.48. We believe a large portion of this (about \$28,000) will be forgiven in the form of a grant.
- I am slowly calling every family unit in the congregation. I may make a direct appeal for you to being or increase online/regular giving.

So what does this all mean put together? It means first, we are concerned about our finances at the church. We have enough funds to make our payroll, but without an increase in regular giving, our congregation will be in difficult shape. And to be truthful, our council was concerned about our financial position for the past couple of years even before the pandemic. Second, it also means we are hopeful. We do have the financial resources amongst our families in the congregation, and I think in the future, we're on our way to a more solid financial footing.

I think the words of God in the book of Jeremiah (29:11) say it best:


"For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope."
