PRESENTATION

- Elaine, Linda, and Janice Raber: Diving as we Age: You Can Keep a Good Diver Down!!!
- As per PADI/SSI, no age restrictions for older divers.
- Studies on Long Term Deep diving affects Pulmonary Function Tests, and medical issues. #1 resource for this is DAN, (Divers Alert Network).
- Medical issues: Osteoporosis: take precautions; Menopause: Bone health, Sleep issues; Hypertension/Heart Disease; Diabetes: Low Blood sugar, monitor glucose levels;
- Cosmetic care: Fillers compress as we dive; Thermal issues: hypothermia due to hormonal issues.
- Don't be afraid to ask for help! Ex: Keep mask on your neck or fasten it on you when shore diving, ask for someone to help stabilize you as you put on your fins, etc.
- Vision diminishes: consider eye surgery if severe. When converting to prescription lenses get a mask with pop out clear lenses, consider progressive lenses vs just a portion of the lens for better optical views. Captree Opticians by appointment only for prescription mask lenses.
- Body strength decreases: Set up your own gear, but okay to accept help (heavy gear? Put it on in the water; strong currents? Let the boat pick you up.) Calculate the risks. Follow your instincts.
- DAN exercises for Divers
- Slings instead of Doubles
- Travel with Medical History and have a PADI Medical Form filled out yearly.
- Ask about age restrictions prior to booking a live aboard.

BEACH DIVING LOCATION INFORMATION

NORTH SHORE:

Bayville Barge, Bayville

The site is located off the beach in front of the Wall's Wharf restaurant in Bayville. Please be advised that we are not permitted to use the restaurant lot for parking. There is a lot at the north end of Eighth Street that is open to Bayville residents, or look for street parking. The barge can be found by taking a north heading from the chain link fence outside of the restaurant.

Cedar Beach, Mt. Sinai

The fishing pier is located at the West end of Harbor Beach Rd in Mt. Sinai. Follow this road past the basketball courts, parking lots, and marinas until you arrive at a smaller parking lot overlooking the boat channel. The dive site is underneath the fishing pier. Please be advised that parking meters are in effect in the summer season.

When conditions do not permit diving underneath the fishing pier, the beach next to the basketball court is another option, also located on Harbor Beach Road.

Horton Point, Southold

Take Lighthouse Road in Southold north to the end. Turn left into the parking lot for the Horton Point Lighthouse. If there is a gatekeeper, let them know you are scuba diving there with The Dive Club, and parking should be free. The site is down the staircase and straight into the water.

Pirate's Cove, Port Jefferson

The site is now called McAllister County Park. Take Anchorage Road in Port Jefferson to the end. There is a roundabout where gear can be dropped off and about 6 parking spots a small way up the road.

Roanoke Barges, Reeves Park

Take Sound Avenue and turn onto Park Road. The site is located at the north end of Park Road in Reeves Park. A four-wheel drive vehicle and beach permit is necessary to access this site, or it will be a long walk with dive gear. A few club members have volunteered to transport gear to the site for everyone in their 4WD. Meet at the end of Park Road at the scheduled time to coordinate "travel plans."

Rye Cliff Ferry, Sea Cliff

The site is located off Sea Cliff Beach. Navigate to The BLVD in Sea Cliff and look for street parking. The wreck is approximately 270 degrees out from the first small jetty on shore.

Stehli Beach, Oyster Bay

Stehli Beach is located at the west end of Bayville Ave, before it turns into Bayville Road. Parking can be found in front of the bathhouse, where we will enter the water. Please be advised that this is an Oyster Bay town beach, so our diving here will be limited to early/late season only.

Secret Beach, Greenport

The site is located on North Road in Greenport where you will see a dirt road with chain link gates on the north side, make a left down this dirt road. If you are using a GPS or maps app, Inlet Pond County Park is close by. If you see the Eastern LI Kampground, you went too far! Please be advised the dive site is located on private property. The club has received permission to dive here as long as a LIDA waiver is signed by all attending, and a divemaster is present.

Shoreham Jetties, Wading River

Take Sound Road to Creek Road and make a left. Follow Creek Road west to the end. Park on the left side of the wooden barrier in the small, square dirt lot. The right side is reserved for permit holding residents. The site is located at the end of Wading River where is empties out into the Long Island Sound. The idea here is to plan the dive with the tides so that we can enter the river from the parking lot and receive a lift with the outgoing tide. Then, execute the dive, and ride the incoming tide back in.

Submarine Base, New Suffolk

The site is located at the south end of Main Street in New Suffolk and there is street parking only. Use Case's Place Restaurant for GPS directions.

Theodore Roosevelt Fishing Pier, Oyster Bay

The site is located at the end of West End Ave in Bayville. For GPS directions, input Theodore Roosevelt Beach. Find the site by entering from the boat ramp and heading west until you hit the fishing pier.



BEACH DIVING LOCATION INFORMATION

U.S.S. Ohio, Greenport

The entrance to the beach is at the south end of Clark Street in Greenport. Street Parking can be found on Clark Street or the adjacent 4th Street. Enter the opening to the beach from Clark Street and follow the beach along to the right. There is a large iron pipe in the sand along with some other metal pieces. Take a compass heading of 120 degrees from there to find the wreck (debris).

SOUTH SHORE:

Beach 8th Street, Far Rockaway

The site is located at the south end of Beach 8th Street in Far Rockaway, Queens. Street parking is limited, but additional spots can be found on Beach 9th street, or near the basketball courts on Beach 10th Street. Do not park in the Rockaway Manor parking lot, as this is for nursing home residents only, but use this building as a GPS guideline if necessary.

HMS Culloden, Montauk

Take Soundview Drive until it turns into a dirt road and continue for another quarter mile or so until you see another unnamed dirt road. Take this road to the end and park. Parking is on the bluff that overlooks the water, so the staircase will lead you down to the dive site. The wreck is located 330 degrees from the large boulder on the beach.

Noyack Bay, Noyack

The site is located on the north side of Noyack-Long Beach Road. Proceed past Foster Memorial Beach and look for a spot to pull off on the north side of the road. The dive site is street-parking only.

Oak Beach, Babylon

The old Oak Beach Inn. A large parking lot on North Oak Beach Road. After going over the Robert Moses Bridge and the small draw bridge, turn right onto Ocean Parkway West. You will have to use a turnaround to get onto Ocean Parkway East, where you will then see the parking lot on your right. For GPS directions, use Oak Beach. The dive site can be accessed from the jetty on the east side of the parking lot, where we usually meet. Others may choose to dive the fishing pier located on the west side of the same parking lot.

Old Ponguogue Bridge, Hampton Bays

Proceed over the bridge on Lighthouse Road in Hampton Bays and turn left onto Dune Road. Immediately make another left and follow this road to the end. The dive site is under the Old Ponguogue Bridge, A parking permit is required, but you can also drop off your gear at the site, drive your car back over the bridge, park on the north side, and take a nice scenic walk back over.

Shinnecock County Park East, Southampton
The site is located at the west end of Meadow Lane in Southampton. Turn right onto Meadow Lane from Halsey Neck Ln and follow it to the end. The site is entered from the camping parking lot just beyond the entry booth. Please be advised there is an in-season and weekend fee to park for non-residents (\$7). Also, keep in mind this is an entirely different site than Shinnecock West, with an inlet in between the two.

Shinnecock West, Hampton Bays

The site is located on Road H, at the east end of Dune Road in Hampton Bays. If you are familiar with the Ponquogue Bridge, continue straight down Dune Road instead of turning left into the parking lot. The dive site is the Shinnecock inlet, where we will enter on the ocean side where the jetty is.

UPSTATE NY & BEYOND

Minnewaska State Park Preserve, Ulster County
Within Minnewaska State Park, navigate to the visitor's center. The parking for the dive site is down a short road to the left of this building. You will have to stop by the visitor's center with your certification card and \$25 to dive for the day. Also, admission to the park is \$8 (typical of any New York State Park) or free with an Empire Pass.

Delaware River Water Gap, Pennsylvania

From I-80, exit onto Rt. 611 South. Follow 611 through town of Delaware Water Gap into Delaware Water Gap National Recreational Area. The parking area is at the bottom of the hill south of town on the right side. Pull off on the side of the road just before the road rounds the corner and the wall starts on the train tracks. Alternatively, there is a large parking lot on the other side of the road, but travel across the highway with dive gear at your own risk.



WRECK DIVING 2023 SCHEDULE

The following equipment is <u>required</u> for all wreck dives with The Dive Club:

- Secondary Air Source:doubles or pony bottle
- Wreck reel
- Lift bag OR Surface Marker Buoy
- Cutting tool
- Whistle or other sound device
- Strobe

Divers should be comfortable with the use of this gear.

To book a spot on the Sidekick Dive Boat, each diver must have certification for the planned depth of the wreck. **Deep Diving certification** is required for wrecks over 100ft.

To book a spot on the Sea Hawk or Sea Turtle, AOW certification is required.

REGIONAL SCUBA DIVING PERMIT

SOLD YEAR-ROUND



Fee: \$80 NYS resident/ \$125 non-NYS resident

Requirements: Valid Motor Vehicle Registration, Valid Driver's License, must have a Diver Certification Card (C Card).

Permit valid April 1 - December 31.

This permit allows access to designated beach areas for SCUBA-Diving only at:



- Caumsett: Fisherman's parking lot, 24-hr access.
- Jones Beach: East end of Field 10 only, 24-hr access. Not valid in bathing areas.
- Orient Beach: 8 am to sunset.
- Robert Moses: Democrat Point, hours vary, not valid in bathing areas.

Permit Conditions:

- ⇒ This Permit expires December 31, regardless of issuing date.
- ⇒ This permit allows for parking and access to designated beach areas at Caumsett, Jones Beach, Orient Beach and Robert Moses (Democratic Point) State Parks for the purpose of diving ONLY.
 - CAUMSETT- Permit valid 24 hours daily at fisherman's parking lot ONLY, JONES BEACH- Permit valid 24 hours daily at east end of Field #10 ONLY, not valid in bathing areas. ORIENT BEACH- Permit valid from 8 AM to Sunset, ROBERT MOSES (DEMOCRAT POINT)- Permit valid 24 hours daily from April 1 thru December 31. Beginning the Saturday before Memorial Day until Labor Day, vehicles may enter before 7 AM and after 5 PM ONLY (4-wheel drive vehicles and associated equipment are required). Not valid in bathing areas.
- ⇒ Permittee and passengers must possess SCUBA diving equipment. This permit is for bonafide divers with "c" cards ONLY and divers are required to show same upon request of State Parks employee. Divers must employ the buddy system while diving and all divers must have "c" cards.



REGIONAL SCUBA DIVING PERMIT (CON'T)

- ⇒ Open fires, charcoal barbecues, camping, portable generators, trailers, boats, inflatables, bathing, surfing, jet skis, spear fishing, kayaks, wind-surf/sailing equipment, alcoholic beverages and pets are strictly PROHIBITED. Take all litter and debris with you and discard in trash receptacles. Do not destroy sand fence, it is helpful in maintaining a stable beach environment. Tents and portable shelters PROHIBITED sunset to sunrise.
- ⇒ This permit is valid ONLY for vehicle bearing license plate number indicated on front and is NON-TRANSFERABLE to another vehicle. Proof of license plate surrenderslip must be provided to the Permits Office in the event of a license plate change. There will be NO REPLACEMENTS or REFUNDS FOR LOST or REVOKED PERMITS. Duplicate permits will not be issued. Temporary permits will not be issued for loaner/rental vehicles.
- ⇒ Environmental conditions and endangered species management may require the temporary or permanent closure of all, or part of the beach areas accessed by this permit.
- ⇒ The permittee shall be responsible for any damage to park property or facilities which may result from the use thereof The permittee assumes all risk and shall hold harmless the State of New York and the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation for damages, for injury or death of themselves or others, resulting from activities under this permit or by reason of any unauthorized activities undertaken in contravention of the permit conditions. Violation of any condition of this permit or any rule of STATE PARKS or the Long Island Park Region may result in the immediate confiscation and revocation of the permit (NO REFUND) and POSSIBLE ISSUANCE OF A TICKET.
- ⇒ Vehicles must not exceed 10 MPH at any time. Pedestrians have the right-of-way; please be courteous to people walking.
- ⇒ Vehicles must be parked in the parking lot in a marked stall. EXCEPTION: Robert Moses (Democrat Point) Vehicles must follow designated access road to the beach. DO NOT DRIVE ON DUNES, WETLANDS, BEACH GRASS, BIRD NESTING AREAS, OR IN SEAL HAUL OUT AREAS. Vehicles are prohibited from parking on the access road or around entrance area; vehicles left unattended at these locations will have their permit revoked immediately.




