### Bill Bleyer

"Famous Long Island Shipwrecks"

Join us at our upcoming meeting in welcoming Bill Bleyer. Bill Bleyer was a prizewinning staff writer for Newsday for 33 years specializing in history and maritime issues before retiring in 2014 to write books and freelance for the newspaper and magazines.



He has written six books published by the History Press: Sagamore Hill: Theodore Roosevelt's Summer White House (2016); Fire Island Lighthouse: Long Island's Welcoming Beacon (2017), Long Island and the Sea: A Maritime History, (2019); George Washington's Long Island Spy Ring: A History and Tour Guide (2021), The Sinking of the Steamboat Lexington on Long Island Sound (2023); and, with co-author Harrison Hunt, Long Island and the Civil War (2015). Forthcoming in the summer of 2025 is "The Roosevelts in New York City."

The Hofstra University graduate has taught economics and journalism there and history at Webb Institute, the naval architecture college in Glen Cove.

At Bill's upcoming presentation, learn about prominent Long Island shipwrecks. The PowerPoint lecture will include maritime disasters from the Prins Maurits carrying colonists to what would become Delaware, HMS Culloden wrecked at Montauk during the American Revolution, the Mexico and Bristol carrying immigrants during the early 1800s, the fire that destroyed the steamship Lexington in 1840 - Long

Island Sound's worst calamity - to the sinking of the USS San Diego in World War I and the loss of the tugboat Gwendoline Steers in a 1962 winter storm.

Fill out the application, which is available for download on the The Dive Club's webpage (thediveclub.com/membership). Please fill out the application on your computer, print to sign, and then scan and email to Bill Cadden (below).

#### ALL SIGNATURES MUST BE HAND SIGNED, NO ELECTRONIC SIGNATURES ACCEPTED.

The application consists of the <u>Data Sheet</u>, <u>Wavier</u>, and <u>Membership Directory</u> (4 pages total)

The Data Sheet keeps your information current and updated, including emergency contacts (who should be someone other than your typical dive buddy). The waivers is needed for safety and protection year over year. Finally, the Directory sheet is to add you to our membership directory and keep that fresh as well.

For Family Memberships, EACH PERSON IN THE FAMILY UNIT needs to fill out a Form and Sign it. Print out the form so you can sign **ALL Pages**, **and Initial the Waiver** where indicated. **PARENTS**, you must sign the Waiver for your Children under the age of 18. **No Digital Signatures please**.

#### When you sign the Waiver, PLEASE DATE IT January 1 of the waiver year.

Scan the pages and save as a \*.pdf, using your Last Name for the File Name (ex: Cadden.pdf), and email it to Corresponding Secretary, Bill Cadden at <a href="mailto:Membership.Thediveclub@GMail.com">Membership.Thediveclub@GMail.com</a>

Individual memberships for 2026 are \$25. Family memberships are \$35.

## WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE A MEMBER IN GOOD STANDING?

What is Membership? What does it mean to be a Member?

Two very interesting questions, with similar, and yet different answers.

Membership is a term that refers to two things. The first is that Membership refers to the collective group of people that belong to an organization. Take for The Dive Club. The instance. Membership of The Dive Club is made up of all of the individuals that have joined the club, and comply with the rules and obligations of the organization. More on this in a little bit. Membership also refers to what is bestowed upon an individual when thev ioin organization and comply with all of the rules of the organization at the time of their joining.

Member is a term that refers to the individual person in an organization, such as The Dive Club. Each individual Member makes up the Membership. And as such, each Member is responsible for complying with the rule and obligations of the organization.

Now, for the Dive Club, the rules and Obligations are spelled out in the By-

Laws. However, to simplify, they are;

- 1. Pay your dues, when they are due.
- 2. Maintain a current, properly executed Waiver on file.
- 3. Maintain your Personal and Emergency Contact information up to date.
- 4. Participate in the Meetings of the Club.
- 5. Support and participate in the activities of the Club.

The Dive Club is on a yearly Dues Calendar, with the Dues being due on January 1st of each year. We even offer a discount for those who pay before the Due date, as well as honoring a 30 day Grace period after the due date. Being as the Membership of the Club is comprised of responsible Adults, and we all have other similar obligations, be they yearly or several times over the course of the year. To be asked for, or asking if they are due, in April, June, July is being irresponsible, as well as not fulfilling your obligation under the Rules.

The same holds true for your Data Sheet. This information needs to be confirmed, or at least updated, on a yearly basis. This is done in conjunction with filing a properly executed Waiver. Again, for me to be hounding and Badgering our Members to submit these documents in June, August and even as late as October is a poor reflection on the Member. Especially when these same Members are participating in Club Activities, Trips and, Events and their Waivers not being on file, to the detriment of the Club and all of the other Members who have submitted them in a timely fashion.

One aspect of being in a Social Club of people who have like passions, hobbies is that there are usually Meetings and Activities. These take time and effort to plan and execute. Being it arranging for the Entertainment at regular meetings or organizing an event. An obligation of belonging to such a group is to be involved, either in planning, execution or as little as participating. As for participating in the Clubs Meetings and Activities and supporting the Club, this, along with having your Dues and Waivers

in on time is all part of being a Member in Good Standing. We belong to The Club through our shared interest in Scuba Diving. This is the one thing that binds us all together. By coming to the Meetings, you not only learn what is happening with the Clubs business, but you have a chance to interact with other of like mind and, get exposed to ideas and discussions that others bring to the Meeting. If only the same 12 or 15 Members are showing up for the Meetings, the rest of the Membership is disservice not doing a only themselves, but the Club collective. The more people that come to the Meetings, ideas. the more experiences and, information that can be shared.

There are reasons that we hold the Meetings on the First Tuesday of the Month. First, it is easy to remember when the meeting is. Yes, sometimes it sneaks up on us if the first Tuesday is the 1st or 2nd. Second, it makes it easy for you to schedule it, you don't have to wait for an announcement to know when it is. This also allows you to schedule other things around it. The same goes for the Weekly Dive at Oak

Beach. It is always on Wednesday, for the simple reason that it also serves as a Mid-Week break to help you get to the weekend during the Spring, Summer and Fall. Yes, all three seasons. We start in the Spring the week before Memorial Day and go into the Fall until we run out of Daylight, usually the end of Sept, first week in Oct. This also serves as an informal weekly meeting, as it is not just Diving, but Socializing as well.

The Club is only as effective and vibrant as the Members make it. Everyone should want to be involved to some degree. To lend their expertise, their passion to the Meetings or Activities. It can be as simple as hosting an Activity. Get involved. The more hands, the easier and more productive we are as a whole, and the more Rewarding the experience of being a Member is.

An example of getting involved would be to volunteer to be the Chair for Shore Diving, or Wreck Diving. That does not mean that you should be doing all the work, and going on all the Dives. Your strength may be in the organizing and overseeing it. You put a Committee together to assist. The entire Committee gets together to plan the Shore Dives and the Wreck Dives. Sure, they take suggestions or input from the rest of the Membership, but they sit down and lay it out. Get a couple of people who have a deeper interest than most to either be the Sponsor for a Wreck Dive, or be the Person in charge, representing the Club on a Beach Dive. These are the people who see to the details of the Dive. An example would be if there is someone, or a couple of people who have a favorite spot for a Shore Dive, or a favorite Wreck. They Dive it regularly and know most of the tricks, the ins and outs of the spot. These are the ones you want to involve in Sponsoring a Club Dive there. They can give the briefing as they know the spot, and can keep an eye on things as they know where the problems are likely to be, since they have likely already experienced them.

In closing, be a Member, get involved, contribute to the success and vibrancy of the Club. But, most of all, be a Member in Good Standing by not only contributing to the Club as a Member, but by fulfilling your Obligations to the Club in a timely fashion.
