## WRECK DIVING 2023 SCHEDULE

The following equipment is <u>required</u> for all wreck dives with The Dive Club:

- Secondary Air Source:doubles or pony bottle
- Wreck reel
- Lift bag OR Surface Marker Buoy
- Cutting tool
- Whistle or other sound device
- Strobe

Divers should be comfortable with the use of this gear.

To book a spot on the Sidekick Dive Boat, each diver must have certification for the planned depth of the wreck. Deep Diving certification is required for wrecks over 100ft.

To book a spot on the Sea Hawk or Sea Turtle, AOW certification is required.

## WRECK DIVING REPORT JUNE 2023

The wreck diving season is going well with 3 trips logged already. See the June newsletter for a report of our trip to the Panther on the Halftime on May 28<sup>th</sup>.

On June 17th, 4 club members boarded the Sea Hawk for a 6:30AM sail time. Our destination was the wreck known as the Eureka. The wreck sits in 110ft of water, 16 miles south of Jones Inlet. The wreck is most likely not the actual Eureka, that was a tug. but this is what it is known as today. When we were 90 min offshore, the captain felt it was too rough to be safe and the winds were building. We headed inshore to dive the Iberia. The Iberia was a 255ft long steamer and was hit by the Umbria luxury liner in 1888 and sank the next day. It is in 60 ft of water 3 miles out. We had 15 ft of visibility water 3 miles out. We had 15 ft of visibility On June 25<sup>th</sup>, 16 divers made the drive to and the water was 56 degrees. I think I have Point Pleasant, NJ for the long-awaited trip seen more of the Iberia than ever. A nice day of diving was enjoyed by all aboard. The crew fired up the grill back at the dock and we stayed to chat and enjoy a BBQ.







on the Gypsy Blood. This trip was set up by John and Courtney in March. It was worth the wait. The early morning drive was 2 hours with no traffic. We arrived at the dock at 6:15AM for a 7AM sail time. The boat was spacious with plenty of room for the 16 divers. We set out for the Stolt Dagali but were beat to the wreck by another dive boat. Other wrecks were discussed but due to depth it was decided to dive the Mohawk in 80 ft of water. The Mohawk was a cruise ship that sank in 1935 after a collision with the freighter, Talisman. The wreck was blasted and wire dragged and is a debris field of wreckage across the bottom. It is home to many lobsters and 2 were brought up by lucky divers.

NJHDA is very proud to announce that we have finished improving the appearance of our Monomoy Pulling Boat. The process took several years and was made possible by a geneous \$1,125.00 grant from the Sand Pipers Chapter of the Questers, an international organization of women dedicated to preserving history.


The Monomoy was donated to us by the <u>Cape</u> <u>May Maritime Museum</u>, and was in pretty bad shape when we received it. Some years ago, we fabricated a rolling stand on which the Monomoy could rest. After it was completed, we sought funding to complete the boat's improvement.

Those that participated in the Monomoy project were Dan Lieb, Neil Norrell, Howard Rothweiler, Terry Lieb, Joe Fiorentino, John Besse, Harry Roecker, Frank Macalik and Mike Lavitt.


