

Underwater photographer, Journalist , Film Maker, Tour Leader /Evolution Underwater Imaging & Dive Travel, Captain/Truk Odyssey

### MICHAEL GERKEN presenting "Stuck in Truk"



Gerken, Captain 'Truk Odyssey,' spent 2 years during the COVID-19 pandemic lockdown on in Lagoon, Micronesia. In 1944, US forces sank nearly 50 vessels of the Japanese Fleet while anchored in Truk and the wreckage of those vessels make this site one of the top scuba diving destinations in the world. Since Truk was closed to tourism during those first 2 years of the pandemic, Mike spent his time diving, shooting photos and video, and delivering vaccines to local residents. "Stuck in Truk" is a presentation of the amazing images he created during this unusual time - join us! (continued on next page)

## MEETING PRESENTATION (CON'T)

Mike left the grind of the New York City corporate world in the late 90's to travel the world while working in the diving industry in a variety of capacities. Ten years ago Mike started 'Evolution Dive Travel' using his vast experience to organize and conduct custom dive excursions around the world including Truk Lagoon, Palau. Mexico and North Carolina.



In 2003, Mike discovered his love of underwater photography and cinematography when he began working in Truk Lagoon and diving the famed Japanese WWII shipwrecks. He eventually went on to become captain of the 'Truk Odyssey' where you will presently find him part of the year tending to his guests and photographing the wrecks every chance he gets.



In 2009, Mike became captain of the dive vessel 'Midnight Express' out of Olympus Dive Center in Morehead City, NC. It was here where he discovered his passion for sharks with the prolific sand tiger being the focal point His photography. documentary, "Wreck Denizends of North Carolina", was completed in 2016 and free is to watch on You Tube. In 2014, Mike founded "North Carolina Wreck • Shark Shootout": a photo video contest where attendees come from around the world to compete for prizes and share a mutual love of photography, wrecks and sharks.

Mike has written numerous articles that have been published in *Alert* Diver, Scuba Diving, Diver, Wreck Diver and Sport Diver magazines. addition. he has documentary films to his credit, "The Wreck the SS President Coolidge", released in 2006 and "The Wrecks of Truk Lagoon" released in Both have gone on to be collectibles for divers, history buffs and wreck diving enthusiasts.







### **DIVE RULES AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

### October 8, 2023 ~ Noyack Bay 10:00 AM

- Only a dive knife, any size, can be used for the carving.
- Hollow out the pumpkin ahead of time. You will not have time to gut it underwater and carve also.
- Bring a 5-to-8-pound weight to place inside the pumpkin. They are buoyant and will float.
- There can be no markings on the pumpkin prior to entering the water. That includes drawings and precarving.
- One pumpkin per diver and one diver per pumpkin.
- Anything found underwater can be used to embellish your pumpkin but please respect living things.

Each person will get one vote when the pumpkins are displayed.

## BEACH DIVING SITE INFORMATION

October 2023 Volume 34, Issue 9

### **Old Ponquogue Bridge, Hampton Bays**

Proceed over the bridge on Lighthouse Road in Hampton Bays and turn left onto Dune Road. Immediately make another left and follow this road to the end. The dive site is under the Old Ponquogue Bridge.

### Cedar Beach, Mt. Sinai

The fishing pier is located at the West end of Harbor Beach Rd in Mt. Sinai. Follow this road past the basketball courts, parking lots, and marinas until you arrive at a smaller parking lot. The dive site is underneath the fishing pier. When not diving underneath the fishing pier, the beach next to the basketball court is another option, also located on Harbor Beach Road.

### **Shinnecock West, Hampton Bays**

The site is located on Road H, at the east end of Dune Road in Hampton Bays. If you are familiar with the Ponquogue Bridge, continue straight down Dune Road instead of turning left into the parking lot. The dive site is the Shinnecock inlet, where we will enter on the ocean side where the jetty is.

### U.S.S. Ohio, Greenport

The entrance to the beach is at the south end of Clark Street in Greenport. Street Parking can be found on Clark Street or the adjacent 4th Street. Enter the opening to the beach from Clark Street and follow the beach along to the right. There is a large iron pipe in the sand along with some other metal pieces. Take a compass heading of 120 degrees from there to find the wreck.

#### **Beach 8th Street, Far Rockaway**

The site is located at the south end of Beach 8th Street in Far Rockaway, Queens. Street parking is limited, but additional spots can be found on Beach 9th street, or near the basketball courts on Beach 10th Street. Use Rockaway Manor for GPS directions if necessary.

#### Novack Bay, Novack

The site is located on the north side of Noyack-Long Beach Road. Proceed past Foster Memorial Beach and look for a spot to pull off on the north side of the road. The dive site is street-parking only.

### Stehli Beach, Oyster Bay

Stehli Beach is located at the west end of Bayville Ave before it turns into Bayville Road. Parking can be found in front of the bathhouse, where we will enter the water.

### Oak Beach, Babylon

The old Oak Beach Inn. A large parking lot on North Oak Beach Road. After going over the Robert Moses Bridge and the small draw bridge, turn right onto Ocean Parkway West. You will have to use a turnaround to get onto Ocean Parkway East, where you will then see the parking lot on your right. For GPS directions, use Oak Beach.

### Pirate's Cove, Port Jefferson

The site is now called McAllister County Park. Take Anchorage Road in Port Jefferson to the end. There is a roundabout where gear can be dropped off and about 6 parking spots a small way up the road. Please try to carpool with other divers if planning to attend a club dive here.

## WRECK DIVING 2023 SCHEDULE

The following equipment is <u>required</u> for all wreck dives with The Dive Club: Divers should be comfortable with the use of this gear.

- Secondary Air Source:doubles or pony bottle
- Wreck reel
- Lift bag OR Surface Marker Buoy
- Cutting tool
- Whistle or other sound device
- Strobe

To book a spot on the Sidekick Dive Boat, each diver must have certification for the planned depth of the wreck. **Deep Diving certification** is required for wrecks over 100ft. To book a spot on the Sea Hawk or Sea Turtle, AOW certification is required.

## MONDAY NIGHT SCUBA TRAINING POOL AVAILABLE FARMINGDALE AQUATIC CENTER

Are you a certified scuba diver? If you are, you will be interested in Farmingdale Aquatic Center's Monday Night Scuba program. Every diver wants to keep their Scuba skills at their very best. Living on Long Island, with the diving season as short it is, it can be difficult to keep Scuba skills sharp. Getting into a pool for practice is a great way to keep you skills up. Certified divers can get that pool time in the brand new Farmingdale Aquatic Center.

These 1 1/2 hour pool sessions are an ideal way to keep your skills up-to-date and be ready for your next Scuba diving vacation. The facility, which is brand new, has a 15 foot deep section great for practicing skills, trying out new equipment, working with your dive buddy, the lists goes on...

If you do not own all needed equipment, you can rent what you need from your local dive shop, or through special arrangements with Tiedemann's Diving Center of Levittown. Make sure all your skills are perfect by practicing in the pool. Then your dives will be more fun and safer.

Are you a Scuba Instructor? If you are you can use this facility to teach. The rules are simple. You need to be current with your agency. Each person in your group must be registered (you, your student(s), and any assistants you may have). Farmingdale needs to be listed as an Additional Insured on your instructor liability insurance. Contact Ed at Tiedemann's Diving Center for more details. You can even work out rental equipment for your students.

The sessions take place on Monday evenings, from 7:30 PM to 9:30 PM. To participate you must have a nationally recognized scuba certification. The level of certification must be Open Water Diver or higher. Use of any highly specialized equipment, (like a dry suits, full face masks, rebreathers), requires certification in that area. If you are a student you must be with your instructor at all times in the water. Anyone under the age of 18 year must have a parent with them in the pool area.

Has it been some time since you have been diving? We can make arrangements for a Scuba Update on your first pool session. Then you have two more sessions to practice.

The cost is \$100 per diver for the three-night session. This makes it very affordable. Each of the sessions includes three pool sessions. Four separate sessions will be offer in the Fall and Winter 2023/24. Current dates are below. The number of participants is very limited. Make Monday Night Scuba a great way for you to enjoy your Scuba Diving year round.

Signing up could not be simpler. Contact Ed Tiedemann at Tiedemann's Diving Center (56 Gardeners Ave. Levittown - 516-796-6560 - <a href="https://www.tdcscuba.com">www.tdcscuba.com</a>) and he can sign you up in person at the shop or over the phone.




