
March 5, 2024 Dive Club Meeting Presentation

Jennifer Sellitti: On the Precipice of WWI: The Legacy of U-53



March 2024

Join us in welcoming Jennifer Sellitti: the Communications Volume 35, Issue 3 Director of Atlantic Wreck Salvage and a regular crew member aboard D/V Tenacious. She manages topside operations during dive expeditions, conducts historical research on both the ships Tenacious dives and ships that are the subject of new projects for the team, and leads the team's effort to educate the public about the importance of shipwreck discovery and salvage. She is a certified diver and a U.S.C.G. licensed ship captain.



German U-53 Commander Hans Rose made an unannounced visit to the Commandant of the U.S. Second Naval District in Newport Harbor in the morning of October 7, 1916.

America had not vet entered WWI. After a tense visit, Rose returned to his **U-boat**

sank five British and Norwegian ships in the waters South of Nantucket. Powerless to retaliate, the Americans could only watch as U-53 blew the Stephano, Strathdene, West Point, Bloomersdijk, and Christian Knudsen to the depths.

D/V Tenacious and our partners have been locating, exploring, documenting these historic wrecks. In September 2020, D/V Tenacious located the last remaining U-53 casualty, West Point, and dived her for the first time. The crew returned in August of 2022 and 2023 to document the wreck in a series of dives and recover artifacts.



IN MEMORY OF BOB RUSNACK

August 29, 1944 - February 7, 2024

Bob Rusnak wore many hats. He was loving husband to Kathleen, married on 10/20/73, father of Lorraine Rusnak McKean (son-in-law Sean,) and Donald Rusnak, (daughter-in-law Kaleigh,) Brother of Virginia Rusnak Strong, grandfather of Jaxon Rusnak and Chase McKean and friend to a countless number of people all over the country, yes, even internationally. Growing up in Sound Beach, NY, he lived only a few blocks from the water a place that influenced the direction of his entire life.

Educated in the Merchant Marine
Academy in Ft. Schuyler, NY, transferring to
C.W. Post, he graduated with a Mechanical
Engineering Degree. It seemed that Bob could
fix anything and if he did not have the correct
part that he needed right away he would figure out
something to substitute in its place. It would work

better than the original part. He was employed by Grumman Aerospace for 34 years becoming a contracted consultant when the famous F-14 program was transferred to Baltimore, MD. He was required to move so he spent weekdays in MD and weekends home, or traveling for one of his many interests, and there was an enormous variety of interests for this complex, intelligent man.

When their children were young, Bob began to collect model Lionel trains and would set them up across the living room floor. He eventually had a large collection which years later he would set up during the holidays for the children at the International Baptist Church, Stony Brook, NY, and more recently at the Three Village Church, East Setauket, NY.

Fascinated with guitars, he also began collecting them, again accumulating many and learning how to play was a fond pastime. He would play for his own entertainment, and for services at those same churches in which he had set up the trains. He had a favorite guitar which he named Gilda.

Kathleen and Bob both loved speed and traveled around the country to watch, and participate, in stock cars races, as well as competitive hydroplane speed boat races, bringing their children with them and camping wherever they went. If not in the racing driver's seat himself, with his mechanical ability, Bob was also happy working in the pits while Kathleen served as the score keeper. Bob won the American Power Boat Association's U.S. National Hydroplane Championship 250 cc Class in 1977 followed by numerous additional championships and trophies. His daughter married Sean McKean, a nationally famous hydroplane boat racer which further fueled Bob's love for this dangerous competitive sport.

Bob was collector of all things he found interesting, amassing a huge amount of "old" power boat motors, single engine mostly, fixing and restoring them to new to display and trade with other collectors.

For many years he worked repairing and rebuilding engines for boat owners particularly those connected with Ralph's Marina in Mount Sinai, NY, where he and

Kathleen formed a lifetime friendship with the owners, passing many social hours there, as well as taking their own

craft out to cruise on Long Island Sound.

Ultimately, for Bob it was all about the water from his beginning. He loved spearfishing and snorkeling, watching Sea Hunt in the 1950's which led 14-year-old Bob to experiment with ways to breathe and see underwater, trying hoses and buckets and all the dangerous things young boys do until 1956, when his father, concerned for Bob's safety, enrolled him a YMCA



scuba diving course in Jamaica, NY. His instructors, were June and Roy Kieser, famed diving pioneers in their own right. Bob creatively converted fire extinguishers to scuba tanks.

Eventually in the 1970's, with his son Don, he came across a double hose regulator which they learned to repair, rebuild and restore. A new collection began. He started diving with them and the accompanying tanks. This was followed with collecting antique diving helmets, and the gear that accompanied them leading, and of course, to diving in them. He joined the Northeast Working Equipment Group travelling around with them dry dressing people in the antique Mark V Helmet and "dress," as it was called, and did the same at enumerable Dive Clubs all over Long Island. This later was followed with giving people the opportunity to dive in this 220 lbs of gear. With the support of many fellow hard hat divers, he introduced people to the unique experience of Mark V diving in many places on Long Island, including the Long Island Aquarium, NY, Dutch Springs, PA, Brownstone Quarry, CT, and the Living Seas in Epcot, Disney World, FL to name a few, accumulating a great following of people with similar interests.

In addition, Bob has done educational exhibits and contributed antique dive gear in Long Island Maritime Museum, The Long Island Aquarium, the History of Diving Museum, FL Keys, The Museum of New Jersey Maritime History, The Maritime Museum, Newport News, VA, and the Diver's Academy International, NJ, Our World Underwater, Chicago, IL, The Boston Rovers, MA, Beneath the Sea Exposition in the Meadowlands (BTS), NJ, The and the Dive Equipment Manufacture's Association, (DEMA), Las Vegas, NV. He assisted the Long Island Diver's Association, (LIDA), with transporting their equipment and display materials to shows for exhibits and additionally, he arranged for transportation of the Historical Bathesphere from the Aquarium in Coney Island, NY, to be exhibited at the Divers Academy and BTS, and for the Oceaneering Jim Suit to be delivered to the Maritime Museum, Newport News, VA, for exhibit, and to its ultimate final destination in the History of Diving Museum in Ilsamorada, FL.

In his life Bob received much recognition in each field of endeavor although he never touted it. As a Founding Benefactor Member of the Historical Diving Society, (HDS), he was a very active member and many of his exhibits were at events on their behalf. He was awarded their prestigious E.R. Cross Award in 2001, for his many contributions to them and the diving community, although Bob was exceedingly modest and never sought fame and fortune. He simply enjoyed life and doing what he loved to do. To him that was the "right" reason to do things and Bob always sought people who did the same. In his opinion the "right" reason was to share his knowledge of what he loved and make others happy.

If one could simply define a trusted, true friend, it would be Bob Rusnak.

Divers should be comfortable with the use of this gear.


To book a spot on the Sidekick Dive Boat, each diver must have certification for the planned depth of the wreck. **Deep Diving certification is required for wrecks over 100ft.** To book a spot on the Sea Hawk or Sea Turtle, AOW certification is required.

Lake Hydra to open for scuba diving with limited access in April

BETHLEHEM, Pa. - Lake Hydra, the Northampton County scuba-diving venue, will open April 20 with limited access.



All activities at the 50-acre quarry lake must be arranged in advance. At first, Lake Hydra will be for classes and first-responder training only.

"A diver can't just show up and dive, it has to be a class," Ken Kraft, one of the Lake Hydra partners, said Saturday. He reiterated that all activities must be scheduled.

The property, formerly known as Dutch Springs, was acquired by developer Trammell Crow for the construction of two warehouses. Access to the water could have been eliminated. Then Trammell Crow worked out an agreement with Kraft and Jim Folk of Atlantis Aquatics, Bethlehem Township, to save the lake for the scuba community.

"I can't say enough about Trammell Crow and what they did for the dive community," Kraft said Saturday. Work continues on Lake Hydra amenities, Kraft, now a member of Northampton County Council, said.

The site, known for its depths and clear water, could have been lost to the diving community. Instead, training for divers and rescue teams will continue at one of the few East Coast inland scuba venues.

Kraft said divers should check the Lake Hydra website (<u>lakehydra.com/</u>) for more information. It will be updated as services at the lake are expanded.

Lake Hydra is located at 4733 Hanoverville Road in Lower Nazareth Township. The property, including the warehouses, also extends into Bethlehem Township.

Ocean Conservation Scholarship

SeaSmart is offering scholarship opportunities for qualified high school students to get Open Water certified as well as conduct unique ocean conservation and marine science activities alongside Baja Sur's best scientists and conservationists this July. In an effort to address the underrepresentation of female and minority demographics in the marine sciences, we are seeking applicants for scholarships covering this summer's program fees.

Seeking High School minority women (and nonbinary people!) with an interest in ocean conservation, marine biology, and SCUBA for scholarship assistance to attend SeaSmart's Summer 2024 Program.

Talent and passion are evenly distributed, but opportunity is not. SeaSmart hopes to provide qualified students with an opportunity to explore their interest in ocean conservation, marine biology and SCUBA diving. This scholarship is offered to address the underrepresentation of women and minorities in marine science studies and will award funding to support their participation in the SeaSmart Summer 2024 program.

HOW THE SCHOLARSHIP WORKS: The SeaSmart team will review applications and choose scholars based on demonstrated interest in marine science, ocean conservation, and/or related fields. The scholarship covers all program expenses of the summer trip as described below.

WE'RE LOOKING FOR FEMALE (AND NONBINARY) STUDENT APPLICANTS WHO:

- * Are a member of a minority group(s). (Including but not limited to: Black, Latina, Native American, LGBTQ+.)
- ** We are excited to hear your unique story! Have a demonstrated interest in marine science, ocean conservation and/or a related field as well as in learning to SCUBA dive.
- * Are currently enrolled as a high school student in the United States.

FAQ's

Who will determine the scholarship recipient? Scholarship applications will be reviewed and the recipient will be determined by the Leadership Team of SeaSmart.

Why is this scholarship targeting women and minorities? Historically, women, people of color and other minorities have been underrepresented in marine sciences. Whether by redirection in their interests and studies, or underexposure to experiences leading to potential pursuit of these studies, these students generally require assistance in obtaining access to such topics.

How much money, outside of the scholarship, is required to attend the summer program? Airfare to and from the program location, which cannot be quoted as it fluctuates, will need to be funded by the attendee. In addition, the PADI Open Water eLearning pre-work will need to be funded by the attendee. Currently, the cost of this is \$200, though is subject to PADI's pricing. Money for incidentals, such as airport snacks and beverages, souvenirs, etc. will be self-funded as well.

NOTE: Thanks to a generous partnership with the LiveLikeJayG3 scholarship, one scholarship recipient may qualify for airfare expenses up to \$800 as well. See application for more info.

Are any prerequisites required to attend? You do not need to be SCUBA certified to attend this program, as SCUBA training and potential certification is included. Students for this program must be minimally 15 years old when the program begins.

- I further save and hold harmless said Dive Club and Released Parties from any claim or lawsuit by me, my family, estate, heirs, or assigns, arising out of my enrollment and participation in Club events including both claims arising during said event or after said event.
- I further understand that skin diving and scuba diving are physically strenuous activities and that I will be exerting myself during any diving activity, and that if I am injured as a result of a heart attack, panic, hyperventilation, etc., that I expressly assume the risk of said injuries and that I will not hold the above listed individuals or companies responsible for the same.
- I further state that I am of lawful age and legally competent to sign this liability release, or that I have acquired the written consent of my parent or guardian.
- I acknowledge scuba dividing is an activity that is done with a buddy. I will not make a solo dive during a Dive Club event unless I am certified to do so by an accredited training agency and an I am equipped to make this dive safely.
- I understand that the terms herein are contractual and are not a mere recital, and that I have signed this document of my
 own free act.
- I acknowledge that The Dive Club does not provide buddies, gear, transportation, training, or professional advice pertaining to the sport of scuba diving. However, the dive sponsors will do their best to help club members find what they need for a dive by setting up email groups to allow individual club members to coordinate rides, buddies, and rental gear, if necessary.
- The Dive Club does not vet divers or make any determination about whether any diver is qualified to do any given dive. This decision is entirely up to the individual diver, as well as any external dive operator, such as a dive boat captain or resort operator. It is important to evaluate your current experience when making the decision to dive. If you only have experience diving in warm waters with optimal visibility, you should consider the additional challenges associated with northeast diving before making your decision. I expressly assume the risk of any injury or illness for each and every dive that I determine to make and hold harmless for the same the above listed companies and individuals.



- I acknowledge that for planned boat charters, the minimum certification and equipment requirements listed in our newsletter are the requirements of the boat captains. Please contact them directly if you have any questions about the suitability of a dive for you.
- I understand that DAN (Divers Alert Network) Insurance or other similar diving accident insurance policies are available to me if I choose to acquire this. I acknowledge that it is my own responsibility to educate myself on the available policies and choose the one, if any, that is appropriate for me. I understand that without this, I will be responsible for any medical bills or damages to my equipment that I incur.
- I recognize that I may receive false or misleading information from one or more club members or non-members pertaining to the relative difficulty of a dive or my ability to safely participate in or perform a dive. Additionally, I acknowledge that one or more club members or non-members may negligently approve of my dive plan, including preparation or intended dive plan, the condition of my equipment, my ability to use my equipment, or proper use of equipment. I understand and agree that I am responsible for determining whether I am capable of executing a dive safely, whether I have sufficient information regarding my own physical abilities and the intended dive to base this decision, as well as whether my equipment is in proper working condition and is sufficient for the intended dive. I release The Dive Club and all co-signers who by signing this waiver similarly release me from negligent acts or omissions of this nature.
