An Important Update To Membership Fees

Dutch Springs

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The Dive Club at Dutch Springs

June 26-27, 2021

The Dive Club headed to Dutch Springs in Bethlehem, PA for a weekend of camping and diving. The weather was warm and sunny. The water was a comfortable 70 degrees on the surface and 60 degrees at 40 ft.

With 20-foot visibility, the 16 club members enjoyed diving on the sunken attractions.

There are multiple shipwrecks, a fire truck, a challenger airplane and even a Sikorsky helicopter.

The divers were able to complete 2-day dives and a night dive on Saturday and 8 club members stayed overnight to make 2 more dives on Sunday.

- Dutch Springs is only 2 ½ hours from Nassau County.
- Admission is \$54 for the day.
- There is a water park and climbing attraction for non-diving family members.

My first memory of scuba dive was when I was about ten years old. My father and I were walking in Bay Shore alone main street when I spotted a dive shop. I do not remember the name, but I do remember the coral encrusted artifacts and big dive knife in the window. I begged my father to go in and look around. We talked to the shop attendant about scuba diving and how to learn to dive.

Obviously, I was too young to learn, so my father bought me the training manual and said I could practice the skills in our pool and once old enough I could take the course. The book was "The New Science of Skin and Scuba." I quickly read the book and began practicing with my skills with a mask, fins and snorkel, which to say the least were not professional grade. Being ten I quickly lost interest in snorkeling around my pool and moved on to other things. It turns out that dive shop was a famous commercial training center known the world over.

Fast forward a few years, I am 21 years old and newly married with a 6-month-old daughter. My brother and sister-in law decided to take scuba lessons at a shop in Bay Shore called Diver's Way.

I decided to join them. When my father found out, he decided to send my young brother John with me.

He said this way you will always have a dive buddy, and this turned out to be true. The course was over, and I was a newly certified diver now I needed to go diving. My brother and I tried several dive sites, Cedar Beach Mt Sini, The Bridge, Sore Thumb Fire Island, we started to become frustrated, so I decided to take an advance diver course, and that is when I became a diver and not just someone who goes diving.

During my 21 years of teaching scuba, it always amazed me how many people would take the course, get certified and never go diving. Some people would dive a couple of times then fade away finding other interests. I have often wondered what keeps people diving and how I became addicted to the underwater world. I am going to try convey some of the things that kept me diving and hopefully it will help you keep the passion for diving alive.

Have a mission!

I remember when I owned my dive shop, I realized I needed to get people out diving. During my research over the years, I found out that the navy used to test dummy torpedoes in an area of the Peconic bay and had lost a few during the process. So, I organized a search for the missing torpedoes. I think I had about fifty divers searching for the torpedoes. Of course, I already knew where one was since I search the area prior to the event. Everyone was excited and had a great time and went on to do many dives with us.

Bottle diving

Bottle diving is always a fun activity. You can dive off the beach and find many old bottles. The fun is not only finding them, but cleaning and researching the origin and history of the bottles.

Go to dive shows and seminars!

Dive shows like Beneath the Sea or the Boston Sea Rovers is a great way to learn about new dive

destinations and equipment. The seminars can be informative and often inspire people to get out diving. Also, this is a great way to make connection in the dive community.

By Far the best reason to keep diving is the social aspect of diving.

Probably the number one indicator whether someone is going to continue to dive, is whether they

develop connections in the dive community. Most of the fun of diving is sharing the experience with

your friends. I have met many of my closest friends because of diving. Many of which go back to that

very first advanced diver course. So, join a club, take a class and get out diving.

I am sure there are many more ways to keep the passion for diving alive. It's like a marriage, you have

to work at it, some dives are good, and some dives are not so good, but when you have that spectacular dive, it makes you want to keep diving looking for the next great experience.

So, get out and dive!
