An Important Update To Membership Fees

- As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, there have been limitations on the 2020 dive season. The Dive Club will honor those fees paid during the 2020 season and apply them towards the upcoming 2021 season.
- Going forward, an individual membership will be \$25.
- A family membership will be \$35.
- Early renewal will be offered every November and December for active club members. A \$5 discount will be applied for the upcoming season so that the fee will be \$20 for an individual membership and \$30 for a family membership.

Bob Rusnack was there to open the gate for us and Nick Sinnot manned the grill for the hungry, cold divers. Shore support was on hand with Rusty Lukeman and Courtney Lyons. Thanks for tackling the stairs to bring us the extra weights. Leilani Elias stopped by to say "hi" with Zima.

It was a nice kick off dive with sunny 62-degree weather and no wind or current to challenge us. We had a mix of dry and wetsuit divers fine tuning their equipment for more dives to come. The vis was a clear 15 ft. The seaweed is growing and there are signs of life returning.













Fort Pond Bay was the site for the second club dive of the season on April 24, 2021. The water is still cold at 49-degrees and the visibility is good at 10 feet. Three club members met at 10 AM in Montauk for the dive, Rick Baresich, Mary Davis and Ken Murphy. We geared up and hit the water for a nice 30-minute dive around the fishing pier. Dolphin Fun Fact



Dolphins sleep only with one half of the brain at a time, and just one eye closed. This unusual form of sleep is called "uni-hemispheric slow-wave sleep." Also known as deep sleep, slow-wave sleep is a type of sleep thought to help the brain consolidate new memories and recover from its daily activities.

There are three main reasons why dolphins sleep in this way. First, dolphins would likely drown if they didn't keep half of their brain active, because they constantly need to surface for oxygen. Second, they are able to look out for danger while they rest.

Third, this type of sleep allows a dolphin to keep up with certain physiological processes, such as the muscle movement, that helps the warm-blooded mammal maintain the body heat it needs to survive in the frigid ocean.
