## SEASMART **BONAIRE 2025**

November 2024 Volume 35, Issue 11

Registration for SeaSmart's July 2025 ocean conservation, marine and SCUBA middle/high school students' and adult women's programs in Bonaire has opened to the public. SeaSmart limits the week to 12 participants due to the custom nature of our activities.

program will include introduction to 60 species of fish over a three-day workshop, designed to build foundational knowledge in marine biodiversity and species identification. Through combination of interactive lectures. field practice. and guided underwater surveys, participants will learn to recognize and differentiate species fish and behaviors common to the region. By the end of the workshop, participants will be ready to take part in the widely recognized REEF (Reef **Environmental** Education Foundation) citizen science program. As certified surveyors, participants will play a crucial role in gathering data that supports marine conservation efforts worldwide long after their SeaSmart week.

Bonaire's most important turtle nesting site is Klein Bonaire, Every season, approximately 50-70 sea turtle nests are laid in this area SeaSmart program participants will be trained to patrol Bonaire for the beach of Klein nests, and possibly hatched excavate the nest to collect data on species and hatching success. Our address will protection of the many small nesting colonies is critical for the

maintenance of hatchling production and genetic diversity.

During the program, participants will learn about the importance of active marine protection, Bonaire's Stichting Nationale Parken Bonaire (STINAPA Bonaire, organized Bonaire's government in 1962), a non-governmental, nonprofit foundation dedicated to managing, protecting, restoring, promoting and educating about the resources. biodiversity and values of Bonaire's nature and what it is accomplishing. Along with Manta conservation, we will also learn about the rich history the island and tour some important sites.

The following equipment is <u>required</u> for all wreck dives with The Dive Club:

- Secondary Air Source:
  ~ doubles or pony bottle
- Wreck reel
- Lift bag OR Surface Marker Buoy
- Cutting tool
- Whistle or other sound device
- Strobe

Divers should be comfortable with the use of this gear.

To book a spot on the Sidekick Dive Boat, each diver must have certification for the planned depth of the wreck. **Deep Diving certification is required for wrecks over 100ft.** To book a spot on the Sea Hawk or Sea Turtle, AOW certification is required.
