# MEETING MINUTES Volume 35, Issue 10

#### September 10, 2024

- ⇔ 8 PM: Mary calls meeting to order
- In attendance: At start of meeting 10 members, by end of meeting, 16 members were present
- Beach 8th street this past weekend was the club dive it was a nice 4 feet of visibility and 70°
- Minutes from August's meeting were approved.
- New Members: One new member recognized and introduced, Kayla Arbuckle.
- Membership Renewal: Renewals will start in October. Bill will be sending out email with instructions.
- Dive of Sunday September 8 was discussed when due to conditions, dive was moved to Old Ponguogue Bridge.
- Next Beach dive was scheduled at this time for Sunday September 15 at 9:30 am at Secret Beach. Mary reminded those present that LIDA waiver must be completed before diving. If a waiver was previously filed this year a new one is not required.
- ⇒ Pumpkin carving contest: Will be held on October 13th at Cedar Beach, Mt. Sinai Beach. Rules and process were discussed. Hopefully, there will be a barbeque if someone can bring a grill. Dives will be conducted from the beach area. It was disclosed that the area near the fishing pier is no longer good for diving due to the installation of large rocks and boulders which restrict access to the water.
- Death By Diving Dinner; Possible date- Second Tuesday in November. Dependent on determining a site for dinner and if winners can make it that day.
- Wreck Diving- Last wreck dive of the season was on Halftime on Sunday September 8. It was a rough ride and after reaching the Oregon it was decided that condition were unsafe so the dive was moved to the Mandy Ray, which being closer to shore had better conditions.
- Additional note on the Halftime- The Halftime will up for sale, so we may be losing another local dive boat. The owner will first be putting it up for sale as a dive boat. If there are no takers, he will then be willing to sell it to anyone. If however, he does not sell the boat by the start of the 2025 dive season, he will start to book dive charters for next year. If the Halftime is lost for diving, the only local dive boats will be the Sea Turtle and the Side Kick. This may require us to make more dives out of New Jersey (The Gypsy Blood, etc.).
- Regarding the Side Kick, Barry did have a group dive the railcars from the Side Kick on August 24th.



# UNDERWATER PUMPKIN CARVING

# October 13, 2024 - 9AM @ Cedar Beach, Mount Sinai

- Only a dive knife, any size, can be used for the carving.
- Hollow out the pumpkin ahead of time. You will not have time to gut it underwater and carve also.
- Bring a 5-to-8-pound weight to place inside the pumpkin. They are buoyant and will float.
- There can be no markings on the pumpkin prior to entering the water. That includes drawings and pre-carving.
- One pumpkin per diver and one diver per pumpkin.
- Anything found underwater can be used to embellish your pumpkin but please respect living things.
- Each person will get one vote when the pumpkins are displayed.
- if you don't dive you still get to vote.

The New Jersey Shipwreck Museum at InfoAge announces the unveiling of our newly restored U.S. Coast Guard beach cart circa 1930.



The effort took two years and was funded through various sources which included donations of not only money, but through volunteer efforts and donations of materials such as fasteners and rope.

The unveiling will take place from 2 to 4 pm on Sunday, October 6, in Building 9034 - the future home of the New Jersey Shipwreck Museum at InfoAge.

Light refreshments will be available. The shipwreck museum is located in the InfoAge Science and History Museums on 2201 Marconi Road, Wall, NJ.

Admission to InfoAge is \$12 for adults and \$8 for children. No RSVP required.

The "beach cart" refers to a piece of equipment used by the United States Life-Saving Service and later by the early United States Coast Guard for land-based near-shore rescue operations. The cart would be used to move vital life-saving equipment from a nearby station to a wreck site up to several miles away - all moved by manpower and later by truck after the invention of the internal combustion engine. The cart included all of the equipment needed to rig and operate a breeches buoy apparatus or the metallic life car (also on exhibit), which was the means by which rescuers on a beach could evacuate shipwreck survivors from the ship to shore.

During the event, we will discuss how the cart was acquired and restored. It's a very interesting story that shows the cleverness and ingenuity of our volunteer staff and supporters. Donations are always welcomed.

The following equipment is <u>required</u> for all wreck dives with The Dive Club:

- Secondary Air Source:doubles or pony bottle
- Wreck reel
- Lift bag OR Surface Marker Buoy
- Cutting tool
- Whistle or other sound device
- Strobe

Divers should be comfortable with the use of this gear.

To book a spot on the Sidekick Dive Boat, each diver must have certification for the planned depth of the wreck. **Deep Diving certification is required for wrecks over 100ft.** To book a spot on the Sea Hawk or Sea Turtle, AOW certification is required.

#### LIABILITY RELEASE AND EXPRESS ASSUMPTION OF RISK

This is an important legal document. You may wish to consult an attorney prior to signing it.

This release may be used against you in a court of law if you sue any released person or party.

Please read car	refully, fill in all blanks and initial each paragraph before signing. Incomplete forms will not be accepted.
l,	, hereby affirm that I have been advised and thoroughly informed through my
open water tr	aining of the inherent risks of skin and scuba diving.

- Further, I understand that diving with compressed air involves certain inherent risks; decompression sickness, embolism, or other hyperbaric injuries can occur that require treatment in a recompression chamber. I further understand that any trips of any kind (diving or non-diving), whether sponsored or not, by The Dive Club may be conducted at a site that is remote, either by time or distance or both, from such a recompression chamber. I still choose to proceed with such diving activities in spite of the absence of a recompression chamber in proximity to the dive site(s).
- I understand and agree that neither The Dive Club or any of their respective board members, officers, agents or assigns (hereinafter referred to as "Released Parties"), may be held liable or responsible in any way for any injury, death, or other damages to me or my family, heirs, or assigns that may occur as a result of my participation in any Dive Club activity, or as a result of negligence of any party, including the Released Parties, whether passive or active.
- In consideration of being allowed to become a member of The Dive Club I hereby personally assume all risks in connection with diving or non-diving activity from any harm, injury or damage that may befall on me, including all risks connected therewith, whether foreseen or unforeseen.
- I further save and hold harmless said Dive Club and Released Parties from any claim or lawsuit by me, my family, estate, heirs, or assigns, arising out of my enrollment and participation in Club events including both claims arising during said event or after said event.
- I further understand that skin diving and scuba diving are physically strenuous activities and that I will be exerting myself during any diving activity, and that if I am injured as a result of a heart attack, panic, hyperventilation, etc., that I expressly assume the risk of said injuries and that I will not hold the above listed individuals or companies responsible for the same.
- I further state that I am of lawful age and legally competent to sign this liability release, or that I have acquired the written consent of my parent or guardian.
- I acknowledge scuba dividing is an activity that is done with a buddy. I will not make a solo dive during a Dive Club event unless I am certified to do so by an accredited training agency and an I am equipped to make this dive safely.
- I understand that the terms herein are contractual and are not a mere recital, and that I have signed this document of my
  own free act.
- I acknowledge that The Dive Club does not provide buddies, gear, transportation, training, or professional advice pertaining to the sport of scuba diving. However, the dive sponsors will do their best to help club members find what they need for a dive by setting up email groups to allow individual club members to coordinate rides, buddies, and rental gear, if necessary.
- The Dive Club does not vet divers or make any determination about whether any diver is qualified to do any given dive. This decision is entirely up to the individual diver, as well as any external dive operator, such as a dive boat captain or resort operator. It is important to evaluate your current experience when making the decision to dive. If you only have experience diving in warm waters with optimal visibility, you should consider the additional challenges associated with northeast diving before making your decision. I expressly assume the risk of any injury or illness for each and every dive that I determine to make and hold harmless for the same the above listed companies and individuals.



- I acknowledge that for planned boat charters, the minimum certification and equipment requirements listed in our newsletter are the requirements of the boat captains. Please contact them directly if you have any questions about the suitability of a dive for you.
- I understand that DAN (Divers Alert Network) Insurance or other similar diving accident insurance policies are available to me if I choose to acquire this. I acknowledge that it is my own responsibility to educate myself on the available policies and choose the one, if any, that is appropriate for me. I understand that without this, I will be responsible for any medical bills or damages to my equipment that I incur.
- I recognize that I may receive false or misleading information from one or more club members or non-members pertaining to the relative difficulty of a dive or my ability to safely participate in or perform a dive. Additionally, I acknowledge that one or more club members or non-members may negligently approve of my dive plan, including preparation or intended dive plan, the condition of my equipment, my ability to use my equipment, or proper use of equipment. I understand and agree that I am responsible for determining whether I am capable of executing a dive safely, whether I have sufficient information regarding my own physical abilities and the intended dive to base this decision, as well as whether my equipment is in proper working condition and is sufficient for the intended dive. I release The Dive Club and all co-signers who by signing this waiver similarly release me from negligent acts or omissions of this nature.
