


11:15-12 Noon: History of Mee-Ow

The Mee-Ow Show at 50: From Cultural Rebellion to Comedy Institution

Presented by Joseph Radding (Mee-Ow '74 surrealist-in-residence)

An entertaining and academic overview of the history of the Mee-Ow Show, the longest-running student improv comedy show in the world.

This is a preview of the upcoming book by the same title, co-authored by Mr. Radding and Paul W. Warshauer. Publication by the Northwestern University Press is expected October 2024.



Joseph B. Radding was the Surrealist-in-Residence of the first Mee-Ow Show. He is an artist, graphic designer, writer, former agency creative director, martial artist, medieval reenactor, and lecturer in Integrated Marketing Communications at Eastern Michigan University. His previous book, *Suits plus Creatives*, is a textbook about interdisciplinary collaboration. He lives in Michigan with his brilliant wife Marilee, their extraverted basset hound Hank, and their two cats Bella and Chaucer.



Paul W. Warshauer co-founded the Mee-Ow Show. He owns and operates Grande Venues, a real estate development company that acquires, restores, rehabilitates, or operates historic old theaters and buildings. He also has written, produced and performed over 450 original murder mystery entertainments across all 50 states under the company name Murders4Fun. He lives in Minnesota.

Mee-Ow alumni from across the decades share how their involvement in the show impacted their careers as writers and producers of television and movies.

Eric Gilliland (cast/director '84) has written for TV shows such as *Who's The Boss?, The Wonder Years, Roseanne* - where enough people got fired that he eventually wound up as executive producer/ head writer. Other credits include *That 70's Show, My Boys, Mr. Sunshine*. Taking a year off from TV and making money, Eric produced the documentary *God Grew Tired Of Us: The Story of The Lost Boys Of Sudan* which won both the Grand Jury Prize and the Audience Award at the Sundance Film Festival and "Best Documentary" at both the Deauville and Galway Film Festivals. Last year, he wrote and executive produced a 20-part "radio show" adventure series for the whole family

called *The Cinnamon Bear* for Audible. It was saluted as one of the top 100 podcasts of the year and stars pretty much everyone you've ever heard of.

Liz Cackowski (cast '97, '98) is a comedy writer, producer, and actress whose credits include Saturday Night Live, Community, Forgetting Sarah Marshall, Neighbors, Funny or Die Presents, Last Man on Earth, Wine Country, and Girls 5 Eva. Most recently she co-created Paperkite Podcasts with Amy Poehler. In addition to the Mee-Ow Show, she is a proud alum of Boom Chicago and The Second City.





Jen D'Angelo (cast '09, cast/co-director '10) wrote and produced the Critics Choice Award winning feature *Quiz Lady* starring Awkwafina, Sandra Oh, and Will Ferrell which premiered at TIFF in 2023 (PGA & WGA Award Nominee) as well as Amazon's genre-bending *Totally Killer* (WGA Nomination) directed by Nahnatchka Khan. She wrote the Emmy Award-Nominated *Hocus Pocus 2*, which broke the record for views for a streaming movie in its debut weekend. She's worked on feature projects at Universal, Paramount, Netflix, New Line, and Amazon. Jen was a Co-Executive Producer on *The Young Rock* starring Dwayne Johnson. Additional credits include *Solar Opposites* (Hulu), *Happy Together, LA to Vegas, Workaholics, The Millers*, and *Cougar*

Town. She's performed on Comedy Central's Adam Devine's House Party and starred opposite Nicole Byer on MTV's *Loosely Exactly Nicole*.

Abby Kohn (cast '93) is a director and writer. After graduating from Northwestern, she earned an MFA in Film Production from the University of Southern California. Just a few months out of school, she and her writing partner sold their romantic comedy *Never Been Kissed* to Fox 2000 and Flower Films. The script was rushed into production with Drew Barrymore leading the cast. Abby then made her directorial debut with her original script *I Feel Pretty*, starring Amy Schumer and Michelle Williams. She and her writing partner are currently developing their feature comedy *NOOBS* with Bette Midler attached to star. Abby also co-wrote *He's Just Not That Into You, Valentine's Day, The Vow,* and *How to Be Single,* which together have grossed nearly 800 million dollars in worldwide box office.

Liz Kruger (stage manager '85, producer '86) is a writer, director, and creator. She and her writing partner/husband Craig Shapiro most recently served as showrunners of the CW's *Charmed* reboot and executive produced the pilot of the CBS/ P+ hit So *Help Me Todd*, starring Marcia Gay Harden and Skyler Astin. Liz and Craig got their start in features, penning scripts for a variety of studios and talent including Reese Witherspoon and Scarlett Johansson.They created and EP'd the USA Network dramedy *Necessary Roughness* and co-created the CBS sci-fi thriller Salvation. Additional EP credits include Steven Spielberg sci-fi series *Extant*,



The Girlfriend's Guide to Divorce, Star Trek: Discovery, as well as writing for ABC's *Pan Am* and *Miami Medical.* Their production company is aptly named "Still Married Productions." (Because they are.)



Robin Shorr (cast '96, '97) has been writing sitcoms for the last 19 years. Her credits include Samantha Who?, Workaholics, The Middle, Galavant and The Carmichael Show. She served as showrunner for the Disney+ show Diary of a Future President and as Co-Executive Producer of the Peacock reboot of Punky Brewster. In addition to being on staff, Robin has developed pilots for ABC, FOX, and HULU and co-hosts Los Feliz the Podcast with comedian Morgan Murphy. Robin's latest podcast project with Girls showrunner Jenni Konner launches later this year.

Justin Spitzer (cast '98) created and executive produced *Superstore*, which ran on NBC for six seasons (2015-2021), and *American Auto* (starring Ana Gasteyer), which ran on NBC for two seasons (2021-2023). Currently, he is executive producing *St. Denis Medical*, a comedy mockumentary he co-created which is set to air on NBC next year. His other credits include seven seasons writing and producing *The Office*, as well as stints on *Scrubs*, *Committed*, *Courting Alex*, and *Mulaney*.

Adrian Wenner (cast '93, '94, cast/co-director '95) is a writer and producer. He and his writing partner (and fellow Mee-Ow alum) Ethan Sandler have worked on *New Girl, Man With a Plan, Whitney,* and *My Boys.* They've written several television pilots and have developed feature projects for Scott Rudin, Mike White, and Steven Spielberg. He and Sandler also wrote and starred in the two-man show *Epitaph* which won Best Sketch at the HBO Comedy Festival and was nominated for the Perrier Award at the Edinburgh Fringe. Adrian has also written on *Grey's Anatomy* and adapted the bestselling novel *Thursday Murder Club* for the screen.





Jason Winer (cast '94) is a producer and director best known for the pilot of *Modern Family*, for which he won the DGA Award for "Outstanding Direction of a Comedy Series." He was the producing director of *Modern Family's* first season, receiving an Emmy, Peabody, PGA Award, and more. Over the course of his career, Winer has directed 2 feature films plus 8 television pilots that have gone on to series, including *Don't Trust the B* in Apartment 23, Life in Pieces, Single Parents, Perfect Harmony, The Big Leap,* and most recently *The Santa Clauses* for Disney+. He is an alumnus of Improv Olympic in Chicago.

Mee-Ow alumni from the '80's and '90's, now decades into careers outside of Hollywood, share how their experiences in Mee-Ow still impact their work. More recent alumni from the '00's and '10's also discuss the challenges of transforming the skills they developed and honed in Mee-Ow into sustainable careers.

Ana Gasteyer (cast '88, '89) spent 6 seasons on *SNL* portraying iconic characters like NPR radio host Margaret Jo and Lilith Fair poetess Cinder Calhoun as well as performing her incomparable impressions of Martha Stewart and Celine Dion. Ana's recent TV work includes *American Auto* (created and executive produced by Mee-Ow alum Justin Spitzer) as well as *The Goldbergs* and *Lady Dynamite*. She maintains a vibrant theater career, having played Fanny Brice in *Funny Girl*, Mrs. Peachum in *The Threepenny Opera*, Elphaba in *Wicked*, Kitty Dean in *The Royal Family* as well as Mimi in City Center's *A New Brain*. Film roles include *Mean Girls*, *Robot and Frank*, and *The Women*.

Mark Brogger (producer '84, '85) spent his early career years as a fledgling screenwriter with one IMDB credit to his name- *Courage Mountain*, which starred a soberenough Charlie Sheen. Mark pivoted to coding and website development which led to a career in digital marketing. He spent seven years with The Walt Disney Company building websites and leading online marketing campaigns for such hits as *Finding Nemo*, *The Incredibles, Pirates of The Caribbean, Wall-E, Ratatouille* and *Up*. Mark then transitioned into the hospitality industry as creative director for Viking Cruises where he spearheaded their corporate



sponsorship of MASTERPIECE on PBS with programs such as *Downton Abbey* and *Sherlock*. Currently, Mark is head of content for a startup in San Francisco, where he lives happily with his partner and their two Labradoodles, Buttons and Cookie.



Pat Buetow (cast '13, '14) is an actor and writer best known for his comedy videos @nomdecoom (TikTok/ IG) where he's accumulated over 500,000 followers. In 2022, he developed his half hour comedy pilot *Doomed To Repeat*, based on characters he's created online, with Mike Sikowitz (*The Goldbergs, Friends*) and optioned it to Sony Television. "Mee-Ow was an amazing developmental experience for finding my voice in comedy— I repurposed a sketch I wrote for a Mee-Ow Show and made it into a TikTok that became one of my more-viewed videos."

Danielle Calvert (cast '11) is an Emmy-nominated children's TV writer. In LA, she worked as a writers' assistant on a number of Disney Channel shows and pilots until she was staffed on Netflix's *Malibu Rescue* and Disney Channel's *That's So Raven* reboot, Raven's Home. Danielle has also contributed to the comedy segments on Steve Harvey's talk show on NBC and clip shows for *America's Funniest Videos*.

Carly Ciarrochi (cast '07, '08, co-director '08) is an Emmy-nominated host, writer, musician, and producer. She has spent most of her career in children's media, making and hosting TV shows and podcasts with collaborators like Sprout, Universal Kids, Disney+, Nick Jr, Tinkercast, Amazon Kids, and Sesame Workshop. As a musician, she's written tunes for Sprout/Universal Kids and is a vocalist/songwriter on two Grammy Award winning children's albums. She hosts multiple kids' podcasts including Tinkercasts' Who When Wow: Mystery Edition and Pinna's Hey Story Go! She also serves as co-creator/producer on the latter. Carly is a speaker and emcee, working often with the LEGO Foundation and other organizations that advocate for



creativity and play. Whether she's talking to preschoolers or policymakers, her work invites all ages to create, imagine, explore, fail, connect, bounce, wonder, feel and play more - together.



Karen Cooper (cast '84) is a seasoned editorial professional who has spent her career making words happen good. After graduating from Northwestern, she was a script coordinator at The Muppets and produced several childrens TV shows for NBC & PBS. She was recruited to Microsoft, where she created advanced technology prototypes (You don't remember interactive television? That's cuz it was so interactive you got incepted) and created content for MSN and online learning. She spent the next decade as content director at the photo editing startup PicMonkey.com and then at Shutterstock.com, where she helped create the user experience and messaging for

generative AI. She holds a master's degree in instructional technology from Columbia University, and recently retired, except for cool little projects that mock her intention to get better sleep and chill the f out.

Scott Duff (cast '92) is a Chicago-based actor, comic, and radio host. He is an Artistic Associate and founding member of About Face Theatre, Chicago's premiere theater company dedicated to advancing LGBTQ+ equity. He has performed all over Chicago including work at the Goodman, Steppenwolf, Theater Wit, Chicago Shakespeare Theatre, Second City, Laugh Factory Chicago, and comedy clubs throughout the city. Scott is the host/producer of *Out Chicago*, a live weekly talk show for the LGBT community airing Sundays on WCPT, Chicago tackles today's tricky political and social issues from a queer point of view.

The show is an insightful mix of local and national politics, interviews with LGBTQ activists and artists, and a healthy amount of shade.

Richard Radutzky (cast '84, '85) graduated from NU and was immediately welcomed into the Chicago theater scene, appearing in many productions at Steppenwolf, Remains Theatre, and The Goodman. In 1989, Richard made a major life and career change, deciding to put his acting pursuits on hold and go into his family business - the JOYVA candy company where Rich now serves as President and Co-owner. Located in Brooklyn, the 116 year-old company founded by Rich's grandfather Nathan, is maker of such beloved treats as Halvah, Tahini, Jell Rings and Marshmallow Twists. Richard was recently (temporarily) pulled out of the candy biz by some friends in Hollywood to



appear in a pilot with his friend and fellow Wildcat, David Schwimmer. (You can take the candy-maker out of the theater but you can't take the actor out of the candymaker... or something like that.)



Saskia Young (tour director '94, producer '95) began her career working in entertainment, first as a literary agent's assistant at CAA and then as a creative executive at Fox 2000 Films. From there she went to Paramount Pictures where she was Vice President of Lynda Obst Productions. Saskia pivoted out of entertainment when Senator Barack Obama began his presidential campaign, working as a Deputy Regional Field Director for Obama for America. She was a State Organizing Lead for the National Day of Service on the Presidential Inaugural Committee. Her commitment to political organizing was cemented and eight years later

she was a field director for Hillary for America. Saskia is now based in Chicago where she is Associate Organizing Director for the Indivisible Project, whose mission is to resist Trump's agenda by empowering local activist groups to make their Members of Congress listen.

2:40-3:15 Cat Chat 3: Improv Worldwide – from Whose Line is it Anyway? to Amsterdam's Boom Chicago! and Beyond

Mee-Ow alumni share how the show prepared them to launch Mee-Ow style improv on an international stage (Whose Line is it, Anyway? and Boom Chicago in Amsterdam) as well as throughout the United States, working at established institutions like The Second City and IO and opening their own training centers in New York, Chicago, and Los Angeles.

Josh Meyers (cast '97, '98) is a proud alum of Boom Chicago. As an actor, he is well known for his work on MadTV, including dead-on impressions of Owen Wilson and Justin Timberlake, and for his role of Randy Pearson on *That* '70s Show. Recent TV work includes History of the World Part II. Film credits include Date Movie and Sacha Baron Cohen's Brüno. Josh remains active in theater and his Broadway credits include The Pee-wee Herman Show. Josh also co-hosts the hit podcast Family Trips with the Meyers Brothers with his brother, Mee-Ow Show alum, Seth Meyers.

In conversation with

Dan Patterson (director '86) is a British television producer and writer who co-created the hugely popular improv-comedy series *Whose Line is it Anyway*? The show originated on BBC Radio before moving to Channel 4, eventually expanding to an American version hosted by Drew Carey (for ABC) and then Aisha Tyler (for The CW), bringing Mee-Ow-style improv to millions of living rooms around the world. As a third-year NU grad student, Dan directed the 1986 Mee-Ow Show's *Oedipuss 'n' Boots* and spearheaded Mee-Ow's first-ever trip to the internationally acclaimed Edinburgh Fringe Festival. In 2004 he established Angst Productions which produced the hit British satirical panel show *Mock the Week*.





Pep Rosenfeld (cast '90) has written for *Saturday Night Live*, co-founded the Boom Chicago Theater in Amsterdam, and appeared on *Late Night with Seth Meyers* twice - once on purpose. As part of Boom Chicago, Pep writes and performs comedy shows, travels Europe delivering keynotes on storytelling and leadership, and hosts business events where he meets folks like Barack Obama. The book he coauthored, *The 30 Most Important Years in Dutch History*, was published in July. His secret service nickname is "Matrix."

Lillian Frances (cast '89, '90, director '91, '92) has performed with improv ensembles at iO and other venues in Chicago and has assistant directed and performed at Boom Chicago in Amsterdam. Directing credits also include Second City National Touring Company, all-women's improv groups Jane and Sirens, critically acclaimed sketch groups GayCo and Stir Friday Night, and ensembles at iO and The Playground. She worked as a lead facilitator for Second City Business Communications and as Core Faculty Member for the Second City Training Center. She currently teaches comedy classes in the Theater Department at Columbia College and owns and runs Laugh Out Loud, a comedy theater in Schaumburg, IL.

Chris Gorbos (cast '03) is originally from Bethlehem PA and currently lives in Venice, CA. After graduating from Northwestern, Chris toured with *Mission: IMPROVable!* performing at over 1,000 colleges and universities in 48 states as well as *Lollapalooza*. He has acted in numerous commercials and, like, 3 TV shows for ten seconds. In 2009, Chris co-founded The Westside Comedy Theater and Training Center in Santa Monica, California where he is the general manager, booker, and co-owner. He is an awardwinning international surfer and celebrated photojournalist and was considered for nomination for a Pulitzer Prize (this is technically true). Chris is a founding member of The Westside Surf Crew.





Ed Herbstman (cast '93, '95, director '94) is a NY-based actor and writer. After graduation, Ed toured with The Second City, then moved to LA with Mee-Ow cast-mates where they helped found iOWest and performed as *Bitter Noah*. After he met his to-be wife, Mee-Ow alum Melanie Hoopes, he moved to NYC where he co-founded the Magnet Theater (where he not-so-secretly hired mostly new Mee-Ow alumni as teachers.) Ed has written for *Da Ali G Show* and Pixar. Acting film credits include: *IF, The Big Sick, Hustlers,* and *Ode To Joy. TV: Manifest, White House Plumbers,* and Search Party. Off-Broadway: What Else is True? and Hotel Happy. Upcoming: *The Loneliness Cure* written and directed

by Melanie, which is why she's too busy to go to this reunion. Ed and Melanie have two wonderful children who didn't get into Northwestern despite the double legacy. (They go to Oberlin and Michigan, by the way. So suck it, NU!)

Jill Alexander (cast '94, '95, director '96, director/cast '97) is an actor, writer, and creator. On screen, she is best known for her 4-season stint as "Patrice" on *Silicon Valley* and Peggy Olson's secretary "Marsha" on the final season of *Mad Men*. She has guest starred on *Modern Family, New Girl, American Housewife*, and lots more. Jill created and served as Co-Showrunner of her half-hour dark comedy *Sunshine Scouts* which was the first comedy Shonda Rhimes produced under her Netflix banner. Most recently, Jill wrote a green-lit action-adventure animated feature for Pixar. Currently, she is developing a comedy series

with Lorne Michaels' Broadway Video. She is an alumna of the Groundlings Sunday Company and IOWest's long running improv show *Trophy Wife*. Jill is an adjunct lecturer at the University of Southern California where she teaches Acting for Sitcom.

Anjali Bhimani (cast '93) is an award-winning actor, voiceartist, and content creator best known onscreen as Nina Patel in *Modern Family* and Joya in *Alex, Inc.* She portrayed Auntie Ruby in *Ms. Marvel* (Disney+) and recurred in the final season of *Dead to Me* (Netflix). Recent credits include *Special, The Blacklist, Law and Order: SVU, 911: Lonestar,* and *The Neighborhood.* Anjali is well known for her standout gaming roles as Symmetra in *Overwatch* and *Overwatch 2,* Rampart in *Apex Legends,* and Medusa in the musical game *Stray Gods.* She was an original cast member of the Tony-nominated *Metamorphoses* on Broadway, which won the Drama Desk



Award for Outstanding Play, and Bombay Dreams. Anjali recently released her first book I Am Fun Size, and So Are YOU!: Thoughts from a Tiny Human on Living a Giant Life, which landed on the USA Today and Barnes and Noble Bestseller Lists.

Jessica Lowe (cast '05, '06, co-director/cast '07) is a writer/performer who recently starred in the Starz series *Minx*. Other recent credits include HBO's *The Righteous Gemstones, Wrecked, Miracle Workers, Tacoma FD, Man Seeking Woman, Flaked* and *One Big Happy*. Her voice can be heard on the animated shows Bob's Burgers, Second Best Hospital in the Galaxy, Star Trek: Lower Decks, Central Park, and Pickle and Peanut. In film, her credits include the Comedy Central film




