With Opiate addiction on the rise, so is overdose due to the drug. Here is some information about Opiate overdose

- The #1 sign of overdose is unresponsiveness (not breathing, turning blue, gasping ,gurgling)
- If you suspect that someone has overdosed, first check for responsiveness by rubbing your fist up and down their chest, if they don't wake up call 911
- If available, administer naloxone (Narcan) an effective, prescription medication that reverses opioid drug overdose
- If the person is not breathing, and unresponsive begin CPR

The following do not work to reverse opioid overdoses:

- Cold shower
- Letting them sleep it off
- Giving someone coffee
- Injecting with anything other than naloxone
