LESLIE 16, has been part of our team since she was little, coming along to help with her mom Paty. About 2 years ago, Leslie was diagnosed with Arnold Chiari Syndrome, a condition (present at birth), in which the brain tissue extends into the spinal canal. It's a long term condition with symptoms of headaches, dizziness, pain/pressure in the neck and shoulders, balance problems and numbness in the hands and feet. Surgery is a possibility, although not until adulthood, as the condition changes through the developing years. Because of the severity of the symptoms, Leslie had to withdraw from school and has been working with us on a flexible basis for the last year or two. Although she has good days and bad days, it seems lately the good days are increasing! This month we were able to present Leslie with a tablet to help her begin completing her secondary education online.



Although internet and cell phone connection where she lives has always been a problem, Cesar was also able to figure out and set up a plan that works. Leslie will attend Saturday morning classes in person as well. Her dream has always been to join the police force. Although that possibility is "up in the air" for now, Leslie is still very keen to finish her education. Despite her disability, it's been neat to see her growing in confidence, faith and abilities this past year. Leslie now regularly helps and teaches other kids and has become a great asset to our team. Please pray for Leslie as she begins this next stage in her life. Thank you!
