## SINALOA MISSION TRIP

This month our ministry also extended to reach kids in rural Sinaloa! This was made possible through a local TJ church who sent a small team there on a two week mission trip. The team was led by Erik Govea, (now assistant pastor at the church), who worked fulltime with us at V&O throughout 2023. The community outreaches were well attended by local families. V&O supplied bibles and teaching materials, (hard to come by there), as well as food and treats for the kids.



Job opportunities are scarce in rural Sinaloa; most families rely heavily on field work for their income. One family in particular came to Erik's attention... Jasmin a young mother of three has muscular dystrophy, as do her twin sons, Miguel and Alberto aged 13. Their father abandoned the family when the twins were 7 and was later found murdered. Working in the heat of the fields has become increasingly difficult for Jasmin, who now struggles to walk. Access to health care services in this area are extremely limited, so prayers and help from the local church have been very important to her. Recently we were able to set up a plan to send funds monthly to help cover some of the family's food and medical expenses for the next year at least. For this Jasmin is very grateful to you all.
