José had always been an active listener and participant in the Bible lessons Hortencia taught at community days. For this reason, she thought of him when it came to deciding on a special recipient for the scooter, which arrived as a Christmas toy donation at our bodega. Looking around though, she noticed the rough terrain surrounding where he lived and asked, "But where will you ride it?" Without hesitation, José excitedly exclaimed, "My Dad will take me to the park!" Sadly, and unbeknown to everyone, Jose's eagerly anticipated day at the park with his dad and new scooter would never come to be.

Two days later, arriving at his workplace, after an unusual phone call from his boss, Jose's dad Pepé was confronted by two men demanding money. Confused and not realizing the seriousness of their extorsion demands, he argued. In just seconds, he was executed, taking bullets that appeared to have been meant for his boss. At 29 years old Pepé left behind a young wife and 3 kids that he loved very much. Their lives are now forever changed.

Tijuana has always been a dangerous city, yet these past few years have seen violence increase to the point where Tijuana is now ranked #1 most dangerous city in the world. On average, 7

people are killed every day. Residents learn to live with police sirens and crime scene tape as drug cartels kill each other as well as engage in extorsion, theft, kidnapping, human trafficking, etc.

God has been gracious in protecting us and our ministry. We have so far never had an attempt on our lives. However, we have certainly witnessed all too often, the effects of those that have experienced tragic, cruel events like that of Pepe's family. Ministering in the aftermath is hard, and a sharp reminder yet again, how fragile and temporary life here on earth is. The need for the Good News to be heard is immense. This year will be a very difficult one for José and his family. Jose's pain has been evident in the understandable anger he feels towards these "bad, bad men" who killed his father. Please pray, that rather than becoming bitter and vengeful as he grows into a young man, he would continue to seek God and find He is able, and faithful to bring comfort, strength, and healing to his and his family's broken hearts.

VEHICLES – essential and valuable tools!


